THE RED SOX GENERAL MANAGER

Stanley Raymond (Bucky) Harris is starting his second season as General Manager and Executive Vice-President of the Red Sox. He was named to succeed his predecessor, Joe Cronin, when Joe was appointed President of the American League, Feb. 1, 1959.

From the close of the 1956 season Bucky had served as special assistant to Cronin with emphasis on selected scouting assignments of importance.

His appointment last year marked a reunion with Mr. Yawkey. The well-liked Bucky had served as field manager of the Red Sox for the 1934 season with Cronin succeeding him when a playing manager was decided on.

Harris was born at Port Jervis, N. Y., Nov. 8, 1896, but when he was five years old his family moved to Pittston, Pennsylvania. It was there, by coincidence, that he was given his famous nickname. A neighborhood family with a youngster named Stanley (Bucky) Reynolds moved away from Pittston as the Harris family moved in, and young Stanley Harris inherited the title of Bucky from his boyhood pals.

It was there, too, that his outstanding baseball ability got its start and was recognized, and he started what was to be a long career with the Muskegon club of the Central League in 1916. He moved up to the majors from the Buffalo club of the International League to Washington in 1919. Five years later he was appointed player-manager of the Washington team, in 1924, and led his club to the world championship that year. He also led Washington to the pennant in 1925, and was manager of the New York Yankees in 1947 and 1948, winning the World Series in 1947.

He was manager of Washington 1924-1928; Detroit 1929-1933; Boston, 1934; Washington 1935-42; Philadelphia Phils 1943; Buffalo 1944-1945; New York 1947-1948; San Diego 1949; Washington 1950-1954; and Detroit 1955-1956. He served as General Manager at Buffalo in 1946.

Mr. and Mrs. Harris, the former Marie Desmond, make their home in Wellesley Hills, Massachusetts.

WILLIAM F. (BILL) JURGES: Born: May 9, 1908, Brooklyn, N. Y. Ht.: 5' 11"; Wt.: 175 lbs. Brown eyes; Grey hair. Bats and Throws: Right. Home: Arlington, Va.—Starting season for first time as Red Sox manager—was named to succeed Mike Higgins as manager, July 4, 1959 . . . Spent 16 years in the National League as one of the game's great shortstops . . . Started professional baseball career in 1927 at Manchester, N. H., in New England League and soon became property of Chicago Cubs . . . Became regular shortstop of Cubs in 1932 and stayed there until traded to New York Giants, Dec. 6, 1938 . . . Was with Giants through 1945 season . . . Signed again with Cubs as free agent in 1946 and was with them two more seasons . . . Came back to baseball as coach of Washington Senators, 1956 and until he came to Red Sox . . . Married and has daughter, Mrs. Suzanne Price.

Home: Vero Beach, Fla.—Starting first term as Red Sox coach . . . Was coach of Brooklyn Dodgers 1952 through 1957; Milwaukee Braves, 1958-1959 . . . Was second baseman teammate of Bill Jurges for years on Chicago Cubs.

RUDOLPH PRESTON (RUDY) YORK: Born: August 17, 1913, Ragland, Ala. Ht.: 6' 1/2"; Wt.: 210 lbs. Brown eyes; Black hair. Bats and Throws: Right. Home: Cartersville, Ga.—Starting second season as Red Sox coach . . . Was Red Sox first baseman 1946-1947 . . . Batting instructor in Red Sox farm system 1958 season . . . Married.

SALVATORE A. (SAL) MAGLIE: Born: April 26, 1917, Niagara Falls, N. Y. Ht.: 6' 2"; Wt.: 185 lbs. Brown eyes and hair. Bats and Throws: Right. Home: Niagara Falls, N. Y.—Making his start with Red Sox as a pitching coach after a long and successful career on the mound . . . Started last season as relief pitcher for St. Louis Cardinals, but became coach at cutdown time and resigned at end of season.
