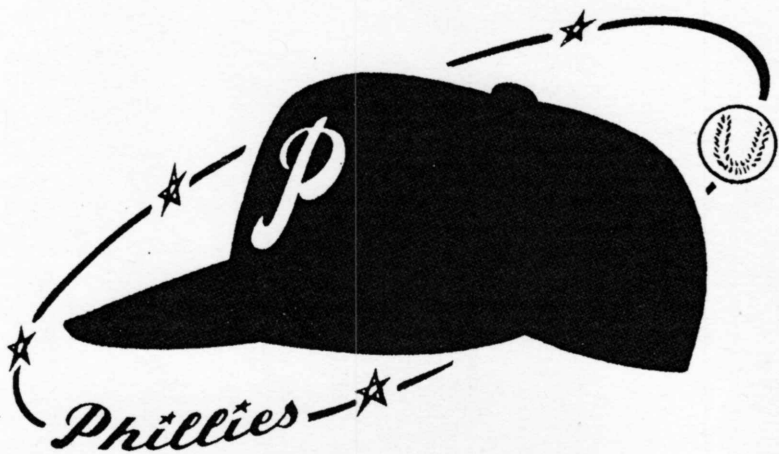

GENE MAUCH 4

Born-Salina, Kansas, Nov. 18, 1925 . . . Home-Hacienda Heights, Calif. . . 5-10, 173 . . . Beginning his fifth year as Phillies manager . . . Voted 1962 Manager Of The Year . . . An active professional player for 16 years . . . Played second base, shortstop and third base . . . Saw major league service with Brooklyn Dodgers, Pittsburgh Pirates, Chicago Cubs, Boston Braves, St. Louis Cardinals and Boston Red Sox . . . First managing job came when he was 27, taking over the reins of Atlanta in the Southern Association and guiding the club to a third place finish in the 1953 season . . . Mauch went back to playing for a few years, returning to managing in 1958 with Minneapolis of the American Association . . . In two years, he led Minneapolis to a third and second place finish . . . He replaced Eddie Sawyer, who resigned after managing Phils opening game of 1960 season, on April 15, 1960 . . . Coach Andy Cohen acted as manager for the second game until Mauch joined the club . . . Finishing eighth the first two seasons, Mauch brought the Phillies on to seventh in 1962 and to fourth last season . . . It was the Phillies first first-division finish since 1935 . . . At one time in his playing career, he was part of a trade involving one of his current Phillies players, Cal McLish . . . Mauch and McLish were traded by the Brooklyn Dodgers along with Kirby Higbe to the Pirates for Dixie Howell and Al Giomfriddo.

HARRY (PEANUTS) LOWREY 3

Born-Los Angeles, Calif., Aug. 27, 1918 . . . Still lives there during off-season . . . 5-8, 170 . . . Played 23 years of pro ball . . . Was with Cubs, Reds, Cardinals and Phillies during major league career . . . Brought in by Mauch on June 1, 1960, from Idaho Falls, where he was in his third year as a minor league manager . . . Prior to that he was with New Orleans and Austin.

GEORGE MYATT 1

Born-Denver, Colo., June 14, 1915 . . . Home-Orlando, Fla. . . . 5-10, 170 . . . 16 years as a player in pro ball, including major league stints with the New York Giants and Washington Senators . . . Managed for two years in the minors . . . Has been major league coach since 1950--Senators, 1955-1954; White Sox, 1955-1956; Cubs, 1957-1959; Braves, 1960-1961 and Tigers, 1962-1963.

AL WIDMAR 2

Born-Cleveland, O., Mar. 20, 1925 . . . Home-Tulsa, Okla. . . . 6-4, 195 . . . Spent 17 years as an active player . . . In majors with Red Sox, St. Louis Browns and White Sox . . . Managed for three years at Tulsa . . . Served as Phillies minor league pitching instructor, part of 1958 and through 1961 . . . Entering third year as Phillies coach.

Beginning second year with Phillies . . . Had previous experience as a trainer with Cubs, Dodgers and Army Air Force.

Born-Wampum, Pa., Mar. 8, 1942 . . . Home-Wampum . . . B-R, T-R . . .
 5-11, 185 . . . 1960 Wampum High grad, playing baseball and basketball .
 . . Helped lead basketball team to state championships in 1958, 1960 and
 was twice named to High School All-American basketball team . . . Has made
 All-Star teams last three years in minors--'63 with Little Rock of the
 International League, '62 with Williamsport of the Eastern League and '61
 with Magic Valley of Pioneer League . . . Led International League in
 triples (12), homers (33), RBI (97) and total bases (299) . . . Has out-
 standing four-year power record for the minors---88 doubles, 40 triples,
 82 homers, 342 RBI and .305 average . . . Manager Mauch plans to try Allen
 at third . . . Infield nothing new since Allen played short and second his
 first two pro years before switch to outfield . . . Is strong and possesses
 quick wrists . . . Younger brother, Hal, is firstbaseman in Phils system.
