NICK MILETI, PRESIDENT

A new air of excitement and enthusiasm began hovering over the Stadium on April 1, 1972. The destiny of the Cleveland Indians baseball team was now in the hands of Nick Mileti, a man who wears many hats and wears them well.

In the span of five years, no other man has made a greater impact on the Northeast Ohio area than the forty-one year old attorney. Mileti is responsible for the fortunes of the Arena, the Cavaliers NBA team, the Crusaders WHA team, an \$18 million dollar Coliseum planned for Richfield Township and a major AM radio station and its FM affiliate.

Mileti's first official action in baseball was to tell the Superdome people of New Orleans that they were building a beautiful structure, but the Indians would not be playing any games there. Nick did not view this decision as negative to New Orleans, but positive to Cleveland and Northeast Ohio. He is a native Clevelander, who was born and raised on the city's southeast side. Nick has been an Indians fan since his days at Corlett School, Moses Cleveland Junior High and John Adams High School. He later graduated from Bowling Green State University and Ohio State University College of Law.

Nick then committed himself to the fans of Northeast Ohio by promising to build one of the finest organizations in baseball. "Success won't come from gimmicks or the wave of a magic wand," Mileti said. "It will come, however, through dedication and hard work from qualified and talented personnel," he added.

The scouting system was tripled in less than a year. The minor league system was bolstered considerably with four top-notch managers, a coach for each affiliate and the addition of another roving instructor aimed at providing more tutoring for farmhands. Six of eight top draft choices in the regular phase were signed. Three out of the top five picks in the secondary phase followed suit as other draftees began inking contracts with a degree of regularity.

Eye-opening innovations began to unfold. Mileti did away with the many ticket give-aways in fairness to fans paying their way into the Stadium. He re-scaled the price structure of the Stadium, cutting the bleacher seats to 50¢ and increased the General Admission area (now known as Mezzanine) from some 25,000 seats to over 48,000. Another daring move came when he switched the starting times to 1 PM on Wednesdays and Sunday doubleheaders, 6 PM on weekdays and Saturdays and 8 PM on Friday evenings.

The master plan behind it all is known as relating to the fans. "We shouldn't ask our fans to support us. That's not their responsibility. It's our job to provide them with the type of product they want to see and deserve. If we do that, the fans will come," said Mileti.

The Mileti transfusion will not produce miracles overnight, but the rejuvenation has begun. There is no doubt that the Indians have been branded with his dynamic trademark.

PHIL SEGHI, GENERAL MANAGER

When Phillip Domenic Seghi was appointed Vice President and General Manager of the Cleveland Indians on January 10, 1973, he brought a variety of athletic accomplishments to his new position. He had been an outstanding athlete, a high school coach and teacher, a minor league manager, a sports writer, a public relations man, a scout, Farm Director and Vice President in charge of Player Personnel.

Seghi, 55, was born in Cedar Point, Illinois. He was a star forward and guard in basketball and was a fullback on the LaSalle-Peru High School football team in LaSalle, Ill. The school had no baseball team.

Phil attended Northwestern University from 1931 to 1934, playing football, basketball and baseball. He was a member of the Northwestern basketball team which won the Big Ten title and was captain of the baseball team as a sophomore.

He was an infielder in professional baseball for 16 years. After serving in the Army from 1943 to 1946, Phil accepted a position to manage in the Pittsburgh Pirates chain from 1946 to 1948. In 1949 he switched to the Indians organization, piloting Fargo-Moorhead and Green Bay thru 1955. He had pennant winners in each city.

In 1956, Phil was named a scout for Cincinnati and, on May 12, 1958, was appointed the Reds' Farm Director. At Cincinnati, he worked under Gabe Paul and was instrumental in bringing together a highly competitive organization on both the minor and major league level.

Seghi left Cincinnati in 1968 to take on the assignment of Farm Director of the Oakland Athletics and, again, became a main factor in molding together a solid unit.

On November 11, 1971, the announcement came that Phil would rejoin Gabe Paul as Vice President and Director of Player Personnel for the Cleveland Indians. At the time Paul was quoted as saying he considered Phil the finest evaluator of baseball talent in the game today.

In little more than a year at that post, he did an amazing job in obtaining qualified scouts, instructors and managers and players for the minor league system. And when Paul announced his departure for New York, President Nick Mileti immediately justified baseball's high esteem for Seghi by naming him to succeed Paul.

The personable Vice President and General Manager also taught school and coached for 15 years. He served as basketball coach and teacher for 12 of those years at Immaculate Conception High School in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and for three years was teacher, basketball coach and assistant football coach at Central Catholic High in Green Bay, Wisconsin. For four years he was assistant sports editor for the Press Gazette in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and also was a sports public relations director in the Army.

Phil married the former Ella Jean Hilbert in 1944. The Seghis have a daughter, Sandra, born in 1947, and a son, Michael, born in 1951. The Seghis make their home in Fairview Park, Ohio.

KEN ASPROMONTE (2)

Caught the attention of Tribe officials, who were looking for a manager of their Sarasota affiliate, when he appeared as a guest during an Indians telecast game in Washington and indicated he'd like to get back into baseball as a manager in 1968 . . . Served in U.S. Army Signal Corps for 22 months, 1953-55, and did some radio broadcasting for SHAPE headquarters in Paris, France . . . Most interesting experience was playing three years in Japan, 1964-66 . . . Older brother of former National League infielder Bob Aspromonte and Charles Aspromonte, an outfielder in the Yankee and Kansas City organizations during the 50's . . . "Indians" is spelled out in blue on the front of both home and road uniforms. Other changes in the uniform are blue caps with a red Neuland style "C", trimmed in white. The socks are blue with red and white stripes and the undershirts remain blue. Piping on the uniform is scarlet, blue and white.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW!

ERA RULING

The determination of earned-runs is as follows:

'An earned-run is a run for which the pitcher is held accountable. In determining earned-runs, the inning should be reconstructed without the errors and passed balls, and the benefit of the doubt should always be given to the pitcher in determining which bases would have been reached with errorless play.'

Until 1969, the reliever could not be charged with an earned-run if he entered the game after the side could have been retired but for an error, no matter how many runs he subsequently gave up in that inning. Now, runs scored by batters who reach base off the reliever are charged as earned on that pitcher's record. They are not, however, charged as earned against the team as a whole. Therefore, a discrepancy may occur between the total earned-runs charged against a team and the sum total of the earned-runs charged against the individual pitchers of that team.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW!

FREE AGENT DRAFT RULE—A BRIEF SUMMARY: Major League and National Association clubs participate in two meetings a year for the purpose of drafting free agent player talent . . . Selection of a free agent entitles the club to the exclusive right of negotiation with that player for a specified period (from date of selection until 15 days prior to next draft meeting).

Draft meetings are held in Summer (June) and Winter (January).

There are two phases to each draft meeting:

(1) Regular Phase—selection of free agents in inverse order of major league standings . . . Limitations on number of selections by each organization at each level: Major League (1), "AAA" (1), "AA" (1), "A" (unlimited) . . . Minor league clubs select in the same relative order as their parent clubs.

(2) Secondary Phase—selection of free agents who had been drafted at a previous meeting, but who were not subsequently signed before the negotiation right expired . . . It is possible for a club to redraft a player whom it had been unable to sign after the original selection, but only with express written consent of that player . . . Order of selection in the secondary phase is determined by lot.

WHAT IS A SAVE?

A pitcher who enters game with his team leading and holds lead to completion of game is credited with a save, provided he is not winning pitcher. He must be finishing pitcher, unless removed for pinch hitter or pinch runner. If more than one pitcher qualifies, official scorer credits a save to "most effective" relief pitcher.

NO BALL HAS EVER BEEN HIT INTO THE CENTERFIELD BLEACHERS.

LONGEST BALL hit in the Stadium, it has been determined, was by Indian first baseman Luke Easter on June 23, 1950. The ball landed in the upper deck, Section 4 in right field—a total of 477 feet from home plate. Mickey Mantle, Frank Howard and Rocky Colavito have hit balls that bounced near the bleacher wall in left center field, some 465 feet from home plate.

TOTAL FIELD AREA at the Stadium covers 183,000 square feet, some 3½ acres.

BASEBALL TARPULIN at the Stadium is a 170-foot nylon square, weighs 2,500 pounds dry and 3,500 pounds when wet.

THE CENTERFIELD SCOREBOARD at the Stadium is controlled by a total of 5,580 buttons—2,580 for the FAN-AGRAM, 2000 for scores and 900 for the batting order.

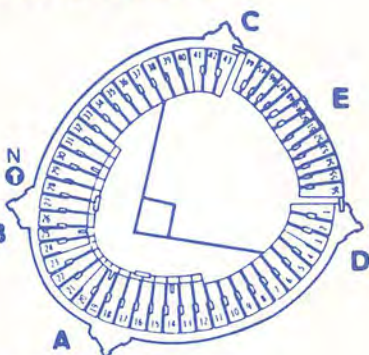
STADIUM LIGHTING is comprised of 920 metallic halide lamps and fixtures, installed in 1967, and produces in excess of 1,000,000 peak-beam candle power in addition to 398 1,500-watt incandescent units from the old system. Total light output from the Stadium lighting system is equal to the light output from 54,857 100-watt household bulbs.

HISTORY OF CLEVELAND NAMES

1869—FOREST CITYS (Cleveland known as the Forest City.)

1889—SPIDERS (The 1889 Cleveland club was comprised of many tall and skinny players so management decided to accent their features and change the name to Spiders.)

1900—BLUES (Symbolizing the bright blue uniforms worn by the 1900 team.)

1902—BLUEBIRDS (An informal name applied which stemmed from Blues.)

1902—BRONCHOS (The 1902 Cleveland players didn't like the name Bluebirds and were looking for a more forceful nickname before voting for Bronchos.)

1903—NAPS (Discarded blue uniforms as a local daily newspaper sponsored a contest and Naps was selected in honor of Napoleon Lajoie.)

1915—INDIANS (A local daily newspaper ran a contest and the name Indians was suggested by a fan who said he was doing it in honor of an Indian player named Luis Francis Sockalexis, who was known as the Chief.—The first American Indian to play in the Major Leagues. He was born in Old Towne, Maine in 1873 and played three seasons in a Cleveland uniform. In 1897, he hit .331, which was his best in the three seasons. The Chief died in 1913.)

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW!

DESIGNATED HITTER FOR THE PITCHER

A hitter may be designated to bat for the starting pitcher and all subsequent pitchers in any game without otherwise affecting the status of the pitcher(s) in the game. A Designated Hitter for the pitcher must be selected prior to the game and must be included in the lineup cards presented to the umpire-in-chief.

It is not mandatory that a club designate a hitter for the pitcher, but failure to do so prior to the game precludes the use of a Designated Hitter for that game.

Pinch hitters for a Designated Hitter may be used. Any substitute hitter for a Designated Hitter himself becomes a Designated Hitter. A replaced Designated Hitter shall not re-enter the game in any capacity.

The Designated Hitter may be used defensively, continuing to bat in the same position in the batting order, but the pitcher must then bat in the place of the substituted defensive player, unless more than one substitution is made, and the manager then must designate their spots in the batting order.

A runner may be substituted for the Designated Hitter and the runner assumes the role of Designated Hitter.

A Designated Hitter is "locked" into the batting order. No multiple substitutions may be made that will alter the batting rotation of the Designated Hitter.

Once the game pitcher is switched from the mound to a defensive position this move shall terminate the Designated Hitter role for the remainder of the game.

Once a pinch hitter bats for any player in the batting order and then enters the game to pitch, this move shall terminate the Designated Hitter role for the remainder of the game.

Once the game pitcher bats for the Designated Hitter this move shall terminate the Designated Hitter role for the remainder of the game.

Once a Designated Hitter assumes a defensive position this move shall terminate the Designated Hitter role for the remainder of the game.

BBWAA ROOKIE RULE

"A player shall be considered a rookie unless, during a previous season or seasons, he has (a) exceeded 130 at bats or 50 innings pitched in the major leagues; or (b) accumulated more than 45 days on the active roster of a major league club or clubs during the period of the 25-player limit (excluding time in military service).
