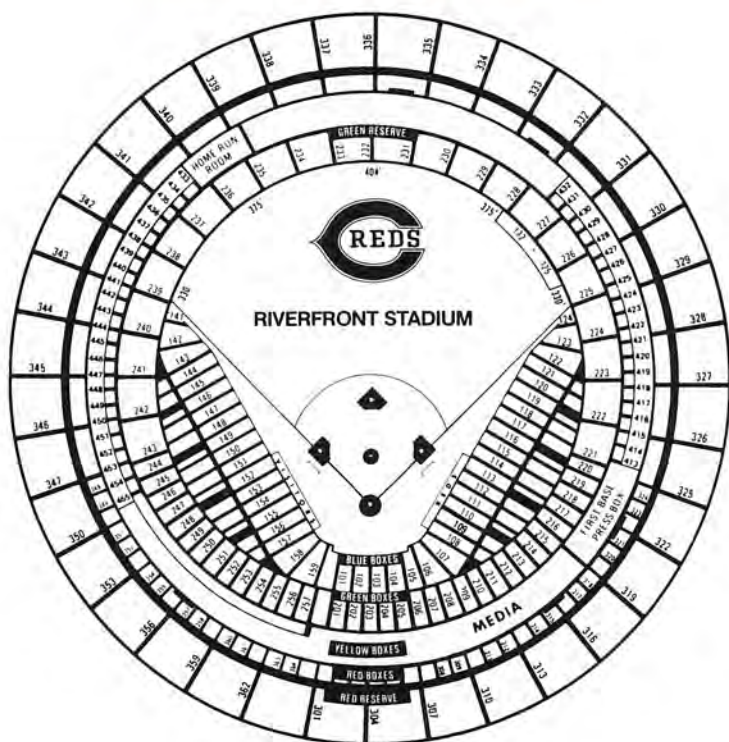

Bob Howsam

President & Chief Executive Officer

Bob Howsam made one of the boldest moves in his long, impressive baseball career during the 1984 season when he named Pete Rose, a man with no managerial experience, as the Reds' playing manager. Howsam believed that Rose, as a manager, could lead others to play the same all-out, aggressive baseball that had characterized Pete's career during the Reds' glory years of the 1970s.

The mid-August move paid immediate dividends. The return of Rose to his native Cincinnati excited Reds' fans and his driving play inspired Cincinnati players on the field to one of the best records in baseball over the last month of the season. It was another step in Howsam's bid to produce a winning, exciting team for Reds' fans, since he rejoined the team as President on July 11, 1983.

The Reds had remarkable success during Howsam's first term in office. He took over the team as General Manager on Jan. 22, 1967, after a successful stint in the same position with the St. Louis Cardinals. Howsam was elected Executive Vice President on February 6, 1967 and became President of the team on March 12, 1973.

Howsam's contributions were vital to the success of the franchise, both on and off the field. He presided over the move from Crosley Field to Riverfront Stadium in 1970, but before that was working to strengthen the farm system, expand the organization staff and establish promotion and public relations programs that would be necessary in the new large stadium.

Long recognized as one of baseball's most shrewd traders, Bob engineered a series of deals to improve the team. All of this planning and work paid dividends as the Reds became baseball's dominant team in the 1970s, winning five Western Division titles; four National League pennants; and back-to-back World Series in 1975 and 1976. Howsam was named Major League Executive of the Year in 1973 by The Sporting News.

Bob's beginnings in baseball go back to 1948 when his family purchased and he ran the Denver team, turning it into the best drawing minor league team in baseball, setting a 10-year attendance record.

Howsam established many programs for young people, including the Straight-A Student program, and attracted nearly a half-million fans one season to watch a team at the Class A level. He was twice named by The Sporting News as Minor League Executive of the Year, once at Class A and again at Class AAA after the Bears had moved up in classification.

Howsam and Denver are reunited this year as the Reds' Class AAA farm team has been moved to that city.

Bob was one of the founders of the American Football League, owning the Denver Broncos in their early years. But baseball was and is his game. After a few years in the investment business, Bob returned to baseball in 1964 as General Manager of the Cardinals.

After running the front office operations of the Reds for 11 years, Howsam became the team's Vice Chairman on March 1, 1978, serving as an advisor and consultant. He was a member of baseball's Executive Committee; Player Relations Committee; and Radio-Television Committee. He is currently on the National League's Executive Committee.

Robert L. Howsam Sr. is married to the former Janet Johnson. They have two sons — Robert Jr., who is Vice President/Marketing for the Reds, and Edwin, who lives in Scottsdale, AZ, and is a Reds' Scouting Supervisor.



BILL BERGESCH, General Manager

Bergesch brings a vast amount of baseball knowledge to the Reds, where he is involved in every area of the operation and handles player contract negotiations. He joined the Reds in November, 1984, after five years as Vice President of Baseball Operations for the New York Yankees, where he made trades, signed players and dealt with all baseball matters. During a varied baseball career with St. Louis, Kansas City A's and the New York Mets and Yankees that dates back to 1948, Bergesch has been involved with literally every phase of the business: operating minor league clubs; scouting coordinator; directing farm and scouting departments; traveling secretary; and handling business operations. He has a Bachelor's Degree from Washington U. of St. Louis and attended Missouri. Bill and his wife Ginny have a son and a daughter.



ROBERT L. HOWSAM JR., Vice President/Marketing

Howsam coordinates and supervises all marketing activities, including season and group ticket sales; advertising; promotions; and the 580 and Kings Island Dugout Gift Shops. He has a marketing background that includes three years with General Electric in advertising and sales promotion and 11 years with New York advertising agencies. The son of Reds President Bob Howsam Sr., he worked in various phases of baseball management when the family owned the Denver Bears. Howsam joined the Reds in September, 1983. He has a Bachelor's Degree from Claremont Men's College in California and a Master's Degree from Missouri.



SHELDON BENDER, Vice President/Player Personnel

Bender is involved in all facets of player evaluation, both at the major and minor league levels. He coordinates the instruction, development and evaluation of the young talent on the six minor league teams in the farm system. Chief is in his 44th year in baseball. He played and managed in the minor leagues for 12 seasons. He was with the St. Louis Cardinals organization from 1948 to 1966 before joining the Reds as Director of Player Personnel in 1967. He was named to his present position in April, 1978. He and his wife Dotty have a son.



D.L. PORCO, Vice President/Finance

Porco has headed the accounting department of the Reds since 1961. He supervises all financial matters, payroll and internal auditing of the club. Porco became Controller of the Reds in January, 1964, and was named Vice President in January, 1984. Prior to joining the baseball club, Lou was in accounting work in the Cincinnati area for 10 years. Porco has a Bachelor's Degree from New York University and has done post-graduate work at Xavier University and Chase Law School. He is a registered public accountant. Porco and his wife Billie have two daughters and a son.



JIM FERGUSON, Vice President/Publicity

Ferguson supervises publicity, publications, speakers bureau and media relations for the Reds. He joined the club in November, 1972, as Director of Publicity and was named to his present position in January, 1984. Prior to joining the Reds, Ferguson was a sports writer for the Dayton Daily News for 17 years. He was assigned to cover the Reds from 1959 through 1972. Jim has a Bachelor's Degree in journalism from Ohio State University. He is a native of Jamestown, Ohio. He and his wife Joanne have a son and a daughter.

Front Office Staff

JOYCE PFARR, Chief Administrative Assistant, joined the Reds in 1977 as Administrative Assistant to Bob Howsam and was named to her present position in April, 1984. Before joining the Reds, she was Executive Secretary to the General Manager of Kings Island Amusement Park for eight years. Joyce was born in Warren, OH and grew up in Madison, IN. She and her husband Lou have two daughters and one son.

CHRIS KRABBE, Controller, was named to his present position in Jan., 1985, after serving as Assistant Controller since Sept., 1983. He has been with the Reds since April, 1973. The Cincinnati native graduated from Xavier University in 1969 and then worked 3½ years for the Brunswick Corporation. He and his wife Nancy have two sons.

DOUG BUREMAN, Business Manager, oversees the Reds' day-to-day business activities. He was named to his present position in Oct., 1982. Prior to that, he was the team's Traveling Secretary for five seasons and spent a total of six years as an assistant in the Publicity and Ticket Departments. Bureman has a Master's Degree from Ohio University's Sports Administration program as well as a Bachelor of Science Degree in Journalism from that school. He is a native of Springfield, OH, and is single.

LARRY DOUGHTY, Director of Scouting, has full responsibility for the Reds' scouting staff which seeks out and evaluates prospects for the Reds' farm system. He was named to his present position in Dec., 1982, after one year as Assistant Director of Scouting. He had been a scouting supervisor for the Reds in the southeastern part of the U.S. since 1970. Doughty has both a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree from Western Kentucky University, where he played baseball and basketball. He and his wife Anna have two daughters.

GREG RIDDOCH, Director of Minor League Clubs, oversees the operation of the Reds' six-team farm system. A native of Greeley, CO, Riddoch has been in the Reds' organization since 1967 as a player, a manager, a Scouting Supervisor and as Assistant Director of Player Development and Scouting, before being named to his present position in Nov., 1984. He and his wife Linda have two sons.

JIM WINTERS, Director of Broadcasting, heads one of the largest independent radio networks in the nation. A former executive with a broadcast group in New England, he puts together the total Reds radio package which includes spring training games, regular season games, and pre- and post-game shows. He also handles advertising sales for the Riverfront Stadium scoreboard. He and his wife Barbara have two daughters and a son.

DOUG DUENNES, Director of Stadium Operations, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the stadium for the Reds. On game days, his department swells with more than 300 part-time, game personnel (police, ushers, ticket-takers, clean-up, grounds crew). He attended the University of Cincinnati and joined the Reds in 1975, being named to his present position in October, 1978. He and his wife Rachel have one son.

GREG McCOLLAM, Director of Promotions, coordinates the Reds' special dates and promotional activities and all promotion printing projects. He joined the Reds in Oct., 1982, after serving in a similar capacity with the Indiana Pacers of the NBA. He is a graduate of the University of Charleston. He and his wife Jan have one daughter.

BILL STEWART, Director of Ticket Department, joined the Reds in 1977 after directing the Ohio University Sports Administration program for six years. A native of Troy, OH, Stewart coached and taught in Springfield for 19 years. He graduated from Wittenberg, has a Master's Degree in Physical Education from Alabama and earned his doctorate in P.E. from Indiana. He and his wife Marilyn have two sons.

JANET WENDEL, Director of Season Tickets, was named to her present position in January, 1980, after working in the Reds' accounting department for the previous six years. A native of Botkins, OH, she attended the University of Cincinnati.

TONY HARRIS, Director of Group Sales, joined the Reds in March, 1984, after two years as Assistant Athletic Director and Business Manager at Xavier University. He previously worked for the Oakland A's, Philadelphia Phillies and the University of Oklahoma. A native of Philadelphia, Tony has a Bachelor's Degree from the University of South Carolina and a Master's Degree from Ohio State.

GORDY COLEMAN, Director of Speakers Bureau, makes approximately 200 speeches and appearances throughout Reds Country each year. A first baseman with the Reds from 1960-67, Coleman was elected to the Reds Hall of Fame in 1972. He attended Duke University. He and his wife Marian have one son.

STEVE COBB, Traveling Secretary, coordinates all phases of travel for Reds' players and staff, working with airlines, bus companies and hotels. He joined the Reds in Nov., 1982, after two years as Director of Public Relations with the Columbus Clippers. He has a B.A. Degree from the College of Wooster and a Master's Degree in Sports Administration from Ohio State University. He and his wife Lorie live in Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky.

JIM STEWART, Assignment Scout, travels ahead of the Reds, scouting upcoming opponents. He was named to the position in Nov., 1983, after serving as Field Coordinator for the Reds' farm system. He previously managed the Reds' Eugene farm team and also worked as a scout. Stewart played three seasons (1969-71) for the Reds during a 10-year major league career. He and his wife Donna have two sons and live in Lafayette, Alabama.

BRIAN GRANGER, Assistant, Player Development and Scouting, joined the Reds in Nov., 1984. He previously was General Manager of the Wichita Aeros of the American Association and worked in the front offices of the West Palm Beach Expos (Florida State League) and the Jamestown Expos (New York-Penn League). A native of Olean, NY, and a graduate of St. Bonaventure University, Granger was also an assistant baseball coach at Kansas Newman College. He and his wife Robin live in Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky.

JON BRAUDE, Assistant Publicity Director, joined the Reds in Nov., 1983, after covering the team for eight years, first as a sportscaster for WUBE Radio and later as a correspondent for several radio networks. He also produced Reds' telecasts for ON TV, a pay television service. Braude is a Cincinnati native and a graduate of Syracuse University. He and his wife Cyndi live in Cincinnati.

JOHN O'BRIEN, Assistant Ticket Director, was named to his present position in Aug., 1983, after six years in the organization. He previously worked as a cashier in the ticket department for three years and then as supervisor of mail and telephone order operations for three years. A native Cincinnati, he attended Ohio University.

MICHELLE VERVYNCKT, Manager, 580 Gift Shop, joined the Reds in Jan., 1983, and is also responsible for the Kings Island Dugout Shop. Prior to joining the Reds, she managed retail shops in Cincinnati and Richmond, IN, for seven years. Michelle attended Wright State University. She and her husband Steve live in Loveland.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Montreal for Tom Lawless, 8-16-84.

1984 SEASON: Rose became a manager for the first time in his career on Aug. 16 and promptly ignited both the team and the fans in his first at-bat (Aug. 17) when he lined a RBI single and, with the help of an error, continued on to third base for a traditional Rose head-first slide . . . He later had a RBI double in the game and went 8-for-15 with 5 RBIs in the weekend series . . . The Reds went on to a 19-22 record under Rose, including 15-12 in September, which was the second best in the Western Division . . . Rose played in 26 of those games, batting .365 (35-96) with seven 3-hit games and three 2-hit games among his 23 starts . . . That put the switch-hitter within range of Ty Cobb's all-time record of 4,191 hits . . . Pete goes into the 1985 season with 4,097, needing 95 hits to set a new mark . . . The Reds had a 13-10 record in games that Rose started and he reached base safely via hit or walk in all 23 of them . . . He collected his 726th career double on the last day of the season, setting a N.L. record and moving into second place on the all-time list behind Tris Speaker's 793 . . . Earlier in the season, while playing for Montreal, Rose broke Cobb's all-time singles record of 3,052 (Pete now has 3,082) and Carl Yastrzemski's all-time record of playing in 3,308 games (Pete now has 3,371) . . .

PLAYING CAREER: Rose has played in more winning games (1,870) than any player in major league history . . . He spent the first 16 years of his major league career with the Reds, beginning in 1963 when he made the big jump from Class B to the National League and became the N.L. Rookie of the Year . . . 1984 SEASON: Concepcion added to his impressive career figures during his 15th season with the Reds and now ranks third on all-time club lists with 2,055 games played; 1,976 hits; 285 stolen bases; and 7,376 at-bats . . . He is fourth with 333 doubles . . . Concepcion maintained his outstanding play at shortstop, but also had extensive action at third base (54 games) for the first time in his career and even worked in a few starts at first base . . . David did his best hitting against lefthanders (.292) and on the road (.274) . . . He had a pair of four-hit games . . . His stolen base total of 22 was his best since 1978 . . . As usual, he had a high success ratio in his stolen base attempts, being caught just six times . . . For his career, he has a .760 mark (285 steals in 375 attempts) . . . 1984 SEASON: Foley was waiting when opportunity knocked and made the most of it to prove he could play shortstop on a regular basis in the major leagues . . . Tom was given a rare start in the first game of an Apr. 29 doubleheader and responded with a game-winning triple, his first major league homer and a sacrifice fly . . . He added a single, triple and RBI in the second game . . . During the next month, Foley hit at a .311 pace and played shortstop so well that Dave Concepcion, the long-time incumbent at that position, was moved to third base to accommodate Foley . . . Retired Uniform Numbers

The Reds have officially retired two uniform numbers — the No. 1 worn by the late Fred Hutchinson and the No. 5 worn by Johnny Bench.

Hutchinson managed the Reds from 1959-1964, winning the National League pennant in 1961. His No. 1 was retired after he died of cancer in 1964.

Bench's No. 5 was retired Aug. 11, 1984, when he also became the first member of the Reds' Walk of Fame, located on the Stadium Plaza near Gate 13. Bench played more than 16 seasons for the Reds and retired following the 1983 season as the team's all-time leader in career home runs (389) and runs batted in (1,376). He won two N.L. Most Valuable Player Awards (1970 & 1972); World Series MVP (1976); N.L. Rookie of the Year (1968); and he holds the major league record for career home runs by a catcher (325).

1984 SEASON: Parker re-established himself as one of the premier hitters in the N.L. as he led the Reds in almost every offensive category and finished in the Top Ten in the league in hits, doubles, RBIs and game-winning RBIs . . . His 94 RBIs were the most by a Red since 1979 and the third highest total of Parker's career . . . Dave also showed a flair for the dramatic: In his first at-bat in a Cincinnati uniform in spring training, Parker hit a home run; in his first at-bat on Opening Day in Cincinnati, he hit a 2-run single; and in his first at-bat against his former Pirate teammates at Three Rivers Stadium, he hit a RBI double . . . Parker was a picture of consistency, hitting .286 before the All-Star break and .284 after; .288 against Western Division teams and .281 against the East; and .288 against righthanded pitchers and .280 against lefthanders . . . But there were some hot streaks along the way, including a 12-game hitting streak in late April/early May; a five-homer-in-15 game outburst in mid-August; and 18 RBIs in an 11-game span in September . . . One of his homers was the first ever to carry into the second level in right field at Dodger Stadium . . . Parker got his 300th career double on Apr. 27 and followed a day later with his 1,500th career hit . . .

He was named to the N.L. All-Star team five years in succession (1977-81) and is a three-time Gold Glove Award winner (1977-79) . . . Dave broke into pro baseball as a .314 hitter for Bradenton in 1970 and was Carolina League Player of the Year in 1972 when he hit .310 and led the league in runs, hits, doubles, RBIs and stolen bases . . . He led the N.L. in complete games; ranked second in wins; placed fourth in strikeouts; and was fifth in innings . . . Writers covering the Reds voted him as the team's Outstanding Pitcher for the third year in a row and the fourth time in five years . . . As impressive as his season was, it was close to being much better . . . Two of his losses were by 1-0 scores on unearned runs and he had four no-decision starts in which he allowed two runs or less . . . He had a 5-0 record in May and repeated that in September . . . Mario's victory total was the most by a Reds pitcher since 1974 when Jack Billingham won 19 . . . History of the Reds

The history of professional baseball begins in Cincinnati, where the "ancestors" of the current Cincinnati Reds, the Red Stockings, began play more than a century ago.

That first professional team, led by Harry and George Wright played on a spot where Union Terminal on Cincinnati's near West Side now stands. Its first recorded game was a practice contest against a "Picked Nine" from Cincinnati, April 17, 1869, which was won by the Red Stockings, 24-15. After six more games of this first "pre-season" the Reds embarked on their famous tour. The first regular game was scheduled against the Antioch Nine on May 31, but that became the first rainout in professional baseball history. The first official game took place the next day, June 1, 1869 as the Red Stockings defeated the Mansfield Independents, 48-14.

That first Red Stockings team that was organized by Harry Wright, a Newport, Ky., jeweler, was fabulous. During the first two years of play the team went 130 consecutive games without a loss before the Brooklyn Atlantics finally beat the Red Stockings in June of 1870.

In 1876 the National League was founded and the Red Stockings became a charter member, although the club dropped out of the league in 1881 for 9 years because the league would not permit sale of beer in the park. The Red Stockings joined the American Association for the 1882-83 seasons and also played in the Union Association, but rejoined the National League in 1890.

The turn of the century saw one of the most colorful men ever associated with the team take over the presidency of the club. August "Garry" Herrmann was the club president from 1902 until 1927 when he was forced to retire because of blindness.

A host of famous players paraded through the Herrmann regime. Noodles Hahn was a standout pitcher and Cy Seymour won the Reds' first batting championship, hitting .377 in 1905, a mark that still stands in the Cincinnati record book.

And later came Edd Roush, an all-time great centerfielder, and Heinie Groh, the famous third baseman who used a bottle bat. They formed the nucleus of Cincinnati's first pennant winner in 1919 and then beat the Chicago White Sox in the World Series.

The Reds came close the next few years, but couldn't match up with John McGraw's powerful New York Giants. Players such as Eppa Rixey, who holds the club record with 179 career wins and Bubbles Hargrave, the first catcher ever to win a batting title, kept the Reds in the running during the 20's, but there wasn't another pennant until 1939.

After Herrmann resigned control of the club in the late 20's, Sidney Weil assumed command. When the depression crippled him, Powel Crosley purchased the Reds, more for civic purposes than any other cause. It was strongly rumored that the Cincinnati franchise might be moved and Crosley felt that the city needed a major league baseball team.

Crosley, the famous radio tycoon, was sold on the franchise by Larry MacPhail, the club's general manager. MacPhail, who had made a name for himself at Columbus, was one of the early promoters and opened up a new era of baseball when the Reds became the first team to play at night. Lights were installed at Crosley Field and the Reds and Phillies met in the first night game on May 24, 1935.

Two years later a new chapter opened in Cincinnati as Warren Giles was named the club's general manager. Although the Reds finished last in Giles' first year, the team began to move in 1938, jumping to fourth. By 1939 the club had matured into the National League's best. The Reds won back to back pennants in '39 — '40 and captured the World Series in 1940, beating the Detroit Tigers in an exciting seven-game series.

Some of the great names of Reds' history were on those clubs. Paul Derringer, Bucky Walters and Johnny Vander Meer were well-known pitchers. Ernie Lombardi, Frank McCormick and Walters were Most Valuable Player winners.

World War II and age caught up with the Reds in the 40's and the club began rebuilding in the late 40's and early 50's. Ewell Blackwell became the only pitcher to pitch in six consecutive All-Star games. Ted Kluszewski was signed off the Indiana University campus.

But Giles left the Reds in 1951 and was named president of the National League. His successor was Gabe Paul who put together a powerful hitting team in the

mid-fifties. The Reds nearly won the pennant in 1956, losing by two games to Brooklyn, but the fans fell in love with this team. The Reds hit the million mark in paid attendance for the first time and in '56 they tied the NL record for the most team home runs, 221. Birdie Tebbetts was named Manager of the Year.

Fred Hutchinson took command of the Reds in 1959 and in '61 they startled most baseball "experts" by winning the NL pennant. Frank Robinson, who had been Rookie of the Year in 1956, was Most Valuable Player, and Vada Pinson nearly won the batting title. Under Hutch, who died of cancer in 1964, the Reds remained close. They won 98 games in 1962, but finished third. They came within one game in 1964.

Rumors again spread in 1966 that the Reds would leave Cincinnati. They were silenced quickly, however, when a group of businessmen headed by Francis L. Dale purchased the Reds and pledged allegiance to the city with a 40-year lease, thus assuring construction of a new stadium.

The group named Bob Howsam General Manager in 1967, and six years later he moved up to the club presidency. In 1978 Dick Wagner was elected President of the Reds with Howsam assuming the title of Vice-Chairman.

Sparky Anderson became the manager in 1970 and guided the team for nine seasons, leading the team to five Western Division titles; four National League pennants; and two World Championships.

The Reds moved into Riverfront Stadium June 30, 1970, ending a long association with Crosley Field, and before that Redland Field. A total of 4,543 games were played at the old park which was officially dedicated April 11, 1912. It was Redland Field then and became Crosley Field after Crosley purchased the Reds.

Riverfront Years

The Riverfront years have been good ones for the Reds.

Reds fans said goodbye to Crosley Field and the first century of baseball's oldest professional team June 24, 1970 and six days later, a little over two years after the first spadeful of dirt was turned, Riverfront Stadium opened to a crowd of over 50,000 cheering fans.

From 1970, when the team won its first Western Division title, through 1979, when it won its sixth Divisional race, the Reds won more games and more titles than any other major league team.

The Reds piled up 953 regular season victories in the ten years of the 1970's, an average of 95.3 per season with .593 winning percentage and an impressive mark of consistency.

The two teams involved in the 1979 World Series were the Reds' top challengers. Baltimore won 944 regular season games and Pittsburgh won 916.

Reds fans saw a total of 12 championships by the Reds, six Western Division titles (1970-72-73-75-76-79); four National League titles (1970-72-75-76); and back-to-back World Championships in 1975 and 1976.

Oakland, with 11 titles in a five-year period, was next. Pittsburgh ended the decade with 10 titles and Baltimore had 9.

The 70's will be remembered not only for the championship appearances but for the many memorable moments that were packed into that 10-year period.

The All-Star game came to Cincinnati in 1970 and it was a good one, with the National League winning in the 12th inning when Pete Rose crashed into Cleveland Catcher Ray Fosse to score the winning run. Johnny Bench, at 22 years of age, won the Most Valuable Player award that year, the first of six awards Reds players would garner in the decade.

In 1978, Pete Rose became the 13th player in history to get 3,000 hits and later that year he put together a 44-game hitting streak, longest in modern National League history.

As the decade progressed, the Reds asserted themselves more and more with their pitching. Tom Seaver was acquired in 1977 and he joined a talented crop of hurlers developed through the Reds farm system.

In 1981, Seaver became only the fifth pitcher in major league history to record 3,000 strikeouts. It was also a year in which the Reds had the best overall record in baseball, but did not qualify for post-season play because of the split-season, finishing second in both the first half and second half races.

The 1983 season marked the return to the helm of the Reds of Bob Howsam, architect of the "Team of the 70s." A year later, Rose also returned, taking over as playing manager.

Rules of Interest

PLAYER LIMITS: 40 until opening day, when the number must be reduced to 25 until September 1, when it again becomes 40

DETERMINING BATTING AVERAGE: Divide the number of at bats into the number of hits.

DETERMINING AN EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Multiply the number of earned runs by nine, take the number and divide it by the number of innings pitched

DETERMINING SLUGGING PERCENTAGE: Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total times at bat (At bats do not include walks, sacrifices, hit by pitcher, or times awarded first base because of interference or obstruction).

DETERMINING PERCENTAGE OF GAMES WON AND LOST: Divide the number of games won by the total games won and lost.

CONSECUTIVE HITTING STREAKS: A consecutive hitting streak shall not be terminated if the plate appearance results in a base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. A sacrifice fly shall terminate the streak.

CONSECUTIVE-GAME HITTING STREAKS: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances (one or more) result in a base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

CONSECUTIVE-GAME PLAYING STREAK: A consecutive-game playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance only shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he can comply with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

TRADING REGULATIONS: Players are available on waivers in reverse order of standings, at the time waivers expire, if more than 30 days after start of the season, otherwise in reverse order of standings at close of preceding season.

INTER-LEAGUE TRADES: Midnight, five days after the World Series until 5 p.m. on the last scheduled day of Winter Meetings: Another period Feb. 15 — April 1

TRADING WITHIN LEAGUE: Midnight, the last day of the season until 8 p.m. (EDT), June 15 — No waivers necessary. From 8 p.m. (EDT), June 15 until the end of the season — League waivers necessary.

GAME WINNING RBI: The RBI that gives your team a lead that it never relinquishes.

BATTING AND ERA CHAMPION QUALIFICATIONS: 502 or more plate appearances 162 or more innings pitched.

ROOKIE QUALIFICATIONS: A player shall be considered a rookie unless, during a previous season or seasons, he has (A) exceeded 130 at bats or 50 innings pitched in the major leagues, or (B) accumulated more than 45 days on the active roster of a major league club or clubs during the period of the 25-player limit (excluding time in military service).

DETERMINING MAGIC NUMBER: To figure "Magic Number" in pennant race, compute the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead, in the lost column of the standings from the closest opponent.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR A SAVE: Pitcher is credited with a save when he meets all 3 of the following conditions: (1) he is the finishing pitcher in game won by his club; (2) he is not the winning pitcher; (3) he qualifies under one of the following conditions: (a) he enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; (b) or he enters the game with the potential tying run either on base or at bat or on deck; (c) or he pitches effectively for at least three innings.

MARC BOMBARD **Manager, Tampa**

Marc Bombard is in his second season as skipper of the Tampa Tarpons. His 1984 team won the first half championship in the Florida State League Northern Division and later won the division playoff crown. He managed at Billings in 1982 and 1983, winning the Pioneer League championship in '83.

Bombard, 35, pitched in the Reds' organization from 1971 through 1976 and was a player-coach at Tampa from 1974 through 1976. He pitched three no-hitters, including one perfect game. He served as a Reds' minor league pitching instructor from 1977 through 1981.

SCOTT BREEDEN **Pitching Instructor**

Scott Breeden was a pitching instructor in the Reds' organization from 1968 through 1981, then rejoined the club in the same role in October, 1983.

A former pitcher, Breeden retired after a 12-year career midway through the 1967 season to manage Wytheville in the Reds' farm system. He became the organization pitching instructor the following year.

The 47-year-old Breeden graduated from Reily High School near Oxford, Ohio and attended Miami University in Oxford.

JEFF COX **Coach, Vermont**

Jeff Cox is in his second season in the Reds' organization. The 29-year-old Cox was a player-coach for Vermont in 1984.

His professional playing career started in 1974 and included major league service with the Oakland A's in 1980 and 1981. He stole 68 bases for Chattanooga of the Southern League in 1977.

HARRY DORISH **Pitching Instructor**

Former major league pitcher Harry Dorish has been a farm system pitching instructor in the Reds' organization since November, 1981.

In a 10-year big league career (1947-56), all in the American League, Dorish totalled 45 victories for Boston, St. Louis, Chicago and Baltimore.

Dorish, 62, has been a scout, a minor league manager, a coach with Atlanta (1968-71) and a farm system pitching instructor for Atlanta (1972-73), Cleveland (1974-77) and Pittsburgh (1978-81).

GENE DUSAN **Manager, Denver**

Gene Dusan is in his second season in the Reds' organization. His 1984 Wichita team bounced back from a slow start to finish with a winning record, continuing Dusan's streak of never having a losing season in seven years as a minor league manager, including four seasons at the AAA level.

Dusan, a 35-year-old former catcher, was bullpen coach for the New York Mets in 1983. His nine-year playing career included 1½ seasons with the Reds' Indianapolis farm team in 1973 and 1974.

JIM HOFF **Field Coordinator**

After 11 years of managing in the Reds' minor league system, 39-year-old Jim Hoff was named Field Coordinator on September 30, 1983.

He supervises and directs all spring training activities for the farm system; works with the managers of the teams during the season on their overall instructional programs; and directs the Florida Instructional League operation.

A former infielder in the Reds' farm system from 1967 through 1972, Hoff graduated from Cincinnati's Xavier University in 1967. He later attended Notre Dame Law School.

DAVE KELLER **Coach, Tampa**

Dave Keller is in his first full season of coaching, after ending the 1984 season as a coach with Sarasota. He was a first baseman and outfielder for three years in the Reds farm system.

The 25-year-old Keller is a 1982 graduate of the University of Northern Colorado.

PAUL KIRSCH **Coach, Cedar Rapids**

Paul Kirsch, 28, is in his second season of coaching, after spending three years as a first baseman and outfielder in the Reds' farm system. His playing career included 60 games for Cedar Rapids in 1982, when he hit .353. His father, the late Don Kirsch, was varsity baseball coach at the University of Oregon for 23 years and was inducted into the College Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1972.

TED KLUSZEWSKI **Hitting Instructor**

During a distinguished 15-year major league playing career, Ted Kluszewski established himself as one of baseball's premier hitters. Now he's recognized as one of the top hitting instructors in the game.

A member of the Reds' Hall of Fame, Klu enjoyed his most productive season in 1954, when he led the National League with 49 homers and 141 runs batted in. His .642 slugging percentage that year still stands as a Reds' all-time high.

Kluszewski, 60, was a Reds' coach from 1970 through 1978. He was named hitting instructor in 1979.

JIM LETT **Manager, Billings**

Jim Lett is only 34 years old, but he's already in his ninth year of managing in the Reds' farm system.

He started his managerial career at Shelby in 1977 and later managed teams at Greensboro, Cedar Rapids, Tampa and Waterbury. In 1984, Lett managed Cedar Rapids.

Lett was an infielder in the Reds' farm system from 1973 through 1975.

JACK LIND **Manager, Vermont**

Jack Lind has managed two seasons in the minor leagues and won two championships. He guided the Vermont Reds to the AA Eastern League Playoff Championship in 1984, after leading the California Angels' Redwood team to the Class A California League title in '83. He was an assistant baseball coach at Arizona State University in 1981 and 1982.

Lind, 38, had an 11-year playing career as an infielder, including service with the Milwaukee Brewers in 1974 and 1975 and one season with the Tokyo Giants in Japan.

DANNY LITWHILER

Hitting Instructor

Former major league outfielder Danny Litwhiler is in his third season as a hitting instructor in the Reds' farm system. He joined the Reds after 28 years as a college head baseball coach at Florida State (1955-63) and Michigan State (1964-82).

Sam Mejias is in his third season managing in the Reds' farm system. He managed Eugene in the Northwest League in 1983 and Sarasota in 1984.

Mejias was an outfielder for the Reds from 1979 through 1981. He previously played for St. Louis, Montreal and the Chicago Cubs.

The 32-year-old Mejias also scouts for the Reds in the Dominican Republic.

RANDY TOWN

Coach, Billings

A pitcher in the Reds' farm system from 1978 through 1981, Randy Town is now in his second season as a minor league coach. He coached at Sarasota in 1984 after coaching college baseball at Cal. State Stanislaus in Turlock, California the two previous years. The 28-year-old native of Vancouver, British Columbia, was a member of the Stanislaus team which won the NCAA Division III national championship in 1977.

JAY WARD

Manager, Cedar Rapids

Jay Ward comes to the Reds' organization after managing in the Philadelphia farm system the last two years, at Spartanburg in the South Atlantic League in 1984 and Bend in the Northwest League in '83.

The 46-year-old former infielder and outfielder played professionally for 15 years, including brief major league service with the Twins in 1963-64 and the Reds in 1970. He retired as a player after the 1971 season, then returned to baseball in 1983 as a manager.
