# THE BIG A



The 2024 season marks the 59th season for the Angels playing home games at Angel Stadium. After spending their first five years of existence playing at Wrigley Field (1961) and Chavez Ravine (1962-65), the Halos landed in their new home in Orange County in 1966. Since opening the doors for its first exhibition game Apr. 9, 1966, Angel Stadium has played host to some of the Club's memorable events including seven A.L. West Division clinching games (1979, 1982, 1986, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2014), three All-Star Games (1967, 1989 and 2010) and the 2002 World Series, including the Angels Game 7 victory over the San Francisco Giants to clinch the franchise's first championship. Angel Stadium has also seen several individual Halos leave their indelible marks on the game of baseball. Whether it be the seven Angels no-hitters, Rod Carew's 3,000th hit, Reggie Jackson's 500th home run, Don Sutton's 300th win or Albert Pujols' 600th home run, Angel Stadium has housed some of Major League Baseball's most prestigious accomplishments.

Presently, Angel Stadium sits as baseball's fourth-oldest ballpark, trailing only Boston's Fenway Park, Chicago's Wrigley Field and Los Angeles' Dodger Stadium. Affectionately known as "The Big A", Angel Stadium has seen over 125 million fans pass through its gates since 1966, including a stretch of 17 consecutive full seasons drawing over three million fans, a streak only the Angels and Yankees achieved from 2003-19.

After an Aug. 31, 1964 groundbreaking ceremony, Anaheim Stadium, as it was originally known, was completed in 1966 at a cost of \$24 million. The facility's centerpiece was a giant A-frame scoreboard standing 230 feet high and was the source of the stadium's nickname.

With a seating capacity of 43,250, Anaheim Stadium was built with "Convenience, Comfort and Courtesy" in mind. Narrow foul territory areas and quickly rising decks gave fans an up-close view of the action. Gradually-inclined ramps, escalators, wide aisles and helpful ushers as well as three surrounding freeways, 26 entrance lanes and 28 exit lanes added to the Big A's accessibility.

Anaheim Stadium underwent construction to enclose the stadium in 1979 for additional seating to accommodate the Rams' football games. Seating capacity was increased to 64,593 for baseball and more than 70,000 for football. A total of 108 executive style boxes were added to surround the rear of the Club Level. In addition to the Stadium Club, there were two other private dining areas designed for groups — the Stadium Pavilion and the Football Press Box.

At that time, the Big A board was preserved and moved to the edge of the parking lot adjacent to the Orange Freeway behind the right field area.

When the Rams left for St. Louis, Anaheim Stadium's primary tenant remained the Angels, who originally signed a 35-year contract (through 2001). Renovations began Oct. 1, 1996, to revert the 30-year old structure

back to a baseball-only facility and the ballpark was renamed Edison International Field. The total cost for the stadium renovation was estimated at \$100 million and the project was completed in time for the Angels' Opening Day, Apr. 1, 1998. New enhancements were added all around the ballpark but perhaps the most noticeable is the center field waterfalls and rock formation that come together to form an "A". Settled inside the waterfall's rapids are water geysers that originally shot water into the air whenever an Angels player hit a home run.

Other features of the renovations included terraced bullpens in the outfield, widened concourses, new restroom and concession areas, family-oriented seating sections, state-of-the-art club-level and dugout-level suites, a youth-oriented interactive game area and landscaped courtyards (with statues in remembrance of Gene Autry and Michelle Carew).

In addition, Angel Stadium includes two full-service restaurants: Brewery X (a sports bar located at the club level down the right field line) and the Lexus Diamond Club (an upscale restaurant with outdoor seating on the field level behind home plate). In 2014, the newest luxury seating area was added to the ballpark with the opening of HALO, now known as the Don Julio Club.

During the 2016 and 2017 offseasons, Angel Stadium underwent several major upgrades. The first round of improvements began immediately following the 2016 season when a new state of the art LED stadium light system was installed. The following offseason, Angel Stadium received one of its largest technological enhancements to date. In Oct. 2017, the Angels partnered with Daktronics to bring 14 LED displays, including two new video boards in both left and right field to Angel Stadium. At the time it was installed, the right field display was the third largest in Major League Baseball at 9,500 square feet and features 7.7 million LEDs. Eight ribbon displays totaling 1,168 feet in length were also installed along the seating fascia to provide additional statistics and graphics. The largest of these included the entire fascia length along the first and third baselines. Finally, a new scoreboard replaced the existing board on the right field wall. In total, the Club added more than 23,000 square feet of new LED displays to their home venue.

Also installed prior to the 2018 season was a new state-of-the-art sound system. The main seating bowl now has 300 speakers plus more than 50 subwoofers and is powered by 200,000 watts.

With the enhancements made throughout the course of the past several years, Angel Stadium proudly maintains the title of the fourth-oldest ballpark in the Majors while offering its guests access to some of the latest technological amenities. As a result, Angel Stadium continues to be one of Southern California's most unique sports venues.



## THE BIG A

Nestled in the corner of the Angel Stadium parking lot is one of the ballpark's most recognizable features, "The Big A" message board. With the completion of Anaheim Stadium in 1966, the facility's centerpiece was a giant A-frame scoreboard standing 230 feet high. At the time, it was the largest scoreboard ever constructed and became the source of the stadium's nickname. The Big A's original home was just beyond the left field wall where it served as the facility's main scoreboard for over a decade. When the stadium underwent construction to accommodate the Los Angeles Rams in 1979, The Big A was preserved and moved to its current location in the southeastern corner of the parking lot, adjacent to the 57 freeway. Contractors used a 125-ton crane and two large dollies to move the structure over 1,200 feet across the stadium lots.

The Angels have long utilized The Big A to celebrate each of the club's victories. After every Angel win, both home and road, the 70-foot wide halo atop the Big A is illuminated for fans both inside the ballpark and out to see. It is customary for the halo to remain lit until dawn of the day following a victory. The Angels are one of the few sports franchises whose post-victory tradition signals a win to all within sight of their facility.

Since its construction in 1966, The Big A has undergone several modifications and facelifts. The scoreboard's original color palette was all white with a gold halo before becoming green, gold and beige when the stadium was renamed Edison Field. In February 2002, with the club switching their uniform scheme back to red as the primary color, the Big A was painted red and beige. The landmark then underwent additional changes after the 2009 season when the structure was painted all red. A new full-color display was added to the front facade, replacing the former dot-matrix board and a new halo was placed at the top. A third extensive renovation took place prior to the 2018 season as part of Angel Stadium's overall enhancements. The Big A received a new LED marquee, illuminated Angel Stadium sign and a new modernized LED Halo adorned the top of the famed structure.

As it currently sits, the Club has the ability to display full pictures, texts and graphics as well as turn the halo nearly any color it desires. The most commonly displayed colors on the structure's crown are red, white, blue, green and orange.

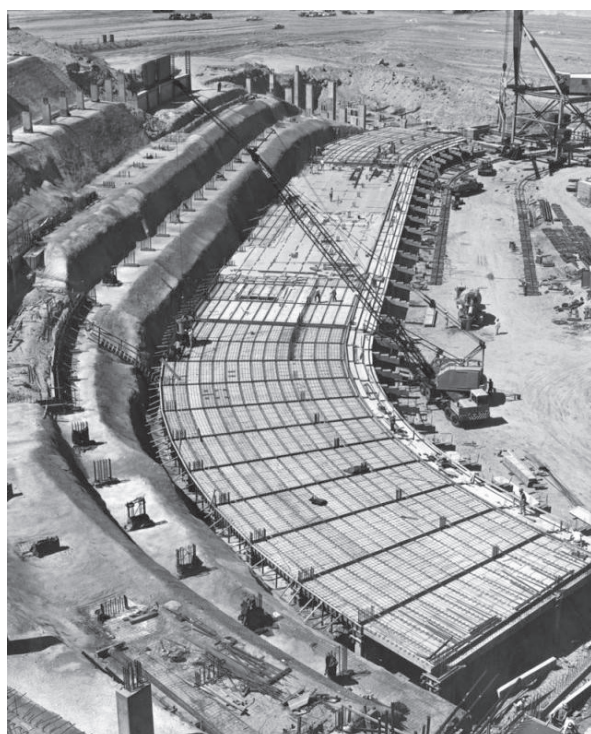
## GENERAL PARKING INFORMATION

- There are three entrances into the Angel Stadium parking lot: Douglass Road, State College Boulevard, and Orangewood Avenue. The parking lot opens two and a half hours prior to the start of the scheduled first pitch.
- Baseball Regular Season day-of-game parking prices are as follows: \$20 for general parking, \$30 for preferred parking (subject to availability), and \$100 for oversized vehicle/bus parking. Baseball Post-Season, Supercross, Monster Jam, concerts, and other event parking rates are subject to change.
- We accept debit/credit cards and Apple/Android Pay.
- The oversized vehicle and bus (greater than 20 feet in length) entrance is located on Orangewood Avenue.
- Season ticket holders with prepaid parking tickets should use the Express Entry Lane on Orangewood Avenue.
- Drivers of Lexus vehicles may park in the Lexus Lot just west of the Home Plate Gate. The first 100 Lexus vehicles to enter Angel Stadium through the State College Blvd. entrance will receive a free upgrade to the Lexus Lot's premium parking spaces, closer to the stadium's front entrance. Maximum capacity is 100 Lexus vehicles and is available on a first-come-first serve basis. Please follow the directions of the parking staff upon entering the lot.

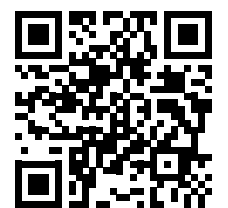

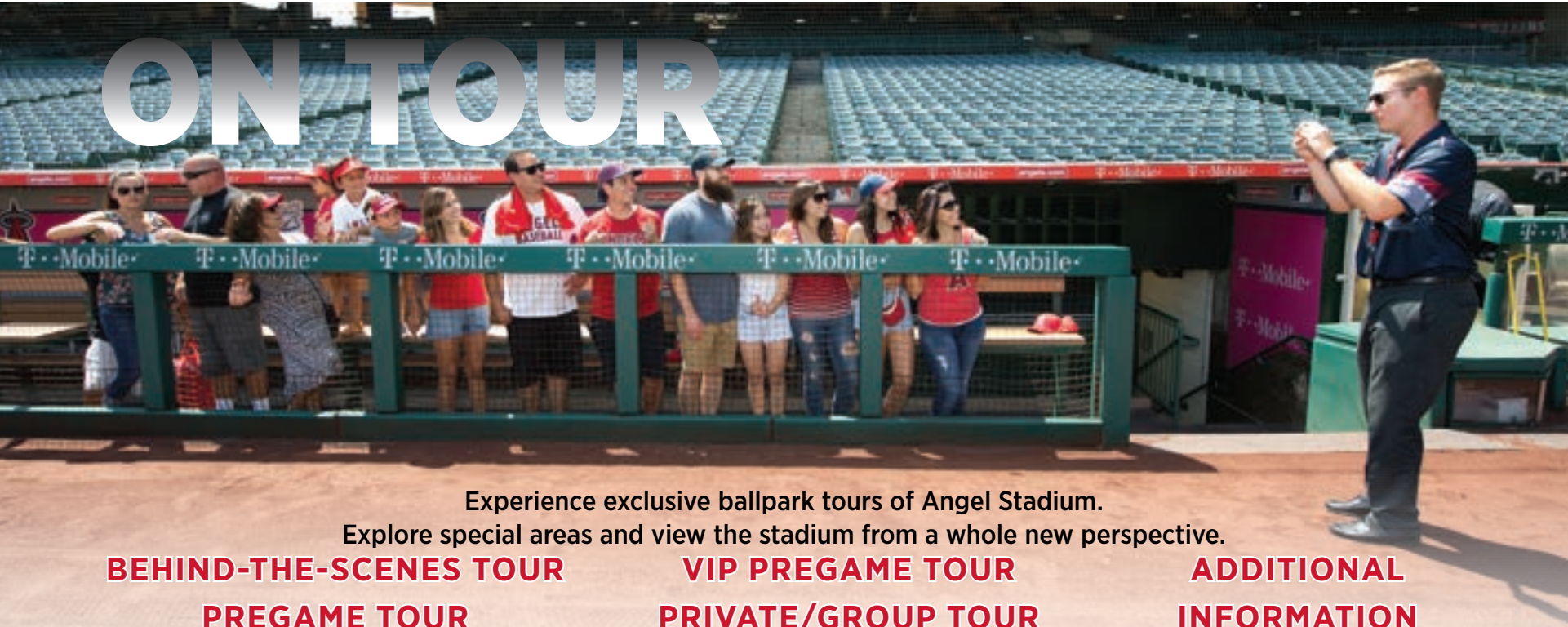

# IN THE BOOTH

## MARK GUBICZA



Mark Gubicza's journey as a Major League pitcher was nothing short of remarkable. He played 14 seasons in the big leagues including 13 with Kansas City. In his second season, Gubicza enjoyed a 14-win season while winning the 1985 World Series. He also owns two trips to the MLB All-Star Game.

Following his playing career, which ended after a brief run with the Angels, Gubicza stepped off the pitching mound and into the broadcast booth. Featured on Bally Sports West, he is currently in his 18th season as an award-winning color analyst with the Angels. Known for bringing unique insight to the fans, as well as an extra layer of enthusiasm to Angels broadcasts, one of those highlights comes on Tuesday nights.

A signature segment, "Gubie Tuesdays," which airs between innings, is a chance to catch exclusive, fun interviews with Angels players. There he dives into everything from what is happening on the field to more upbeat topics.

In this issue of Angel Magazine, Gubicza answered the following questions about his stellar broadcast career:

**Q: Following a very successful playing career, what was the transition like for you initially to your current broadcast position?**

**A:** I started a radio show where I talked baseball talk. It was a weekend show on a local station, and I gradually got my feet wet with that. Eventually, I did an audition for a show called Baseball Today on Fox Sports, which was like Baseball Tonight on ESPN. I had never done any TV stuff until that point, but I went in there for an audition and one thing I do remember, I don't know how I even thought of this, but there were four cameras there and a couple of us on the stage. They asked a question and I saw one camera had a little red light on it, so I looked at that camera and that was probably the reason I got hired. I had no idea, they didn't tell us to look for anything, but I figured that out, and talked to the camera as if I was talking to a person. The next day I got hired to do that show and, eventually, more led to more radio and then eventually to this job with the Angels as the color analyst.

**Q: How has this job changed your perspective of the game?**

**A:** One thing I do, and I think that's what the players respect me for is I don't forget to realize how hard the game is. A lot of times, especially on my side of the color analyst jobs, some guys forget how difficult it was. Whether you're on the mound or in the batter's box, my perspective

always is to give the audience the idea of how difficult things are and that everyone's a human being. Look, they might not be feeling the best, or they might not be having a great day. They might be on the top of their game, or they might be struggling. I will put it in perspective that it's a battle and it's a challenge every day, but also it's a joy to be out there doing something that only a small percentage of people ever have done.

**Q: Do you feel broadcasting comes naturally to you?**

**A:** Every day I still got butterflies and I get nervous about the game itself and broadcasting. Even as a player, the minute you're not nervous about something that means you don't have a passion for it. I'm always nervous but I am comfortable with it because as starting pitchers we pitch every five days so the other four days we are sitting around in a dugout, kind of having fun, talking about stuff during the game. Growing up I would listen to every baseball game on the radio and listen to one of the best Harry Kalas. I just learned

from him, not mimicking him, but kind of copied the way he talked about the game and his passion for the game. I felt it was in me, but I never envisioned myself ever doing what I'm doing. I just thought once I was done playing, I'd just be hanging out at home and doing a whole lot of nothing. But here I am many years later.

**Q: How do you balance being unbiased while still being positive and enthusiastic during games?**

**A:** When you're doing the home broadcast, obviously you always lean towards your team. I don't want to sit there cheerleading the whole game. I want the Angels to do well, and I prepare myself to think that they're going to do well. But, also, I want to give everyone their perspective, to show how good some of the players are. I try not to go overboard, however. You're always going to lean towards the team you know, the team you're around. We are on the plane, on the bus, in the dugout and in the clubhouse. I still consider myself part of that team. You want them to do well, but you're not going to go out of your way to say everything's great when something isn't necessarily great that day.

**Q: How has social media changed your interaction with the live TV audience?**

**A:** I think it's been cool because I think fans understand that I'm not going to dwell on anything negative. I love interacting with fans, between innings, after games, before games. My thought is it's the greatest thing ever to be able to do what I'm doing. So, I want everyone to understand and feel the same way, and hopefully they feel the same way when they're asking me a question and interacting.

**Q: How do you adjust, if at all, to working with a different play by play announcer for a given broadcast?**

**A:** Over the past three to four years, I've worked with probably about seven or eight different play-by-play guys with the Angels alone. I've had a relationship of some sorts with almost everyone in one way or the other. The big thing for me is just like I try to build a relationship with them, as soon as I meet him or her. I build those good relationships and trust that the play-by-play people are the top dogs and I'm just there to explain how everything happened. Based on building relationships, I think that's why it's worked out really well.

**Q: There are so many people working hard to put together a great broadcast. What do you think most of the audience does not know about a given broadcast?**

**A:** How much prep work you put in. For a 6:30 p.m. game I was up prepping with my producer around 8:15 a.m. I'm already beginning the thought process of what could happen throughout the game. Preparing all the pitchers, the hitters, and the fielders. All those things you put into it, you might not use any of it, but just in case something happens — magic can happen or something negative happens — you have something to back it up with. My prep work begins by immediately waking up and clearing my brain. Before I

get in the car and drive to the stadium, we'll go over the elements of the game. It's a lot of prep work and I know some guys don't do that. To me that's a disservice to the fans and the people who are taking the time to watch our games. They're prepped and ready to go every single game in case something magical happens.

**Q: How do you try and work with a current player who might not be very interested in or comfortable being in the spotlight?**

**A:** There are a lot of players who are apprehensive with letting their guard down when dealing with media members. So that's why I've always building a relationship with them, so they're comfortable and know that and I'm never going go out of my way to say something about them that is not performance related on the field. I've built relationships with all of them, and because of that even the guys who are pretty shy and not comfortable in front of a camera for whatever reason, I am still able to get the most out of them. That's why I do "Gubie Tuesday" for example. I want to show their personalities and I think that's worked out really well.

**Q: What would you like to do in broadcasting that you have not done yet?**

**A:** Going forward I'd love to be able to do a few more games where we're in a different location. Instead of the traditional booth, we're in the stands, maybe we're in the outfield, or maybe we're by the bullpen. We've done a couple of show openings like that but not a full game. So that would be cool to do that. I think everyone's receptive to the technology, but sometimes it's not easy to do, but just the interaction with fans in those areas would be great. During a game, you like to feel their excitement.

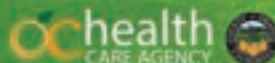
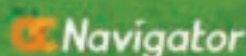

# THE RESILIENCY OF TAYLOR WARD

Very early on, Taylor Ward's interest in baseball was put to the test.

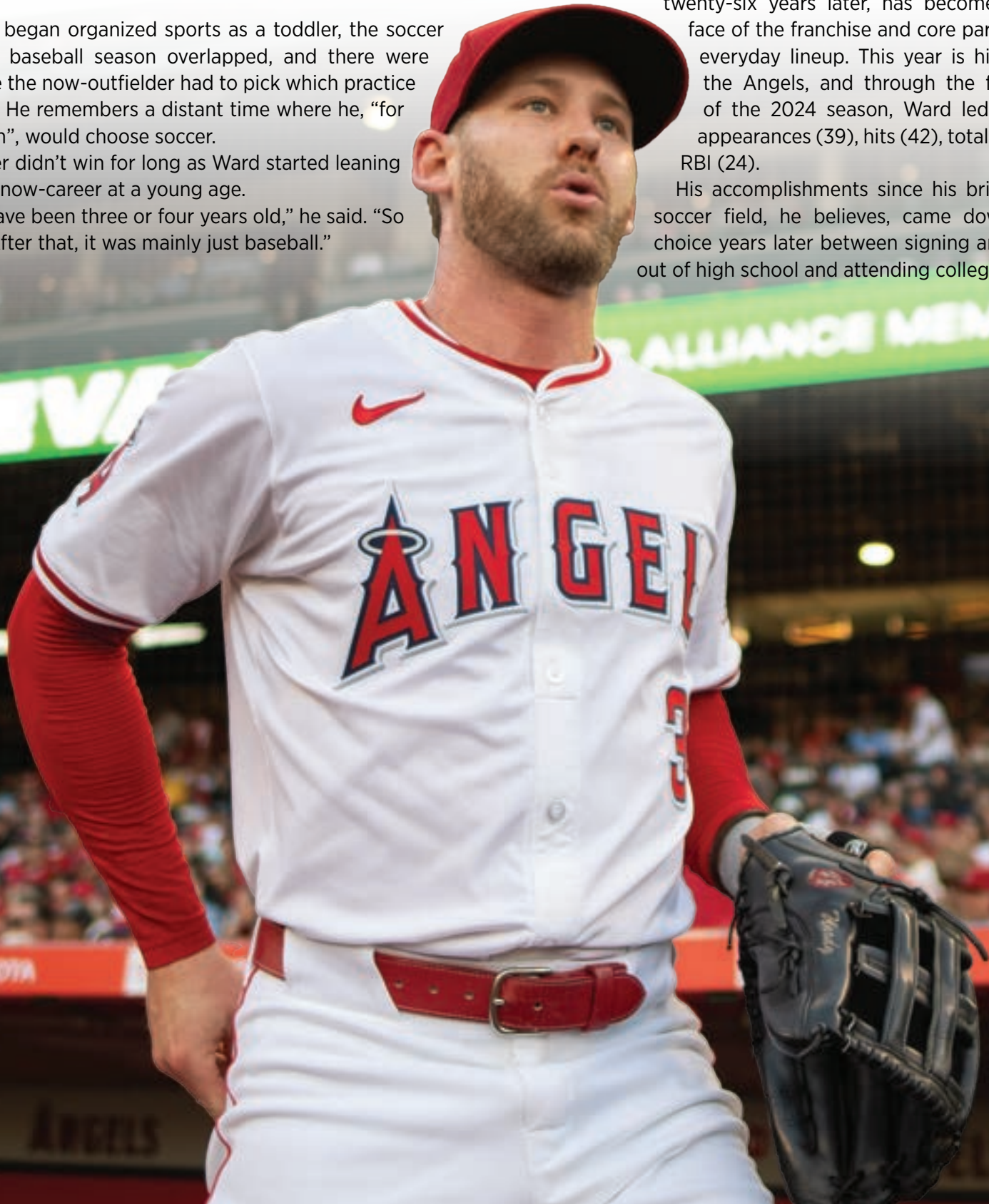
When he began organized sports as a toddler, the soccer season and baseball season overlapped, and there were times where the now-outfielder had to pick which practice he'd attend. He remembers a distant time where he, "for some reason", would choose soccer.

But soccer didn't win for long as Ward started leaning towards his now-career at a young age.

"I must have been three or four years old," he said. "So way early. After that, it was mainly just baseball."

It's been a lot of baseball since then for Ward who, twenty-six years later, has become an emerging face of the franchise and core part of the Angels everyday lineup. This year is his seventh with the Angels, and through the first 40 games of the 2024 season, Ward led the Angels in appearances (39), hits (42), total bases (70) and RBI (24).

His accomplishments since his brief stint on the soccer field, he believes, came down to another choice years later between signing an MLB contract out of high school and attending college.





Ward graduated from Shadow Hills High School in Indio, CA having set school records for batting average, hits, triples, home runs and RBI. When he was offered a scholarship and committed to play at Fresno State his senior year, he became the first athlete to receive a Division I scholarship in school history.

Through his last semester at Shadow Hills, rumors and projections about his draft stock began to make their way back to him and his family. He entered the draft at 18 years old anticipating he'd be selected somewhere around the fifth round.

On June 2, 2012, Ward was selected in the 31st round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft.

"As that day went on, it passed and just kept going down the board," Ward said. "At some point I stopped looking at the draft at all, just was over it."

Frustration with the draft process didn't completely take away from the excitement of an MLB offer, or the temptation to start his career right away.

"I waited until the deadline to decide if I was going to go to college or sign with the Rays in the 31st round," he said. "I decided to go to college and it was probably the best decision I ever made."

Ward believes that ultimately, the opportunity to develop more through college was key for his opportunity to play and for his maturity, both as a person and athlete.

"College definitely made me mature much quicker," he said. "When you're put in that environment with the coaching and how things are run. They were strict with how we did things, especially at Fresno State with [Head Coach] Mike Batesole. We did things to the tee."

During his third and final collegiate season, he batted .304 (65/214) with a .899 OPS and began to prepare for his second draft.

This time around, he tried to block out the noise and avoided setting any expectations for what order he'd be selected in. What he did feel confident in however, was the Angels interest in him.

"They came to the majority of my games," Ward said. "They were the one team that I remember really being there and seeing what I was doing."

Three years and two days after his first draft, he was selected in the first round with the 26th pick by the Angels.

"When my name came up and everything it was just an awesome moment for me and my family," he said.

Weeks later, he moved to Utah to play with the Angels rookie team and began steadily working his way through the Minor Leagues. In 2018, he'd logged a .352 (80/227) average and .979 OPS through 60 games with Triple-A Salt Lake, and on August 14 made his MLB debut.

He spent partial seasons on the 26-man roster for four more years, until finding a strong footing in the Angel outfield in 2022.

In 2022, he ranked second on the team with a .281 average (139/495), only trailing Mike Trout, and third in home runs (23), runs (73) and RBI (65) trailing Shohei Ohtani and Trout.

“Really I was still trying to establish myself that year,” he said of 2022. “Thankfully I got off to a great start hitting wise. I wasn’t missing pitches. I was barreling baseballs and they were falling. I was having good luck.”

“I want to try and have better numbers than that year,” he said. “That’s my goal.”

It wasn’t all luck for Ward — who modestly explains his success when asked about his career — but rather years of working through the minor leagues, three seasons of college and a love for the game that started when he was four years old.

Even when faced with one of the most jarring baseball injuries possible in 2023, Ward has been able to move forward. He credits the Angels medical staff, as well as mental skills training, for his ability to bounce back quickly after being hit in the face by a pitch.

The injury required reconstruction surgery and the insertion of three metal plates into his face, but Ward considers it a freak accident that hasn’t had any long-term negative impacts.

“I try to turn the page after every pitch,” he said. “Early in Spring Training I remember one pitcher that was throwing me up and in. I saw like three pitches at my face in one at bat and I learned that I need to quickly be able to turn the page and get back on the right mindset for the next pitch that’s coming in.”

A long road to the Majors and injury behind him, Ward has embraced both his frequent starts on the field and emerging leadership role off of it, reflecting his relentless passion for the sport he loves. As his journey continues and the outfielder continues to produce for the Halos, his story showcases the rewards of hard work and determination.

As the calendar turns to July, the Angels will jet to Northern California, traveling to Oakland for the first time this season.

The Halos start their second half in Oakland later that month. It will be the team's final trip to Oakland this season.

By all accounts, it will be the team's final trip to Oakland ever.

The Oakland Athletics had already announced a future move to Las Vegas, with a target date of 2028 at a yet-to-be-built stadium in Sin City.

The organization now appears set to play in Sacramento as of the start of next season on a temporary basis. The venue will be Sutter Health Park -- Sutter Health Park is the home ballpark of the

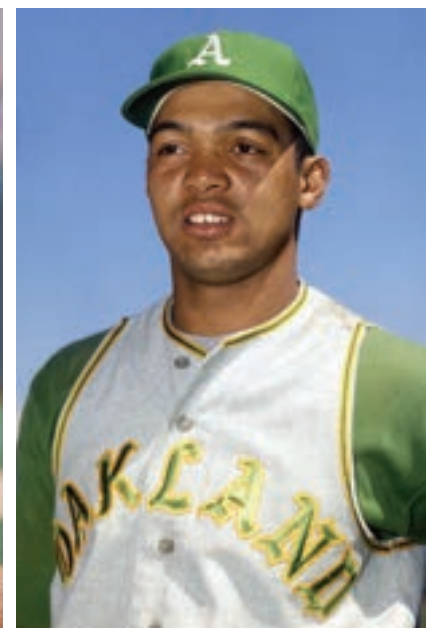
Sacramento River Cats Minor League Baseball team, a member of the Pacific Coast League. It seats around 14,000 fans.

Playing their home games in California's capital city for the 2025-27 seasons, the move will officially bring an end to the franchise's time in the Bay Area. The A's lease with the City of Oakland is set to expire at the end of this season. They will then vacate the Oakland Coliseum, their home since 1968.

The A's do not intend to change their name to reflect their Sacramento residency. They reportedly will be known simply by their nickname.

Sacramento is home to the National Basketball Association's Sacramento Kings, the River Cats (triple-A affiliate for the San Francisco Giants), and the United Soccer League's Sacramento Republic FC.

The 2025 regular season MLB schedule is likely to be released mid-summer.

# HE'S BACK... TORII HUNTER



## HELLO, OLD FRIEND.

The Angels recently announced the hiring of Torii Hunter as a Special Assistant to the General Manager. The former outfielder was a five-time American League All-Star who won nine Gold Glove Awards and two Silver Slugger across 19 Major League seasons, including five with the Angels (2008-12).

During his time with the Angels, Hunter won two Gold Glove Awards, was a two-time All-Star, and won a Silver Slugger in 2009. He was also a member of the Angels 2008 and 2009 A.L. West Championship squads.

### ON RETURNING TO THE ANGELS:

“They treated me like a king here. So I’ve definitely got love for the fans, for the organization. My son played here seven years in the organization. To come back and give this wisdom, I want to give the wisdom back to these guys.

“It’s between the ears that the game is played. And if I can help them in marriage, in finances, in life, in family, and on the field, I’m here and available.” Hunter told *The Athletic*



He first joined the Angels as a free agent after parts of 11 seasons with the Twins, the club that originally drafted the Pine Bluff, Arkansas native in the first round more than 20 years ago. Beyond the impressive numbers Hunter posted with the Halos, he was revered for his leadership, work in the community and affable personality.



The 48-year-old Hunter joins Kurt Suzuki, Eddie Guardado and Chris Carpenter as Special Assistants to General Manager Perry Minasian. Hunter had interviewed for the vacant Angels manager’s job over the winter, and reportedly was offered a position on Ron Washington’s coaching staff. He remains active during his post-playing career, owning a BBQ restaurant with four locations and a fifth scheduled to open soon, and working in commercial real estate with two coffee shops and an Arkansas cigar lounge.

### ON BECOMING A MANAGER IN THE FUTURE:

“It’s crept up in there somewhere. I don’t know just yet. They came down last year just to see where my interest level was, and it peaked up when they called me. It kind of got me back into the game.

“You want to have an opportunity to build a team and manage a team, give some of these secrets in Pandora’s box and give these young men wisdom. Wisdom, I always say, will heal pain. I struck out a lot, made some adjustments. Failed a lot, made some adjustments. That’s something that I want to give back.” Hunter told *the StarTribune*

### ON HIS PART-TIME ROLE:

“I still have so much going on, man, I couldn’t give my full mind, body and soul to the game just yet. I’m on probation right now with my wife. I’ve got one more year. My kids are out of the house. I’m just easing my way back in.” Hunter told the StarTribune

Oh, and the former fan favorite has six grandchildren.

He worked for the Twins as a Special Assistant, Baseball Operations since 2016. He last played in the big leagues with Minnesota in 2015. He played in 2372 games over 19 seasons, plus 48 total postseason contests.

He will continue to live in Dallas. He will visit Anaheim several times a year while also assisting in the club’s player development at various minor league stops.

In May of 2003, Arte and Carole Moreno were introduced as the third owners in Angels franchise history and their impact was immediate. The Morenos have guided the franchise to six A.L. West Division titles and 17 seasons of drawing over three million fans, resulting in a total home attendance over 60 million fans.

Arte and Carole's focus is balanced between baseball, business operations and fan experience. During their tenure, the Morenos' support of the baseball operations department has resulted in the acquisition of many key players, including Hall of Famer Vladimir Guerrero, three-time N.L. MVP Mike Trout to a record-setting 12-year contract extension, effectively keeping the 11-time All-Star a member of the Halos for the remainder of his historic career. In December of 2017, the Morenos oversaw the successful recruitment of two-way player and future Rookie of the Year and two-time MVP Shohei Ohtani.

To date, Arte and Carole's Clubs have featured six MVP's, a Cy Young winner, two Rookie of the Years and a Manager of the Year. In that span, no other organization has featured more than four MVP seasons.

Over the past 20 years, Arte and Carole have strengthened the Club's commitment to local communities. In 2004, the Morenos established the Angels Baseball Foundation, an organization concentrating on investments in education, health care, arts & sciences and community-related programs which provide opportunities for youth to experience the positive attributes of baseball. The Foundation distributes annual grants to various youth programs within Southern California. The Angels Scholars program works with the Orange County Office of Education and the college preparatory AVID program to award several annual college scholarships. Since purchasing the Club in 2003, the Morenos, the Angels and the Angels Baseball Foundation have contributed over \$24 million to various charitable efforts with a primary focus in the Orange County area.

In 2010, the Angels were privileged to host their third All-Star Game (also 1967 & 1989). In conjunction with MLB's All-Star Legacy Fund, the foundation funded the renovation of softball fields at Anaheim's Pioneer Park (into the MLB Angels All-Star Complex) as well as a fully ADA adaptable synthetic turf field, safe for participants in wheelchairs and participants who use



walkers. Prior to the 2022 season, the Angels Baseball Foundation, while partnering with Magical Builders and Anaheim Hills Little League, completely renovated two local little league fields, complete with new pitching mounds, backstops, 75 tons of infield mix and 6,500 square feet of hybrid-Bermuda grass. The Foundation also regularly donates tickets, memorabilia and ballpark experiences to the various groups and fundraisers.

Prior to their ownership of the Angels, the Morenos were part owners of the former Single-A Salt Lake Trappers of the Pioneer League. Under their leadership, the Trappers won three championships. Arte and Carole were also original investors in the Arizona Diamondbacks (including their 2001 World Series championship) and in a partnered ownership of the NBA's Phoenix Suns.

The Moreno family is also active in their own philanthropic efforts. In 1997, they established the Moreno Family Foundation to support nonprofit organizations focusing on youth and education, as well as investing in educational scholarships in K-8, high school and college. Their favorite charities include St. Vincent de Paul, St. Mary's Food Bank, the Barrow Neurological Institute, Boys & Girls Clubs, UMOM Homeless Shelters, American Heart Association and Fresh Start Women's Foundation. The Morenos were previously members of the Little League Foundation's Board of Trustees, which assists Little Leagues in every state and more than 70 other countries. For her continued philanthropic efforts, Carole Moreno was honored by the Girl Scouts of Orange County as their 2019 G.I.R.L. (Go-Getter, Innovator, Risk-Taker, Leader) honoree.

Carole was born in Reno, NV, and moved often as the daughter of a career Air Force man. She spent much of her youth in Fredonia, KS, and went on to earn a degree in journalism from the University of Kansas.

Arte is a native of Tucson, AZ, and served his country in Vietnam as a member of the U.S. Army. After his tour of duty, he attended the University of Arizona, graduating with a degree in marketing. In 2005, Time Magazine selected Moreno as one of the '25 Most Influential Hispanics in America' and was named by Bloomberg News' inaugural list of 100 Influential Latinos in 2022. Due to Arte's unwavering passion for the history of baseball, in July of 2018, he received the distinct honor of being elected to the Board of Directors for the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY.

Arte and Carole are the parents of three children.

## FRONT OFFICE

### DENNIS KUHL CHAIRMAN

Dennis Kuhl begins his 21st season with the Angels after joining the Club on November 10, 2003. He was initially appointed as the Angels' seventh President before a promotion to Chairman on November 14, 2009. Kuhl's focus centers on renewed efforts in the area of civic affairs and community outreach. Kuhl also oversees the Angels' flagship radio station AM830 and serves as the President of the Angels Baseball Foundation.

Under his leadership, the Angels have shown tremendous growth and advancement in key business initiatives, including sponsorship and marketing revenues, as well as nationwide expansion and promotion of the Angels' brand. Kuhl also played a key role in working with Major League Baseball in hosting of the 2010 All-Star Game.

Kuhl is actively involved in several Southern California charities. A founding board member of The Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation/Lott Trophy, Kuhl works with Susan G. Komen for the Cure serving as one of the "Pink Tie Guys," a select group of advocates speaking out to find a cure for breast cancer. Additionally, he is a member of the President's Advisory Committee for Cypress College and serves on the advisory boards for the



South County Outreach, Anaheim YMCA, Rivals For The Cure, Irvine Public School Foundation, Kindervision, and the Angels Baseball Foundation Board of Directors.

A champion of community involvement, Kuhl's efforts span across Orange County and beyond. He is a member of the Board of Governors at Chapman University and on the board of directors for several nonprofits: The Los Angeles Sports Council, Boys and Girls Clubs of Greater Anaheim-Cypress, the Noble Vikings Charity of Orange County, the Alzheimer's Association of Orange County, Abound Food Care and the Angels RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities) program. He

also sits on the Board of Directors for Servite High School as well as the Advisory Board for the Tiger Wood Foundation.

A Boonton, NJ native, Kuhl graduated from the University of Arizona in 1970 with a degree in business administration. In honor of his late father, he established the Bud Kuhl Wood Bat Invitational in 2007 with annual proceeds donated to local charities. Kuhl also initiated scholarships in his father's name to the Eller School of Management at the University of Arizona. In 2009, he was named the "Business Man of the Year" by the Anaheim Chamber of Commerce. Kuhl currently resides in Newport Beach.

### JOHN CARPINO PRESIDENT

John Carpino was named the eighth president in Angels' history on November 14, 2009. He oversees all areas of business, sales, marketing, finance and communications. Carpino's top priority is fan value and experience in all areas of the game including concessions, merchandise, promotions and ticketing.

As the principal executive in charge of business operations, Carpino has helped welcome over three million fans through Angel Stadium turnstiles 10 different times since 2009. He was also an integral part of Angel Stadium hosting the 2010 MLB All-Star Game and oversaw the negotiations for the extension of the Club's television agreement with FOX Sports West, now known as Bally Sports West. ESPN The Magazine rated the Angels as the #1 MLB franchise in nine of Carpino's first 11 years with the organization.

The Chicago native continues to create value for fans, focusing not only on the game inside the lines, but on the entire ballpark experience. He has guided the Angel brand with a focus on affordable pricing while providing a quality family environment, including continual stadium improvements and enhancements. Under his leadership, Carpino's staff has also established Angel Stadium as one of the premiere destinations in California for non-baseball events such as concerts, Supercross, Monster Jam and corporate events.

As one of the initial executives appointed by Owner Arte Moreno after purchasing the Club, the 2024 season marks Carpino's 21st with the team, having previously held the post of Senior Vice President. Carpino has led the Angels to unprecedented financial growth in sponsorship, marketing and ticketing. He also assisted in the acquisition of high-profile players such



as two-time A.L. MVP Shohei Ohtani and 3-time MVP Albert Pujols, as well as the historic 12-year contract extension for three-time MVP Mike Trout.

His vision and creativity have brought an emphasis on the Angels' heritage with a reintroduction of the Club's Hall of Fame, hosting of fan events and celebration of team history. Popular giveaways have included several world record-breaking items and those showcasing the popularity of the Rally Monkey. His efforts continue to create a brand that remains connected to its rich tradition while elevating the Angels Organization on a global level.

Carpino's promotion followed six seasons as the Angels Senior Vice President of Sales and Marketing during which he oversaw all aspects of marketing, promotions and ticket sales. He began his professional career in 1982 in the billboard industry, including stints in Tucson, Chicago, Phoenix and Los Angeles. In 1985, he joined Moreno at Outdoor Systems, a billboard company (which later became Viacom Outdoor in 2000 and CBS Outdoor in 2005) and spent 18 years in the Phoenix and Los Angeles markets. Carpino oversaw \$200 million in sales for the western region. Carpino is a 1982 graduate of the University of Arizona with a degree in business administration.

In 2017, he was inducted into the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame.

He and wife Elizabeth are involved in numerous charitable efforts throughout Southern California and support the Angels Baseball Foundation. John and Elizabeth have three children and reside in Laguna Beach.

Minasian, 43, joined the Angels after a three-year stint (2018-2020) with the Atlanta Braves. Over his four-year tenure, Minasian's focus has been on fortifying the Major League roster with impact players like Brandon Drury, Carlos Estévez, Tyler Anderson, Mickey Moniak and Robert Stephenson, while overseeing the advancement of Angels farmhands Zach Neto, Ben Joyce, Griffin Canning and Reid Detmers.

With a background in player development, Minasian's drafts or acquisitions have produced numerous impact players on the Major League roster, including Logan O'Hoppe, Neto, Joyce, Sam Bachman, Chase Silseth and Nolan Schanuel who made his Major League debut in Aug. 2023, less than two months after being drafted. Additionally, Minasian and his staff have either drafted or acquired seven of the Club's top 10 prospects according to MLB.com.

Before joining the Angels, Minasian held the title of Senior Vice President of Baseball Operations and Assistant General Manager over his final two seasons with Atlanta where he oversaw the day-to-day responsibilities of the Baseball Operations staff. His primary focus



during that time surrounded contract negotiations, pro and international scouting and analytics. He was originally hired by Atlanta in September of 2017 as Director of Player Personnel before quickly being promoted.

Prior to his time with the Braves, Minasian spent nine seasons (2009-2017) with the Toronto Blue Jays, originally joining the organization as a Major League scout. He also served six seasons (2011-2016) as Director of Professional Scouting and was a Special Assistant to General Manager Ross Atkins in 2017.

Minasian was born in Chicago, IL and grew up in Arlington, TX. He attended the University of Texas-Arlington and has been around professional baseball since his childhood, when he was a batboy for the Texas Rangers from 1988-96. He then worked as a Rangers Clubhouse Attendant from 1997-2002 and transitioned into a scouting role in 2003. Minasian served as a staff assistant to Rangers manager Buck Showalter and the Major League coaching staff from 2003-06 before becoming a Major League advance scout during the 2007-08 seasons.

Perry and his wife, Michelle, have four children, Lola, Minka, Gemma and Cash. His father, Zack, worked in professional baseball for over 30 years, including 22 seasons as the Rangers Clubhouse Manager. His brother, Calvin, is the Director of Clubhouse for the Atlanta Braves and brother, Zack, is the San Francisco Giants' Vice President, Pro Scouting.

# LOCAL KID KEVIN PILLAR



Kevin Pillar has come home.

Signed to a one-year contract mid-season, Pillar is a native of West Hills, where he attended high school at Chaminade College Preparatory School (approximately 60 miles from Angel Stadium)

After high school graduation, he was a 32nd round draft pick by Toronto in 2011 out of Cal State Dominguez Hills (approximately 25 miles from Angel Stadium).



Pillar's return to Southern California came into focus after Mike Trout suffered a serious knee injury. Earlier this year he appeared in 17 games for the Chicago White Sox and split time defensively between center field and right field.

Since the start of 2015, his 1,008 games played in the outfield ranked tied for fifth, behind Mookie Betts (1,139), Christian Yelich (1,104), Starling Marte (1,022), and Charlie Blackmon (1,012). He is also one of 17 active players with at least 50 career outfield assists, and a past recipient of the Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award.

The 35-year-old Pillar -- at the time of his signing -- had totaled 1,131 games across parts of 12 Major League seasons with the Blue Jays (2013-19), Giants (2019), Red Sox (2020), Rockies (2020), Mets (2021), Dodgers (2022), Braves (2023) and White Sox (2024).



Pillar, who made his Angels debut on May 1 and collect his first hit with the Halos that afternoon, has also played in 24 career Postseason games across three playoff seasons.

He was inducted into the Southern California Jewish Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
