THE RED SOX MANAGER

HIGGINS, Michael Francis (MIKE); Born: May 27, 1909, Red Oak, Texas. Ht.: 6' 1"; Wt.: 200 lbs. Blue eyes; Black Hair. Bats and Throws: Right. Home: Dallas, Texas.

Starting his third year at the helm of the Red Sox after another top-grade managerial job in 1956 . . . Named Manager of the Year in 1955 in polls conducted by both the Associated Press and the United Press for outstanding feat of leadership in his first year as big league manager, piloting Red Sox from their 1954 finish, 42 games out of first place, into pennant contention and to finish 12 games behind pennant winner . . . Married to the former Hazen French; they have two daughters, Diane, 15, and Elizabeth, 13 . . . Graduated from the University of Texas, 1930 . . . Signed by the Philadelphia Athletics . . . Traded to the Red Sox for third baseman Bill Werber, Dec. 9, 1936 . . . Set major league record June 19-21, 1938, while with Boston club for consecutive hits—12 (tied by Walt Drogo of Detroit, 1952) . . . Traded to Detroit with pitcher Archie McKain for pitchers Eldon Auker and Jake Wade and outfielder Chet Morgan, Dec. 15, 1938 . . . Played with Tigers in 1940 World Series . . . Served in U. S. Navy in 1945 . . . Sold to Red Sox, May 19, 1946, joining to help Boston win American League pennant that year . . . On All Star team in 1936 and 1944 . . . Lifetime major league batting average .292 . . . Hunting, golf and bridge are his hobbies . . . Became Red Sox manager in October, 1954 . . . Promise for 1957: "We will do better than we did last year."

Handles first base coaching duties . . . With Red Sox as coach, 1945 through 1948, and 1953 to present . . . Broke into baseball as catcher in 1911 . . . With Detroit, 1914-1916 . . . Replaced Mickey Cochrane as manager of Tigers, Aug. 6, 1938 and continued through 1942 . . . Won pennant in 1940 . . . Manager at Beaumont, Texas, 1930-1932; Sacramento, 1949; San Diego, 1950-1951 . . . Coach at Detroit, 1933-1938; at Cleveland, 1943-1944 . . . Married and has two sons.

BURNS, John Irving (JACK); Born: Aug. 31, 1907, Cambridge, Mass. Ht.: 6'; Wt.: 175 lbs. Brown eyes; Brown hair. Bats and Throws: Left. Home: Watertown, Mass.

Third base coach . . . Third season with Red Sox though managed in farm system at Scranton, 1949-1951, and Albany, 1952-1954 . . . Broke into baseball, 1928; with St. Louis Browns, 1930-1936; also with Detroit, 1936 . . . Married and has two sons.

FERRISS, David Meadow (DAVE, also, BOO); Born: Dec. 5, 1921, Shaw, Miss. Ht.: 6' 2"; Wt.: 208 lbs. Grey eyes; Brown hair. Bats: Right and Left; Throws: Right. Home: Shaw, Miss.

Handles the pitchers, in third season as Red Sox coach . . . Pitched for Boston club, 1945-1950 . . . Won 21 games in 1945, 25 in pennant-winning year, 1946, and posted a World Series win as well . . . Coached under Mike Higgins at Louisville, 1953-1954 . . . World War II Army veteran . . . Married and has a son and daughter . . . Attended Mississippi State College . . . Actually can throw, as well as bat, both right and left.

Only defeat at Louisville in 1953 was 2 to 1 loss in 10 innings, then the result of an unearned run . . . In Army, Oct. 2, 1953-July 6, 1955 . . . Rejoined Louisville, but was called up to Red Sox on July 22, 1955 . . . Married and has a son . . . Hunting, basketball and automobiles are his hobbies . . . Also known as "The Beau", a nickname given him by Red Sox Owner Tom Yawkey in 1955 . . . Worked in his father's welding business the past winter.

The winningest Red Sox pitcher last season; honored as Boston club's outstanding hurler by the Boston Baseball Writers . . . Selected for American League All Star team . . . Was effective both home and away; had an 11 and 5 mark at Fenway Park, 8 and 4 on the road . . . Phenomenal against Kansas City at Fenway; in three complete games against A's in Boston, did not allow a run . . . won at least one game over every team except Yankees; boasted 4 and 0 slates against Detroit, Kansas City and Baltimore . . . Won 19th game on Sept. 8 at Baltimore; missed three chances for 20th win, twice by one run, including heart breaking, 10-inning, 4 to 3 decision to Billy Pierce at Chicago, Sept. 13 . . . Minor arm ailment prevented him from regular turn and additional shot at "20" in season's final series . . . Led league pitchers in fielding last season with only one error in 81 chances for .988 percentage . . . Was All State pitcher at Cheraw, S. C. High for three years; attended Elon College; signed by Scout Mace Brown, 1951 . . . Made big jump from Class D to majors after two years of Army service . . . Named Red Sox rookie-of-year, 1954, by Boston Baseball Writers . . . Married and has a son and daughter.

UPS AND DOWNS

The Red Sox' role in the 1956 American League pennant race was of an elastic nature. By winning the first three games of the campaign the Boston club jumped quickly into a tie for first place, but fell gradually to fifth place by the end of the month of April. Still fifth on May 5, the Red Sox rose to second spot in the standings three days later, and alternated between third and fourth the remainder of the month. It was back to fifth place on June 5, followed by a gradual climb to third spot on June 17. The club finished out June in fourth place, climbed to third again on July 17 and remained there until August 9. On that date the Red Sox moved into second, eight games behind league-leading New York. On August 12, they fell to third, 10½ games out, and then alternated between third and fourth until September 13, whence they remained in fourth place to finish 13 games off the pace.

RECORD CHANGERS

The Red Sox and New York changed a major league record in their game at Yankee Stadium, September 29, 1956, when 44 players participated in the 13-inning contest. The Red Sox used 18 players, the Yanks 26. The Red Sox won, 7 to 5.
