FOREWORD

This second edition of the Reds' 1940 spring training roster, prepared for the Baseball Writers' Association of America and others, contains the baseball history of all of the Cincinnati players and other facts surrounding the achievements of the individuals and the team.

The staff of the Cincinnati Baseball Club is anxious to serve those who desire additional information. Requests for information will be given prompt attention.

Pitchers and catchers will report for spring training at the base at Tampa, Florida, on Monday, February 26. The remainder of the squad will report on Friday, March 1. The first exhibition game is scheduled against the Brooklyn Dodgers on Friday, March 8. Headquarters in Tampa will be at the Floridan Hotel.

Camp will be broken on the evening of Saturday, March 30, although there will be an interruption in the Tampa stay from March 20 to 26, while the club plays in Miami Beach, Havana, Cuba, and West Palm Beach. The three games in Havana will take place on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, March 22, 23 and 24. Opponents will be a picked Cuban team. These games were booked by the Cuban National Sports Commission, of which Lieutenant Colonel Jaime Marine is the head.

A feature of the training season will be the first spring all-star game, for the benefit of the Finnish Relief Fund, to be played at Plant Field, Tampa, on Sunday, March 17. The Reds and Giants originally were scheduled at Plant Field on this date, but gladly cancelled the game to permit the scheduling of the all-star game.

Thirty-eight players are on the roster of the Reds. Tallest player is Frank McCormick, 6 feet 4 inches; shortest, Billy Myers, 5 feet 8 and one-half inches; heaviest, Ernie Lombardi, 220 pounds; lightest, Linus Frey, 160 pounds; oldest, Wally Berger and Milt Shoffner, 34; youngest, Damon Phillips, 20.

Approximately three and a quarter tons of ball players will be in the Reds' camp. Average weight is 179.39 pounds. Average age is 25 years, 4 months, and the average height is 5 feet 10 and six-tenths inches. Charles "Red" Barrett comes nearest to the average in all physical departments. He is 25 years of age, 5 feet 11 inches tall, and weighs 183 pounds.

Cincinnati Opening Day Unequaled; Largest Crowd in History Expected

Cincinnati's opening day is an event that cannot be duplicated. It is traditional for Cincinnatians to attend the first game and through the years of the Reds' representation in the National League the opening game has been witnessed by a packed house.

Already on file in the Cincinnati office are requests for seats for the 1941 opener. It was on December 4, 1939, that announcement was made that no more tickets were available for 1940. This was an early sellout, but in keeping with the situation that existed in past years.

Tradition is so steeped that standing of the club makes no difference in the opening day attendance. Largest first day attendance in this city's history was record in 1938, after the team finished in last place in 1937. On that day, 34,148, paid to see the Cubs defeat the Reds, 8 to 7.

It is expected that a new all time attendance record for Cincinnati will be created on this coming opening day. Completion of the new sections atop the right and leftfield pavilions provides accommodations for approximately 3,000 more people. It is fitting that this large crowd should watch the National League champions of the past two years pitted against each other. Chicago, the Reds' 1940 opening day opponent, won the pennant in 1938 and the Reds finished on top last season.

Opening days have been unlucky for Cincinnati teams in recent years. Not since 1932 have the Reds won an opening game. The victory previous to that came in 1928. Following are the results of all opening games at Crosley Field since 1916:
