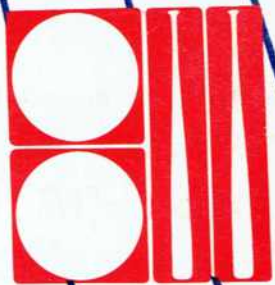

# Calvin R. Griffith, Twins' President

Having tasted the fruits of victory in 1965, Minnesota Twins' president Calvin Griffith is leaving no stone unturned in his quest to return his ballclub to the top of the heap in the American League.

Long regarded as one of the more conservative of major league operators, Calvin startled the baseball world in general, and the fans of the Upper Midwest in particular, with his open-handed player dealing of last fall. On consecutive days, he completed two of the biggest and most significant trades of the hot-stove league season.

On December 2, during the final days of the major league meetings in Pittsburgh, he negotiated a deal by which the Twins received the brilliant righthand pitcher Dean Chance, former Cy Young Award winner, from the California Angels, in exchange for outfielder Jimmie Hall, first baseman Don Mincher and relief pitcher Pete Cimino.

Then, just a day later, and after his arrival back in Minnesota from the meetings, he swung the first-ever player transaction between the old Washington Senators and the new, swapping pitcher Camilo Pascual and infielder Bernie Allen to the Nats for star relief specialist Ron Kline.

While admitting that all player deals are gambles, and aware that the acquisition of Chance and Kline cost the Twins dearly in terms of player talent expended, Mr. Griffith nonetheless feels that these two players can provide the Twins with a solidarity in pitching that was missing in 1966. And, that solidifying effect could be pervasive throughout the entire ballclub since the departures of Allen, Hall and Mincher have opened the door of opportunity for several young Twins' stars who appear ready for regular status in the major leagues. Any one, or more, of these young players could provide a pleasant 'hidden' side-effect to the Chance and Kline deals by capitalizing on the opportunity presented to them in the same manner as did Jim Kaat and Zoilo Versalles in 1961, Rich Rollins and Allen in 1962, Hall in '63, Tony Oliva in 1964, Boswell and Jim Merritt in 1965, and Cesar Tovar and Ted Uhlaender last year.

Perhaps 1967 will see names like Ron Clark, Jim Ollom, Frank Quilici, Rich Reese or any of a number of other young stand-outs added to the list of those above . . . home-grown players who were developed in the Twins' minor league organization for eventual major league stardom. To be sure, Mr. Griffith was well aware of this talent reservoir available to his club when he made his celebrated trades.

Born Calvin Robertson in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, he was adopted and brought to Washington by his uncle, Hall of Famer Clark C. Griffith, one of the great old-time pitchers, co-founder of the American League, and owner of the then-Washington franchise.

Calvin began in baseball as mascot of the pennant-winning Washington teams of 1924 and 1925, and, along the way, was educated at Staunton Military Academy, in Virginia, and at George Washington University, in the Capital City.

In 1935, Uncle Clark assigned Calvin to a three-year hitch as treasurer and president of the Senators' Chattanooga farm team. From 1938 through 1941, he held the same two posts at Charlotte.

He married Natalie Niven of Charlotte and they have a son, Clark II, and two daughters, Corinne and Clare.

In 1942, Calvin was recalled to Washington to serve as his Uncle Clark's chief lieutenant. He began by operating the club's concessions department at Griffith Stadium. He had whirls as traveling secretary and in public relations. Then, he was permitted to negotiate the Senators' radio and television contracts. Later he was given authority to negotiate player trades.

On October 27, 1955, Clark Griffith passed away, and Calvin was elected president of the club five days later.

# Manager

**MELE, Sabath Anthony** "Sam"

Born January 21, 1922, in Astoria, Long Island, New York. Height: 6 ft., 1 in. Weight: 200 lbs. Batted and threw righthanded. Married. Lives in Quincy, Massachusetts.

1966 was a trying year for Twins' manager Sam Mele. With the 1965 American League pennant safely tucked away, Sam went into the '66 campaign with justifiably high hopes. But his horses stumbled at the starting gate and weren't able to fully regain their balance until the race was half over.

From July 4 on, though, the Melemen came down the stretch at the fastest clip in the major leagues, winning 54 of 84 contests, for a percentage of .643 . . . better even than their 1965 pennant-winning figure of .630.

They started too late, however, for after losing 5 straight games to the eventual pennant winners, the Baltimore Orioles, July 1-3, the once-proud Twins found themselves trailing the Birds by a full 19 games. So, even though they pared 10 games off that margin, and passed five other clubs along the way, the Minnesotans had to settle for second money behind the Orioles.

With a revamped coaching crew and a strengthened pitching staff, however, Mele feels that his Twins are capable of overtaking the Baltimore club in 1967, and returning the pennant flag to Metropolitan Stadium. Sam is confident that the addition of Early Wynn to the coaching staff and pitchers Dean Chance and Ron Kline to the mound corps should instill a new spirit into the team that will enable it to avoid the early-season pitfalls that befell them last year.

Certainly, Mele's credentials as a manager are an asset to the Twins, since only three active big league skip-pers can boast of a better career winning percentage than the .550 of the gray-haired Italian from Massachusetts. And, only one of the three, the Los Angeles Dodgers' Walt Alston, .572, has a longer tenure, 13 years, than Mele's 5½ campaigns. The New York Yankees' Ralph Houk has turned in a .601-percentage in slightly less than 4 seasons, and Herman Franks, of the San Francisco Giants, has a .582-mark for 2 seasons at the helm of a major league club.

Starting his third year as a coach for the Twins, Jim Lemon is a veteran of all or parts of 12 seasons as a player in the major leagues. During that time, he was one of the most feared sluggers in the game, sharing with his manager Sam Mele, and several others, the major league mark of 6 rbi's in an inning. On August 31, 1956, he belted three homeruns in a single contest off the New York Yankees' standout southpaw, Whitey Ford. Highly respected as an individual and as a baseball man, Jim joined the ranks of major league coaches after piloting the Washington Senators' York, Pa., farm team of the Class AA Eastern League in 1964.

# WYNN, Early

"Gus"

Born January 6, 1920, in Hartford, Alabama. Height: 6 ft. Weight: 235 lbs. Batted and threw righthanded. Married. Lives in Nokomis, Florida.

The last major league pitcher to join the 300-Victory Club, Early Wynn joined the Twins' coaching staff last October 15, after having served as pitching coach for the Cleveland Indians the past three seasons. Coming to the Twins, Gus rejoins the organization with which he signed his first professional contract back in 1937. He remained with the Griffith organization until he was traded to the Indians on Dec. 14, 1948. Wynn became the fourteenth hurler in major league history to win 300 or more games when he beat the Kansas City Athletics, 7-4, on July 13, 1963 . . . his last big league victory. In addition, he's the major league record-holder for most seasons pitched in the big show, 23, and for most bases on balls lifetime, 1775. His addition to the Twins' roster gives the club the distinction of being the only major league team with two or more former Cy Young Award winners on the payroll. Gus won this coveted honor when his 22 wins sparked the Chicago White Sox to the 1959 American League pennant. Dean Chance, of course, is the Twins' other former winner of Cy Young honors. In 1950, Wynn's 3.20 earned-run average paced American League hurlers. He was the league strikeout leader in 1957 and '58, and topped the circuit in victories in 1954 and '59, two of his five seasons as a 20-game winner.

Jim Kaat enjoyed a fabulous season in 1966. Not only did he turn in more wins in a season than any other lefthander in Griffith organization history, but he also established new Twins' records in complete games, 19, and innings-pitched, 305. Needless to say, he led the league in these categories, as well. Only the great Walter Johnson (1912 to 1915) and Alvin Crowder (1932) won more games in a season for this organization than did Kaat in '66. New York's Whitey Ford (1961) is the only other hurler to win 25 games in the expanded American League. A rarity for a pitcher, Kaat's a four-way performer who was voted the Gold Glove Award for the fifth consecutive season as the league's top pitcher defensively. Also respected with a bat in his hands, he belted a pair of homeruns during 1966. An accomplished after-dinner speaker, Jim serves as sports director of Twin Cities radio station KRSI during the off-season.

Although there've been seasons in which he's had slightly more impressive batting figures, never has Harmon Killebrew been more valuable to his team than he was in 1966 . . . as attested to in post-season votes of both his teammates and the members of the local chapter of the baseball writers. Even though he divided his time between first base, third base and the outfield, Harm was the only Twin to play in each of the club's games during the season and, in fact, established a new record for games played in a season by a Minnesota player. His steady play and quiet leadership throughout the season served to keep the team on an even keel, enabling them to overcome their bad start and make a strong second-place finish in the final league standings. During the course of the season, Harm moved up in the all-time homerun derby to a tie for 20th place in the rankings with newly-named Cleveland manager Joe Adcock. En route to his total of 336 roundtrippers, Killebrew passed during 1966 the career marks of immortals Chuck Klein, Rogers Hornsby, Al Simmons, Roy Sievers and Hank Greenberg. Harm's next goal is the 358-total of both Yogi Berra and Rocky Colavito. Conceivably, he could also pass Johnny Mize (359), Joe DiMaggio (361) and Gil Hodges (370) during the coming season. Besides Colavito, the only active players ahead of Killebrew in the homerun tables are Frank Robinson, Ernie Banks, Hank Aaron, Eddie Mathews, Mickey Mantle and Willie Mays. Four times the American League's homerun champ, and once the circuit's rbi king, Harm was runnerup to Robinson in both categories in 1966.

Russ was subsequently dealt to the Red Sox the following June, with outfielder Carroll Hardy, for pitcher Ted Bowsfield and outfielder Marty Keough. Reporting early to spring training in 1967, Tony Oliva hopes to be ready to roll at top speed come Opening Day as he shoots to regain the American League batting championship he relinquished to Baltimore's Frank Robinson last season. The only player ever to win batting championships in his first two seasons in the major leagues, Tony had the edge on Robinson as late as mid-September of '66, when an 0-for-16 slump caused him to drop too far back to catch up. For his major league career, Tony's lifetime batting average is exceeded among active players only by that of Atlanta's Rico Carty, who's five points ahead of Oliva at .323. So spectacular have Tony's hitting exploits been that the tremendous improvement he's shown defensively had gone largely unnoticed around the country until his American League opponents voted him the circuit's top defensive rightfielder in the annual Rawlings-Sporting News Gold Glove poll taken at the end of last season. An All-Star selection each year he's been in the majors, Tony's .410 average in his rookie season of 1961 in the Appalachian League led all of professional baseball that year. Last winter, he toured the Upper Midwest as a member of the Twins' Tours entourage.

Disappointed at being sent to Denver at cutdown time last May, Ted Uhlaender attacked Coast loop pitching at such a lively pace that he was recalled by the Twins little more than a month later. Installed as the regular centerfielder on June 25, Ted performed in outstanding fashion defensively and showed steady improvement as a hitter, while manning his position day in and day out. He missed just one game, that due to having been hit on the right elbow by a pitched ball in Cleveland, September 20. From August 27, when his average stood at .199, Ted batted at a .284-clip through the balance of the season. Overall, the southpaw-swinging Uhlaender was remarkably effective against lefthand pitching, pounding portsiders for a .280-average, while going at just .204 against righthand pitching.
