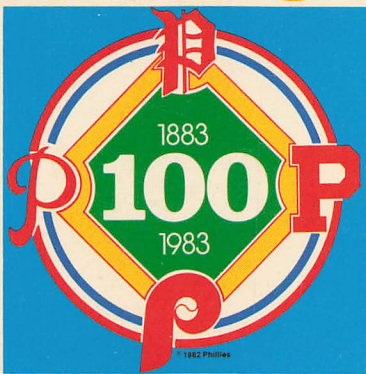

## 100th ANNIVERSARY

---

The Philadelphia Phillies are celebrating their 100th Anniversary this season.

A charter member of the newly-created National League, the Philadelphia Athletics, as they were called then, couldn't even finish that first season back in 1876. Philadelphia was without a National League club until 1883.

It was then that Alfred J. Reach purchased the Worcester Brown Stockings (Mass.) club, moved it to Philadelphia and named his team the "Phillies", a takeoff on Philly.

Only one other city in the current National League had a franchise back then—Chicago. The Cincinnati Red Stockings were the first professional team (1869) but they were not part of the National League in 1883.

The name "Phillies" is the oldest team name in the league. Chicago used the name "White Stockings."

Rounding out the league that year were the Providence Grays, Boston Beaneaters, Cleveland Spiders, Buffalo Bisons, New York Gothams and Detroit Wolverines.

The very first game for the Phillies was played on a Tuesday afternoon, May 1, 1883. They bowed to Providence, 4-3.

The lead paragraph of the Philadelphia Inquirer's six-gram story on May 2 went as such:

"The first regular championship game between the Philadelphia and Providence Clubs was played at Recreation Park yesterday, about one thousand persons being present. The home club took the lead in the first inning by scoring two earned runs, to which they added another in the seventh. The visitors failed to score until the eighth inning, when by bunching their hits they scored four runs, three of which were earned. The fielding was good on both sides, but the batting was weak."

The history of the Phillies hasn't had long lists of championship clubs as some other organizations can boast, but Philadelphia has had its share of outstanding ball players.

The Vet is the fourth ball park called home by the Phillies. First there was Recreation Park (1883-1886) then Baker Bowl (1887-1938) and Shibe Park/Connie Mack Stadium (1938-1970).

This year's Media Guide cover, as designed by Dick Perez, official Hall of Fame artist, covers many of the stars who have played for the Phillies the last 100 years.

### 100th Anniversary Logo

Craig Drob, a 22-year-old architecture student at Temple University, designed the winning logo which was selected from a total of 1,304 entries submitted by the fans.

The winning design depicts the four "P" insignias that have been used by the Phillies during the club's history. The block "P" was the first one, arriving in the early 1910s. Twenty years later, it was changed (top "P") with yet another change coming in the 1940s when the Carpenter family purchased the club (left "P"). The Phillies changed their uniforms and logo in 1970 in anticipation of moving into the Veterans Stadium.

## PHILLIES HISTORY

---

The first game in National League history was played in Philadelphia in 1876, the Philadelphia Athletics facing Boston on April 22 at 25th and Jefferson Streets. The Philadelphia entry, however, didn't last the season and so the Quaker City was without representation in the National League until 1883. Alfred J. Reach purchased the Worcester, Mass., club and moved it to Philadelphia, adopting "Phillies" as the official team name, a takeoff on Philadelphia or Philly.

The Phillies' initial game was a 4-3 loss to the Providence Grays, before 1,000 at Recreation Park, 23rd Street and Ridge Pike. Bob Ferguson managed the Phils in that first game, May 1, 1883.

In 1887, the Phillies moved into a new "magnificent park" at Broad and Huntingdon Streets, which was later to become known as Baker Bowl (capacity 15,000). An estimated 20,000 jammed the park for the first game on April 30 and saw the Phillies maul the New York Giants, 19-10.

One of baseball's biggest disasters struck the Phillies in 1903. Twelve persons were killed and 232 injured when the left field bleachers collapsed after fans had climbed to the top row to get a better view of a near-by fire.

The Phillies' owner in 1910, Horace Fogel, started a personal campaign with the press to change the name of his club. "The name Phillies is too trite and Quakers (as they were sometimes called) stands for peaceful people who will dodge a fight. We're not going to be that way. We're going to fight. Why don't you fellas call the club the 'Live Wires'," Fogel pleaded of the press. His efforts went for naught.

Baker Bowl, which had a short right-field line (280 feet) and a rather deep left field (341) became the site of the World Series in 1915 as the Phillies won their first league title. The Boston Red Sox, however, took the World Series, four games to one.

In 1927, the Baker Bowl wooden bleachers again gave way, and the Phillies, through the graces of Philadelphia Athletics' owner John Shibe, were invited to play at Shibe Park until the necessary repairs could be made. "I remember our first game in Shibe Park very well," recalled the late owner Gerry Nugent. "It was the day Lindbergh arrived in Paris."

Back to Baker Bowl went the Phillies, who played the first Sunday baseball game in Philadelphia there in 1934, losing to Brooklyn, 8-7.

The Phillies moved permanently to Shibe Park on July 4, 1938 after 51 years at Baker Bowl. The Phils lost the first game to Boston, 10-8, but came back behind the pitching of Claude Passeau to win the nightcap, 10-2.

Late in 1943, the Phillies were sold to R. R. M. Carpenter, Jr. Between Reach and Carpenter, nine others owned the club. To stimulate interest in the club, a contest was conducted to find a nickname for the Phillies. For 1944 and 1945, the club was known as the Blue Jays, although they still maintained the official "Phillies" title.

Seven years after Carpenter took over, the Phillies rose to become National League champions, second time in club history. Again, the World Series crown eluded them, as the New York Yankees swept the series, 4-0.

Bob Carpenter, after 29 years as the club president, moved up to Chairman of the Board on Nov. 22, 1972. He was succeeded by his son, Ruly Carpenter, as president.

After 32½ seasons in Shibe Park-Connie Mack Stadium in which the Phillies won 1,195 and lost 1,328, the club moved into the spectacular new Veterans Stadium for the 1971 season.

The Philadelphia Athletics won the first game at Shibe Park, 8-1, over Boston on April 12, 1909. The Phillies won the park's finale, 2-1 over Montreal on Oct. 1, 1970, a 10-inning battle.

In the first game played in the 56,731 seat Veterans Stadium, the Phillies defeated the Montreal Expos 4-1 on April 10, 1971.

The Carpenter era with the Phillies came to an end on Oct. 29, 1981, when they sold the club to a group headed by Bill Giles.

### NEW TV FLAGSHIP

WTAF TV (Channel 29) in Philadelphia is the Phillies new flagship station in 1983, the first of a 10-year contract. Phillies games were carried on WPHL TV from 1970 through the 1982 season. New Executive Producer is Ray Tipton.

## THE 1982 SEASON

---

**MOST WINS:** Over the last seven National League seasons: PHILLIES 615, Los Angeles 607, Cincinnati 588, Pittsburgh 587.

**FIRST PLACE:** Phillies held first place in the NL East for 41 days . . . The first day in the top spot was June 28; last day, September 13 . . . They led St. Louis from July 11 through August 11 with the exception of July 28.

**HIGH POINT:** Came on August 4th when they were 3 games up, 18 over .500 (61-43).

**LOW POINT:** Came on April 24 when they were in last place, 9 games behind St. Louis (13-3) with a 3-11 record . . . After that the Phillies were 83-62.

**HOME RECORD:** Phillies had the best home record in the NL: 51-30 despite starting the season only 1-5 . . . It was their 4th best home record (60-21, 1977 . . . 54-28, 1978 . . . 53-28, 1976 . . . 49-32, 1980).

**VS WEST:** Phillies finished 43-29 vs the Western Division, the best record among the Eastern Division clubs . . . Against East, Phillies wound up 46-44.

**HOME ATTENDANCE:** Phillies, for the seventh straight season, finished runner-up in the NL in home attendance, 2,376,394 to Los Angeles' 3,608,881. They drew the largest one-game crowd in the NL, 63,501 vs SF on July 5.

**ROAD ATTENDANCE:** Phillies drew 1,847,946 on the road, their second best total in club history. The 1979 team attracted 1,912,647.

**ATTENDANCE RECORDS:** 63,501 vs SF on July 5 was the largest regular season crowd in the 12-year history of the Vet . . . 85,971 for SF on July 5-6 was the Phillies largest two-date series . . . 174,744 for Chicago, July 29-30-31-Aug. 1 was the largest four date series.

**CLOSE GAMES:** Phils finished 29-21 in 1-run games . . . 20-13 in 2-run games . . . 21-15 in games decided in the 8th and 9th innings.

**LED LEAGUE:** The Phillies committed the fewest number of errors in the NL (121) . . . The Expos were next (122) . . . The Cardinals were third (124). Phils pitchers also lead the league in strikeouts (1,002), the Reds were next (998) . . . Phils pitchers were second in fewest HR allowed (86) . . . Dodgers had the fewest (81).

**INJURIES:** **Altamirano**, 21-day DL from 8/10 to 9/1 with a sore hand; **Bystrom**, started season on DL and missed several turns during the season with shoulder stiffness; **Christenson**, missed one turn with a groin pull suffered on 8/27; following the season, he underwent surgery for removal of loose bodies from his pitching elbow; **McGraw**, started season on DL recovering from off-season elbow surgery, activated on 6/21.

### ATTENDANCE RECORDS AGAIN

Major league baseball drew 44,587,874 fans in 1982, the ninth new high in the last 14 years, smashing the previous record of 43,550,398 in 1979.

Both leagues set new records: American League (23,080,449) and National League (21,504,494).

Minor league attendance increased by nearly six million last season and College Baseball was up 2.8 million over 1981.

## RULES OF INTEREST

---

- PLAYER LIMITS:** 40 until opening day, when the number must be reduced to 25 until September 1, when it again becomes 40.
- DETERMINING BATTING AVERAGE:** Divide the number of at bats into the number of hits.
- DETERMINING AN EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Multiply the number of earned runs by nine; take the number and divide it by the number of innings pitched.
- DETERMINING SLUGGING PERCENTAGE:** Divide the total bases of all hits by the total times at bat (At bats do not include walks, sacrifices, hit by pitcher, or times awarded first base because of interference or obstruction).
- DETERMINING FIELDING AVERAGE:** Divide the total putouts and assists by the total of putouts, assists and errors.
- DETERMINING PERCENTAGE OF GAMES WON AND LOST:** Divide the number of games won by the total games won and lost.
- CONSECUTIVE HITTING STREAKS:** A consecutive hitting streak shall not be terminated if the plate appearance results in a base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. A sacrifice fly shall terminate the streak.
- CONSECUTIVE-GAME HITTING STREAKS:** A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances (one or more) result in a base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.
- CONSECUTIVE-GAME PLAYING STREAK:** A consecutive-game playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance only shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he can comply with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.
- SUSPENDED GAMES:** For the purpose of this rule, all performances in the completion of a suspended game shall be considered as occurring on the original date of the game.
- TRADING REGULATIONS:** Players are available on waivers in reverse order of standings, at the time waivers expire, if more than 30 days after start of the season; otherwise in reverse order of standings at close of preceding season.
- INTER-LEAGUE TRADES:** Midnight, five days after the World Series—to 5 PM the last scheduled day of the Winter Meetings—No waivers are necessary. Plus Feb. 15 to 5 PM April 1.
- TRADING WITHIN LEAGUE:** Midnight, the last day of the season—Midnight, June 15—No waivers necessary. Midnight, June 15—Midnight, the last day of the season—League waivers necessary.
- DETERMINING THE MAGIC NUMBER:** Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the loss column of the standings from the closest opponent.
- DOCTORED BAT:** If a filled or "doctored" bat is used, the player is to be ejected from the game and suspended three days. Any balls hit by an illegal bat do not count. If the umpire sees the illegal bat before it is used, he issues a warning, but there is no penalty.
- DETERMINING A "MAJOR LEAGUE YEAR":** 172 days constitute a full year of service in the major leagues.
- GAME WINNING RBI:** The RBI which gives a club the lead it never relinquishes.

## OWNERSHIP

---

Bill Giles, who began his baseball career as a summer-time employee of the Cincinnati Reds while in college in the mid 1950s, advanced to the President of the Phillies. Giles' group purchased the team from the Carpenter family on Oct. 29, 1981.

The Giles group, which is a limited partnership entitled "The Phillies", consists of Bill as the general partner and five other entities as limited partners:

- A subsidiary of Taft Broadcasting Company, a publicly held corporation that owns seven television stations, including WTAF (Channel 29 in Philadelphia), 12 radio stations, five amusement parks and companies involved in the production and distribution of entertainment programming. Taft, headquartered in Cincinnati, is listed on the New York Stock Exchange and has the biggest investor in the group. Charles S. Mechem Jr., is Chairman of the Board.
- J.D.B. Associates, a partnership of which John Drew Betz is the limited partner and Robert D. Hedberg is the general partner. Betz is the Chairman Emeritus of Betz Laboratories, Inc., a company primarily engaged in industrial water treatment and related specialty chemicals areas. Hedberg is a venture capitalist.
- Tri-Play Associates, a partnership of three brothers—Alexander K. Buck, James Mahlon Buck Jr. and William Clifton Buck—who are the principal executive officers of TDH, Inc. and TDH Capital Corporation, private venture capital investment companies.
- Fitz Eugene Dixon, Jr., the civic leader who is Chairman of the Board of Temple University and Widener College, and the former owner of the Philadelphia 76ers.
- Mrs. Rochelle Levy, a well-known Philadelphia artist and member of the Board of Moore College of Art. Mrs. Levy's husband is Robert P. Levy, chief executive officer of DRT Industries, a mini-conglomerate primarily engaged in the storage of bulk liquids and in various leisure-recreational activities.

None of the partners own as much as 50 percent of the partnership.

### **BILL GILES**

William Yale "Bill" Giles, the President of the Philadelphia Phillies, is a career baseball man.

Born in Rochester, New York on September 7, 1934, Bill is the son of the late Warren C. Giles, former General Manager of the Cincinnati Reds and President of the National League from 1951-1969.

Giles started his baseball career when he was 19 in the front office of the Reds, also working in the Cincinnati minor league system in 1960. He joined the new Houston franchise in 1962 where he handled the combined role of Traveling Secretary and Publicity Director. He then moved up to Director of Public Relations and Promotions in 1964 and Vice President in 1967.

When the Phillies were preparing their move from Connie Mack Stadium to Veterans Stadium, Giles was hired by Bob Carpenter as the team's Vice President, Business Operations.

He was named the Phillies Executive Vice President in 1972 thus becoming the Phillies Chief administrative officer filling in for ownership in its absence.

He was the club's chief representative in community affairs, plus sales, promotions, stadium operations, public relations, tickets, merchandising, radio and television, scheduling and cancellation and postponement of games.

Known for his imaginative promotions and creative methods of delivering the season's first ball, Giles is widely identified with the transformation of the Phillies into one of professional sports top franchises.

Giles is very active in the Philadelphia community. He was recently named Chairman of the Board of the Philadelphia Convention and Tourism Bureau. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, the Police Athletic League, Likoff Cardiovascular Institute and Hero Scholarship. He is also a member of the Union League, Rotary Club, Hospice Program, Philadelphia Country Club and Pine Valley Golf Club.

Giles is also very active in major league baseball matters, holding positions on four key committees. He is Chairman of the Revenue Sharing Committee, Vice-Chairman of the MLB Promotion Corporation and a member of the Rules and Television Committees.

Bill and his wife, the former Nancy Kirwin whom he married in 1956, make their home in Villanova. They have three sons, Michael, 23, a graduate of Lafayette College; Joseph, 20, presently a junior at Cornell majoring in Hotel Administration, and Chris, 17, a junior at Episcopal Academy.

## **PAUL OWENS**

The Philadelphia Phillies have become one of the most respected and formidable organizations in professional baseball both on and off the field. One of the main reasons is the excellent input of Paul Owens, the Phillies Vice President, General Manager.

Owens took over the role of General Manager from longtime baseball man John Quinn on June 3, 1972, and began transforming the Phillies from sixth place finishers to contenders to eventual champions.

With Danny Ozark at the helm and Owens supplying the talent, the Phillies won Philadelphia's first "title" since 1950 when they captured the first of three consecutive Eastern Division Championships in 1976.

Paul Francis Owens, 59, was born on February 7, 1924 in Salamanca, N.Y. He began his professional career as a first baseman in the St. Louis Cardinals chain in 1951. He was playing for Olean, N.Y., and won the Pony League batting championship with an amazing .407 average. He also played in 1952 before staying out of professional baseball in 1953 and 1954.

Owens returned in 1955 as the playing-manager of the Olean club. He was manager there for three seasons winning two more batting titles, (.368 in 1956 and .407 in 1957) before concluding his minor league managing career with Bakersfield, CA, in 1958 and 1959.

"The Pope," as he is known by his many friends, then began a scouting career moving from his native New York State to the West Coast where his territory included Southern California, Arizona, New Mexico, Western Colorado and Southern Nevada.

On May 22, 1965, he was promoted to the head of the Phillies minor league system, a position he held until he succeeded Quinn. Then on July 10, 1972, he replaced Frank Lucchesi as the Phillies field manager finishing the season with a 33-47 record.

His next move was to hire Ozark and move back upstairs to build the ballclub that would become a National League powerhouse.

In August of 1979 he replaced Ozark with Dallas Green and his confidence paid off as Dallas led the Phillies to the team's first World Championship in 1980.

In November of 1981, he named former Phillies catcher Pat Corrales to succeed Dallas Green as Phillies field manager.

Owens is a 1942 graduate of Salamanca High School. He spent three years in the service, two years in Europe during WW II as a sergeant in a U.S. Army engineering company. While in the service he met Marcelle Leclercq and they were married in Liege, Belgium on February 23, 1946.

After returning to the states, he enrolled at St. Bonaventure University graduating with a B.S. Degree in Physical Education in 1951. He was inducted into the St. Bonaventure Hall of Fame in February of 1977.

Paul and Marcelle, who make their home in Sewell, N.J., are the parents of two sons, Danny 32 and Pat 33. They have five grandchildren, Paulette, Caroline, Geoffrey, Andy and Kevin.

## **TONY SIEGLE**

Tony Siegle, 42, is the Phillies Executive Assistant working with General Manager Paul Owens and Minor League Director Jim Baumer on player personnel matters.

He came to the Phillies in 1982 from Houston with a vast baseball background that included positions with the Milwaukee Brewers and both the Phillies and Astros earlier in his career.

A native of Trenton, N.J., Siegle began his sports career as a part-time employee with Houston in 1965 as a member of the original scoreboard crew under the leadership of Bill Giles. He later was named Assistant to the Director of Expositions and Conventions of the Houston Sports Association and served in that capacity until October, 1969.

When Giles left Houston for Philadelphia, Siegle went with him where he spent a year as the Phillies Director of Stadium Operations. He then joined the Brewers as Administrative Assistant in the farm and scouting department in October, 1970. During his stay with Milwaukee, he worked with Baumer, then the Brewers General Manager.

Tony moved to Houston for the second time on August 10, 1979 when he was named Assistant to the General Manager succeeding John Mullen who was named General Manager of the Atlanta Braves.

Siegle is a graduate of the University of Miami, Miami (FLA.) where he earned a degree in Business Administration graduating in 1961. Tony and his wife Carole have two children, Amy Beth and Andrew. They make their home in Wayne, Pa.

## **JIM BAUMER**

Jim Baumer, 52, is the Phillies Director of Minor Leagues and Scouting. He carries a vast background in scouting and player development.

He was an infielder in pro baseball from 1949 through 1967 before turning to scouting and then a front office career with the Milwaukee Brewers.

A shortstop, Baumer was signed to a bonus contract by the Chicago White Sox out of Broken Arrow, Okla., in June of 1949. He went right to Class B baseball and finished his first pro season hitting .400 in eight games with the White Sox. His playing career was interrupted in 1952 and 1953 by the U.S. Army.

Baumer returned to minor league baseball in 1954 and played in the states through 1962. He had a brief stint with the Cincinnati Reds in 1961. From 1963 through 1967, he played in Japan with the Fukuoka Lions.

His scouting career began with Houston in 1968. Following four years with the Astros, he became the special assignment scout with the Milwaukee Brewers. Baumer then began moving up the ladder, becoming the Director of Scouting (1973), Director of Player Development and Scouting (1974) and General Manager (1975-1977).

He is credited with signing infielder Robin Yount with the Brewers.

Baumer first joined the Phillies organization in 1978 as a special assignment scout. His duties included covering the major league clubs which train in Arizona, cross-check scouting of high school and college free agent players, the Phillies minor league farm system and major league clubs on the west coast.

During September, 1980, he and Wilbur (Moose) Johnson scouted the Kansas City Royals, New York Yankees and Baltimore Orioles in anticipation of the World Series.

Jim married the former Kathy Kraft on March 13, 1981, in a Clearwater, Fla. ceremony. They have one daughter, Katie, and make their home in Paoli, Pa.

## **DAVE MONTGOMERY**

David Paul Montgomery is the Phillies Executive Vice-President. He assumed the duties of the day to day business operations of the Phillies when Bill Giles became President of the club following the sale of the franchise by the Carpenter family.

Montgomery, 36, joined the Phillies in February, 1971, as a member of the Sales Department under Giles. He then progressed to positions of Director of Marketing and Director of Sales before elevation to his present position.

**QUALIFICATIONS FOR A SAVE**—Credit a pitcher with a save when: 1. He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club, and 2. He is not the winning pitcher, and 3. He qualifies under one of the following conditions: (a) He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning, or (b) He enters the game with the potential tying run either on base, at bat, or on deck (that is, the potential tying run is either already on base or is one of the first two batsmen he faces), or (c) He pitches effectively for at least three innings. No more than one save may be credited in each game.

That was the first year for the Philadelphia Baseball Hall of Fame, an area of the 200 level concourse behind home plate, where former Phillies players and ex-Philadelphia Athletics stars are honored.

Players must have five or more years of service to be eligible for the Hall. Coaches and managers need four years. All candidates must be retired for three years before they become eligible.
