Bring it back!

**Mazeroski's home run set off  
a 25-year celebration  
for Pirate fans.**

**T**he last pitch of the 1960 baseball season reduced Bill Mazeroski's mother and Mickey Mantle to tears.

It was 3:36 p.m. on Thursday, October 13 when Mrs. Mayme Mazeroski, watching television at home on Clark Mill Road in Norton Township, Ohio, saw her 24-year-old son make baseball history. Mantle watched helplessly in center field as teammate Yogi Berra retreated on the ball that cleared the left field wall at Forbes Field.

Mrs. Mazeroski wept from parental pride; Mantle's tears came from losing a World Series to a team that had been outscored 38-3 in its three losses.

The Yankees set Series records for batting average (.338), slugging percentage (.528), runs (55), hits (91) and RBI (54). The Pirates established a new mark for the most passed balls (3). As Pittsburgh outfielder Gino Cimoli would note, the Yankees broke all the records and the Pirates won the Series. That

they did was a tribute to a rock-hard infield, a rock-headed play by a Yankee pitcher and a team that had an unshakable belief in that old line about a game never being over until the last man was out.

The 1960 Pirates invented ways to win games that defied description. Of their 95 victories, 21 came in the final at bat and a dozen of those were with two men out. The offensive spark was provided by Dick Groat, team captain, National League batting champion and Most Valuable Player. Roberto Clemente hit .314 and drove in 94 runs. The pitching staff was anchored by Cy Young Award winner Vernon Law (20-5), Comeback Player of the Year Bob Friend (18-12) and Wilmer "Vinegar Bend" Mizell, who was 13-5 after joining the Pirates in a May 28 trade. ElRoy Face appeared in 68 games, saved 25 and won ten others. Danny Murtaugh was named Manager of the Year after successfully platooning at three starting positions.

It was the year that adman Roger Montgomery wrote the phrase, "Beat 'Em, Bucs," which survived a punctuation controversy and was inescapable with or without the comma. Bandleader Benny Benack put the concept to music and 1,705,828 fans learned that it wasn't wise to leave Forbes Field early.

The mold for the season may have been cast on Easter Sunday, April 17, when the Pirates beat Cincinnati 6-5 in the second game of a double header. Pittsburgh trailed 5-0 entering the ninth but a three-run pinch hit homer by Hal Smith and a two-run shot by Bob Skinner helped win the game and offered a preview of coming attractions.

"We won ball games that we had no business winning," says Law.

## “All I wanted to do was get on base somehow...”



**T**he seventh game was one of the craziest games I've ever been in. We played some crazy games but this was the World Series. I don't know, it seemed the Pirates never got started until about the seventh inning. We pulled an awful lot of wins out in the last two or three innings.

The Yankees in those days were winning just about every year. They would also come from behind and I think it took some of the starch out of us when they tied us up in the ninth inning. We kind of thought we had them beat because we had a two-run lead and we only needed three more outs but we just couldn't get them. All those things you'd heard about the Yankees start running through your mind and you start thinking, here they come. We were fortunate enough to get a run.

Ralph Terry was the pitcher and I didn't know that much about him. I

may have faced him once before in the Series, but I don't really remember. All I remember was trying to hit the ball hard somewhere. I wasn't trying to hit a home run. It wasn't one of those deals where I said I was going to hit one. All I wanted to do was get on base somehow.

I was always pretty much a first ball hitter but the first pitch was a little too high. The second one was still a little high, but it was in the strike zone. I was a high ball hitter.

When I hit it, I knew it was over Yogi Berra's head and I knew it was at least going to be off the wall. I didn't know if it was going out or not. That's why I was running hard all the way. Usually you give

it the three-quarter home run trot when you know it's gone.

I wanted to get to third if possible. The left field wall was 410 feet out there so you really had to catch every bit of the ball to get it over. I got quite a bit of it but not all.

About halfway to second base, I saw the umpire down the left field line giving the circle. I think that was one of the first times I showed emotion on the ball field. I started jumping up and down and all I could think was we beat the Yankees. There was a big crowd in a "V" around home plate. I touched home plate and then it all crashed in on me. From then on, it was one heck of a time getting to the clubhouse.

I never even got any champagne. There were too many sportswriters around me. Bob Prince likes to tell the story of how he rushed me on and off because he didn't know what had happened.

I made a few appearances that winter but not many. I was never one to get into the banquet trail. I didn't take advantage of it the way some people would have. That's not my style. Someone could have made a lot of money out of it if he wanted to. I guess the wrong person hit the home run. Every day, there was somewhere I could have gone. I feel very uncomfortable doing any public speaking so I just try to stay away from it.

Right after I left the park, I got in the car and my wife and I went up to Schenley Park and just sat there and looked over the city. We just wanted to get away from the crowds, I guess. There were just a few squirrels up there. It was nice, peaceful and quiet, probably the only place in the city that was quiet then.

Everyone said that hitting the home run was great, but I couldn't live on that. I still had 12 more years to play, so I had to put it out of my mind and go play. I had the rest of my career to put in yet. You can't live on one hit because you still had to produce and work. I more or less forgot about it all the time I was playing until people would bring it up. I hear about it more now than I did then.

There's hardly a day goes by when I see people that it's not mentioned. When I was coaching for Montreal last year, wherever I'd go in the minor leagues or major leagues, it was brought up at one time or another during the day.

I was asked if it feels like it's been 25 years since 1960. It doesn't seem like yesterday. I'll tell you that. It seems like a long time ago.

"It was that kind of ball club," says Groat. "So many people want to laugh about all the runs the Yankees scored against us but that was typical of the Pirates of 1960. When we were kids in baseball, Mr. (Branch) Rickey used to explain to us that the great team wins the close games. That's exactly what

the 1960 Pirates did all season long, including the World Series."

The Pirates won Game One of the Series 6-4 behind Law and Face before losing to Bob Turley 16-3 in a second game that featured a pair of long-distance home runs by Mantle. Whitey Ford pitched a 10-0 shutout but the Pirates evened the Series

with a 3-2 win by Law and Face in Game Four. Face saved a 5-2 win for Harvey Haddix in Game Five, the biggest margin of victory the Pirates would enjoy in the Series. Ford won Game Six 12-0 on a seven-hitter.

"Believe it or not, it's very easy to come into a locker room and get dressed after you get beat 10-0, 12-0,

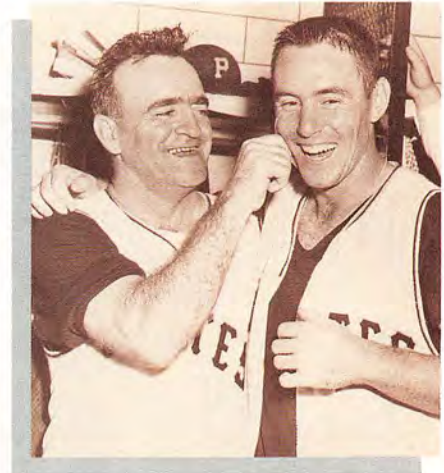
and 16-3," Groat says. "When you lose close games, you go back and mentally replay every situation. There's no second guessing the other way. We were never in the second game and Whitey Ford just completely shut us down the two other times."

The seventh game saw the Pirates take an early 4-0 lead but fall behind 7-4 by the sixth-inning. Trailing 7-5, it remained for Pittsburgh to close the season with two typical late-inning rallies.

Bill Virdon followed with a potential double play grounder to short that hit a pebble, took a sharp bounce, struck Tony Kubek in the throat and wound up a single. Groat singled home a run and Yankee manager Casey Stengel brought in Jim Coates. Two outs later,

Clemente hit a chopper to first base that Bill Skowron fielded. The Yankees had no play because Coates chased the ball rather than

## Bob Prince missed the Pirates' greatest moment.

**T**he 25th anniversary of the 1960 World Series brings back a flood of memories of that entire season. Long before Bill Mazerowski hit the home run to win it all (and bring about my most monumental embarrassing moment as a broadcaster), there were plenty of memorable events.

The 1960 Pirates never lost more than four straight, thanks to Vernon Law, who stopped the streaks. He won 20 games and the Cy Young Award. ElRoy Face, who was 18-1 in 1959, did a tremendous job in relief again. Don Hoak had a great season and Dick Groat won the National League batting title and Most Valuable Player award. A lot of people forget that Groat was out about a month with a broken wrist and that Dick Schofield hit nearly .400 while filling in for him.

The Yankee people will have you believe they lost the Series on a bad hop grounder at Forbes Field. I won't argue that the double play ball that struck Tony Kubek in the throat was a break for the Pirates, but that's not the whole story of the Series.

I wonder, for example, why Casey Stengel didn't start Whitey Ford in the first game. It's customary for a team to start its best pitcher so he can work three times if the Series goes the full seven games. Ford was unquestionably the Yankees best pitcher, but Stengel started Art Ditmar in the first game. Ford faced the Pirates twice and killed us both times.

On the ball that hit Kubek, you have to remember that he backed up and let the ball play him. If he came in on the ball, it doesn't take the bad hop and it's an easy double play. You have to remember, too, that the Yankees had plenty of chances to get out of that inning but their pitchers didn't get the job done. Jim Coates forgot to cover first base on a ball hit by Roberto Clemente and that helped keep the rally alive.

I'll never get over the play in the ninth when Yogi Berra hit the ball to Rocky Nelson at first. Why Nelson didn't throw the ball to second to start a double play, I'll never know. Nelson doesn't know why either. If he does that, the game and the Series are over right there. It was the darndest thing I've ever seen because Mickey Mantle was able to dive safely back into first as the tying run scored. It should have been a double play and Hal Smith, who hit a three-run homer in the eighth, would have been the hero.

But, as everyone knows, it was Bill Mazerowski who was the hero and that set up a moment that I'll never forget. I left the broadcast booth with the Pirates ahead 9-7 to go down to the clubhouse and do

clubhouse.

There were no elevators at Forbes Field, so going from the booth to the clubhouse meant going down a catwalk, ducking under steel girders and fighting your way through the crowd. I couldn't see the field at all and I had no idea how we had won the game.

I battled my way to the clubhouse and was handed a pair of microphones about 30 seconds after I came through the door. I was out of breath from the running, it's absolute bedlam in the clubhouse and I still don't know how we won the game. I was standing on a trunk when they gave me the signal that I'm on both NBC Radio and TV. There's a guy standing next to me holding a bat. It was Bill Mazerowski.

I remember I asked something about how it felt to be a member of the World Champs, he said, "Great," and I clapped him on the back and that was that. I interviewed the other players and dignitaries, then sent it back to the booth for the wrap-up.

About an hour later, my wife and I were sitting down to dinner at the Pittsburgh Athletic Association and I finally said to her, "By the way, how did we win it?" She told me Maz hit a home run and I nearly fell off my chair. Since I hadn't known, I had given the hero of the Series about 30 seconds of air time.

The funny thing is that Maz in those days was so shy that he didn't mention it to me until about two years later. He, Dick Groat and I were coming back from a banquet in Cumberland, Md. in a blizzard and Maz said to me, "Did you wish that Dick Stuart had hit that thing instead of me?"

When you look back on all the crazy things that happened in the regular season and the Series, I guess you have to say it was one of those years that was just meant to be.

postgame interviews with the World Champion Pirates. I worked my way to the clubhouse and ElRoy Face was there praying. I asked him what was wrong and he told me the Yankees had tied the score.

I was told to head back to the booth so I'd be available to do the play-by-play in the event of extra innings. I worked my way back up, got near the booth and heard a tremendous roar. Someone hollered out to me that the Pirates won and that I was to go back to the

Coates failed to cover first. Otherwise, it would have been all over right here and they were still ahead."

"Everybody talks about the bad hop and there's no argument that was a break on our behalf," says Groat. "The difference in the Pirates and Yankees was the Yankees had the inning closed out and Coates forgot to cover first. That's the kind of mistake the Pirates didn't make."

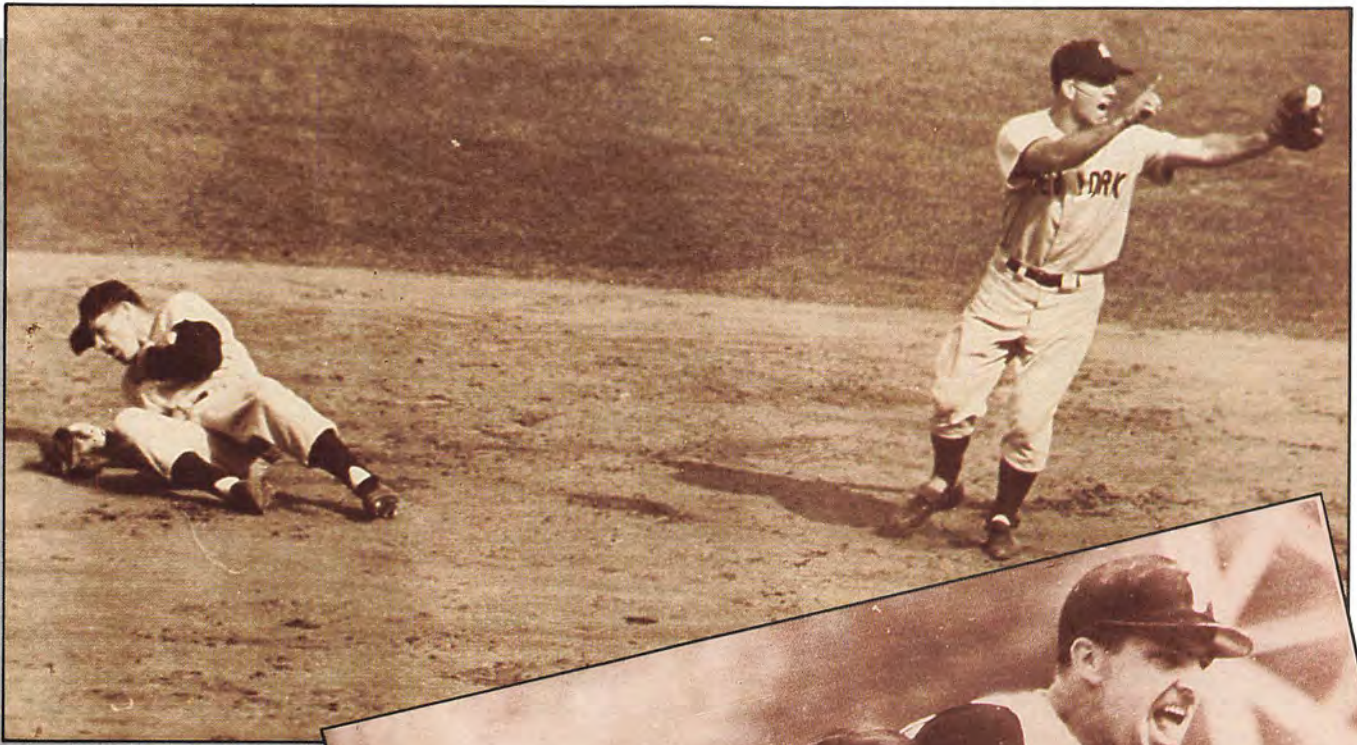
But it was the kind the Pirates loved to jump on. Hal Smith followed with a three-run homer, giving Pittsburgh a 9-7 lead that lasted until

New York tied the score in the ninth.

The party started shortly after Ralph Terry delivered a 1-0 pitch to Mazeroski, the only time a World Series has ended with a home run. It provided each Pirate a winner's share of \$8,417.94. Given the Kubek play in the eighth, it seemed unfair that head groundskeeper Eddie Dunn had only been voted a \$250 cash award when the shares were divided.

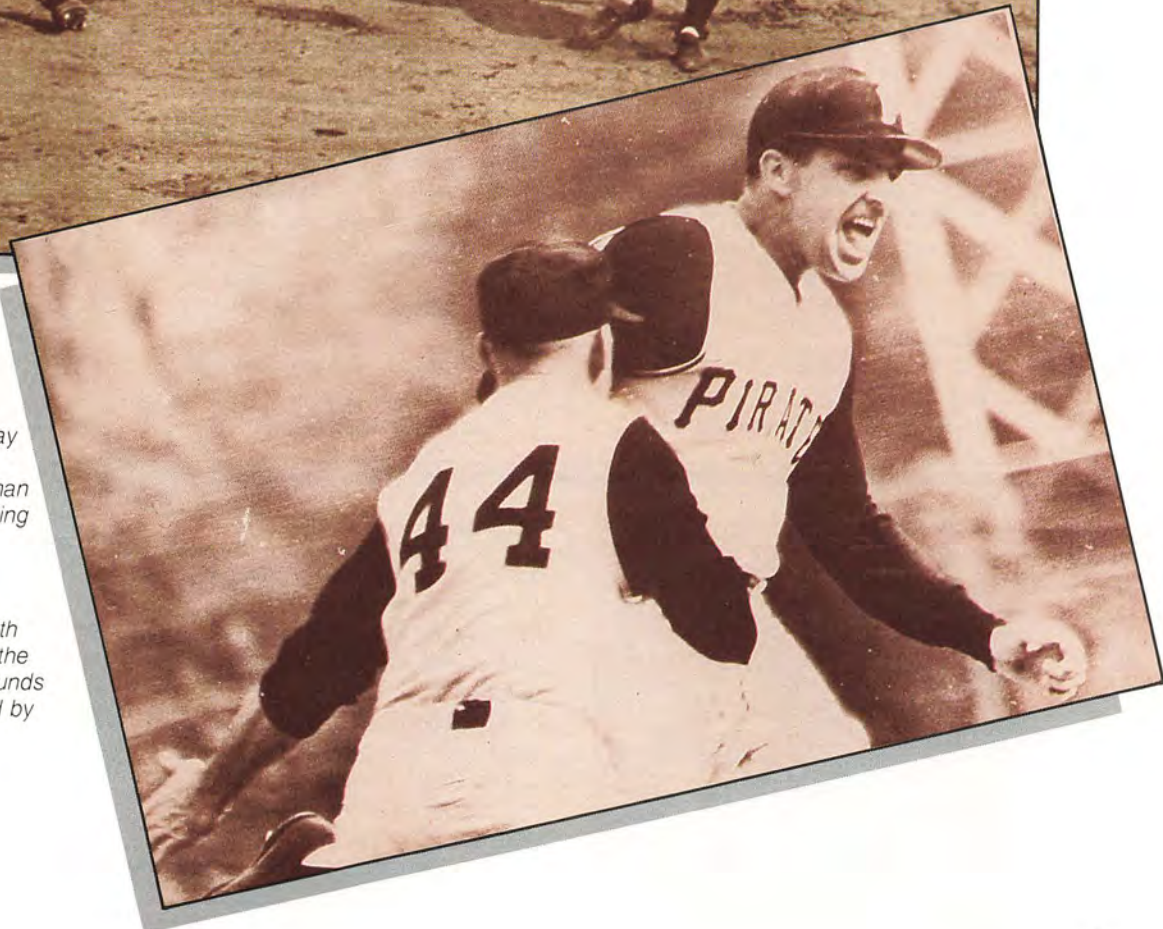
The souvenir hunters moved in for items of immeasurable sentimental value. Chris Montgomery, 14 retrieved the home run ball outside

# Maz's blast stirred an urban society.

**F**or victory parties, nothing in Pittsburgh's history, even the euphoria over the end of World War II or the overpowering pride in the Steelers' triumphs in four Super Bowls, came near matching the wild civic celebration which erupted in the wake of the Pirates' World Series victory in 1960.

It was a party to end parties. From the upper floors of skyscrapers which peered down on the city, a confetti of shredded IBM cards, the precursor of today's computer printouts, fell like a snowstorm onto the streets. Thirty minutes after Bill Mazerowski's series-winning line drive, a hit that has lived vividly in the memories of those who actually saw it, this town reveled in the festive mood of a Mardi Gras or the running of the bulls in Pamplona.

Mazerowski's blast, at 3:36 p.m., was a bugle call which stirred an urban society. At the fog end of a pleasant Thursday afternoon in Indian summer, a shirt-sleeve day, Mazerowski's hit sent fans scurrying deliriously from their offices. Man and woman, they danced on Grant Street and climbed lightpoles along Cherry Way. Drinks aloft, they paraded noisily through the city's narrow side streets on the hoods of automobiles, reaching out to kiss everybody in sight in a display of affection that made the family concept of the Bucs of 1979 pale in comparison.

On the far side of the tunnels leading into the city, suburbanites from the South Hills and Washington



County used what guile they could to evade the barricades which police had set up to seal off the reveling city from the rest of the county. When the downtown crowd reached 300,000 shortly after 7 p.m., a figure estimated by Louis Rosenberg, the city's safety director at that time, he ordered the tunnels and bridges closed to protect the city's safety.

It was a good natured crowd throughout the evening and long toward the dawn. While downtown crowds have tended to create problems in recent years, the World Series celebrants a quarter of a century ago were a light-hearted lot. The next day, local newspapers reported that only 28 minor arrests had been made, most of them for over-imbibing, and a few more for disorderly conduct, for attempting such foolhardy stunts as trying to walk a tightrope on a trolley wire or throwing telephone books,

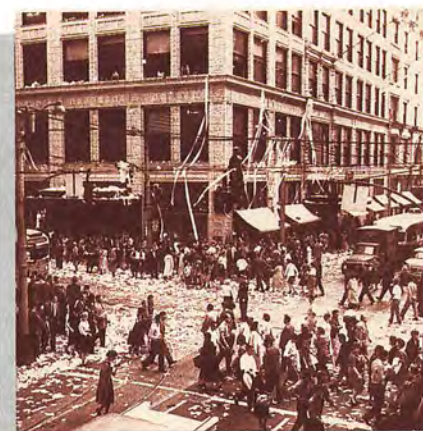
unshredded, out windows with the confetti.

Oh, there were some anxious moments. Near riots threatened as bars ran out of refreshments, but until much of the crowd had dispersed, there were oases nearby which had better prepared for an upset of the Yankees. While individual bars, particularly on Grant Street, ran out of food and booze, downtown never did.

At the lower end of town, the Hilton Hotel—the press headquarters—was under siege all evening as wisely planted rumors swept the city that the Pirates were holding their victory party there, which, of course, they weren't. By the time the press corps had returned to the Hilton after the game, so great was the press of fans at the doors that writers were denied admission to their own hotel until they produced a room key.

Of course, all Pittsburgh fans who had waited 33 years to participate in any kind of a sport championship weren't hanging around, waiting for the action. One of the more demonstrative Buc followers, Maxwell Schneider, who operated a shoe firm in the May Building, escaped the crush by loading seven of his employees, and dozens of Pirate pennants and banners, onto an early evening flight to New York City.

They did their celebrating in Times Square, where, under the noses of Yankee fans, they could rub it in until they returned home, wearily too, the next morning.

the park. Tavern owner Alex DeMao of Arnold took first base home and Michael J. Cipa of Squirrel Hill came armed with a shovel and pliers to uproot home plate. He got it but complained that he ruined an \$85 sport coat in the process.

The Pirate clubhouse was raucous, with Dick Stuart pouring a bucket of champagne on Mayor Joseph Barr and scolding, "You old

so-and-so, you shouldn't have come in here if you didn't want to get wet."

The Yankees were distilling a different brand of grapes. In what was to be his final day in a Yankee uniform, Stengel lightened the moment with a bit of his unique oratory.

"My fellas did a hell of a job today, as you could see," he said. "They came back twice, didn't they? They didn't give up when they were four runs down there in the second inning and they got out in front pretty good but how can you stop

those balls that you can't field when they go out of the park?"

A clubhouse attendant advised reporters that Mantle was unavailable. "Mickey's crying," the man said. "I don't think he'd want you to see him this way."

"The Pirates should never beat our club," Roger Maris said. "I think if we played this team all season, we'd beat them real bad. They were real lucky. I think it's impossible for them to get more breaks than they had in this Series. Every time we hit the ball, it was right at somebody."

The celebration lasted all night and cost the city \$50,000 to clean up. Mazeroski's neighbors at Ninth and Washington in Braddock started their own party and Law returned home to find his Wilkins Township

neighbors celebrating on the front lawn.

Mazeroski appeared on "What's My Line." Groat did six or seven banquet appearances per week at no charge and Face and Smith put together a country music act that played nightclubs and Perry Como's TV show. Part of being a Pittsburgh Pirate was having a phone that never stopped ringing.

The Pirates finished sixth in 1961 and wouldn't see postseason play again until 1970. By then, only Mazeroski and Clemente remained as active players on the Pittsburgh roster. The 1960 team had been dismantled within a few years, primarily in 1962 when Groat, Don Hoak and Stuart were all traded.

Today, the majority of the 1960

Pirates are in their 50s and long removed from baseball. The memories survive, as does the pride in a job well done 25 Octobers ago.

"We had a feeling all year that we could win it," says Face. "We felt we could beat the Yankees, even though they had a great ball club. Everybody had a great year together, just like Detroit did last year."

## "Little Guys" shine at World Series time.

**O**f course, the thing I remember most about the 1960 Series was that I didn't think Maz's ball was going out. But before I get to that I ought to mention what I feel was the key play of the entire World Series. Most people say the ball that took the bad hop and knocked Kubek out of the game in the eighth inning was the turning point. Sure, that prolonged the inning and took away the sure double play for us. But it was Jim Coates' failure to cover first on Clemente's slow roller to Moose (Skowron) that really turned it around in my opinion. That would have been the final out of the inning and Hal Smith would have never come to bat that inning to hit his three-run homer that got the Pirates back in it.

It was a crazy series that's for sure. We beat the heck out of 'em in all the games we won. And that included their own ballpark. After we won the sixth game out there, 12-0, with Whitey (Ford) pitching one of his greatest Series games, we were fairly confident of winning it all. And leading by three runs (7-4) going into the eighth inning of the final game didn't hurt our confidence either. Then all those crazy things started happening. I was out in leftfield and I guess going into the eighth I was thinking I might have a shot at winning the car (for the Series MVP). It was my home run with two on that had put us ahead in the sixth. I remember worrying if it was gonna stay fair. Hit one of those forkballs that Face loved to throw. The ball went right down the rightfield foul line and I was doing a lot of twisting and turning to make it stay fair. It finally landed in the upper deck, fair, and we were ahead 5-4.

By then, Bobby Shantz was pitching for us and he did real well. I guess his luck just ran out in the eighth. When Virdon's ball took the bad hop and hit Kubek I wondered what was going on. Then Groat singled past third and instead of one on, two out, we had two on, none out and one run already in. Casey had no choice but to get Shantz out of there even though he hadn't pitched badly.

Coates came on and got the next two batters and should have been out of the inning if he had gotten over to cover on Clemente's ball to first.

Next Smith hits his three-run homer to put them up 9-7 and we come back with two in the top of the ninth, Mickey singling in one and me knocking in the other on a groundout. So I was still confident we were going to win it in that we'd come back to tie like that.

When Maz hit the ball—I think it was Terry's second pitch—I saw it come and turned to face the wall. Most people thought I was conceding and just watching it go out. But I thought it wouldn't clear and I was waiting to play it off the wall. Instead, it just skinned the vines. What could you do? You get nine runs in a ballgame you ought to win. We thought we were the better team, but we didn't win. I just turned around and ran for the dugout. You never know what can happen. They said Maz was the last guy they thought would beat us with a home run. Look at 1973, though, when the Mets beat the Orioles and Al Weis hit the big home run for them. Or all the big Series games Billy Martin had for us. Sometimes, it's the little guys who turn out to be the big guys. You'd have to say it was that way in 1960.

"You feel like you want to play against the best and that's what the Yankees had been," Law says. "It makes it much more meaningful,

maybe moreso now because time has a tendency to make the accomplishments more satisfying. Everybody knows the Yankees. Practically every fan in the country was a Yankee fan. My father-in-law was until we played them. Beating them added luster to it."

"Winning the World Championship was certainly the biggest thrill I've ever had in sports," Groat says. "Growing up in Pittsburgh, I always

wanted to play for the Pirates. The Pirates never knew enough to quit that year. We kept coming back and coming back.

"The great teams win the close games. Every game the Pirates had a chance to win in the Series, they won. The Yankees had a chance to win all seven and only won the three laughers. Contrary to what they say, the quality team won the Series."

## Stengel's strategy change left Kubek at shortstop.

**T**here were so many things about the 1960 World Series that I recall. It was such a weird series to begin with. I remember it opening up in Pittsburgh and all those 'Beat 'em Bucs' signs hung all over the place in old Forbes Field. Then there was something wrong with Whitey Ford's shoulder, as I recall, that prompted Casey (Stengel) to hold off starting him until the third game back in New York. Art Ditmar wound up starting the opener and he didn't get out of the first inning. But then, after losing the first game, the Yankees came back to rout the Pirates in the second game, 16-3, and came home to New York where Whitey pitched a 10-0 shutout. That was the beginning of Whitey's record World Series scoreless inning streak.

At any rate, by the time we got to the seventh game, it seemed to me the Yankees had demonstrated they were clearly the superior team. And if you look back at the composite box linescore for the series, they surely appeared to be. They outscored the Pirates 55-27 for the seven games, out-hit them 91-60 and, of course, Bobby Richardson won the MVP award by hitting .367 and driving in a record 12 runs.

I guess you'd have to say the whole series was decided in the eighth inning of that final game. Another funny thing I remember was that, at the start of the bottom of the eighth, (Tony) Kubek started heading out to leftfield. The Yankees were ahead, of course, 7-4, and all year long in that situation, Casey would usually have Kubek move to left as a defensive replacement if Yogi (Berra) was out there. But for some reason, Casey elected to leave Kubek at short and Yogi in left in



this situation.

Another irony. For it was Kubek who took (Bill) Virdon's ball in the Adam's apple, starting the big five-run inning for the Pirates. It was a routine double play ball. I remember, though, throughout the series there had been a lot of talk and a lot written about how hard the Pittsburgh infield was. When Tony went down, I honestly thought he'd been shot! It happened so fast and you never saw the ball come up and hit him. Then (Jim) Coates came in and got caught up in a mix-up with Moose Skowron on (Roberto) Clemente's hopper off the end of his bat to first. That set up Hal Smith's homer. I believe Coates and Smith had been teammates in the Yankee minor league chain. I know the home run pitch was right down the middle and Coates got his walking papers because of it.

All this time, I'm up in the TV booth with Bob Prince, the Pirates' broadcaster. Now at the start of the eighth, with the score 7-4, Prince started heading down to the Yankee dressing room through the crowd to get set up for the post-game interviews there. But when the Pirates started to rally, he rushed back up, only to head back down to

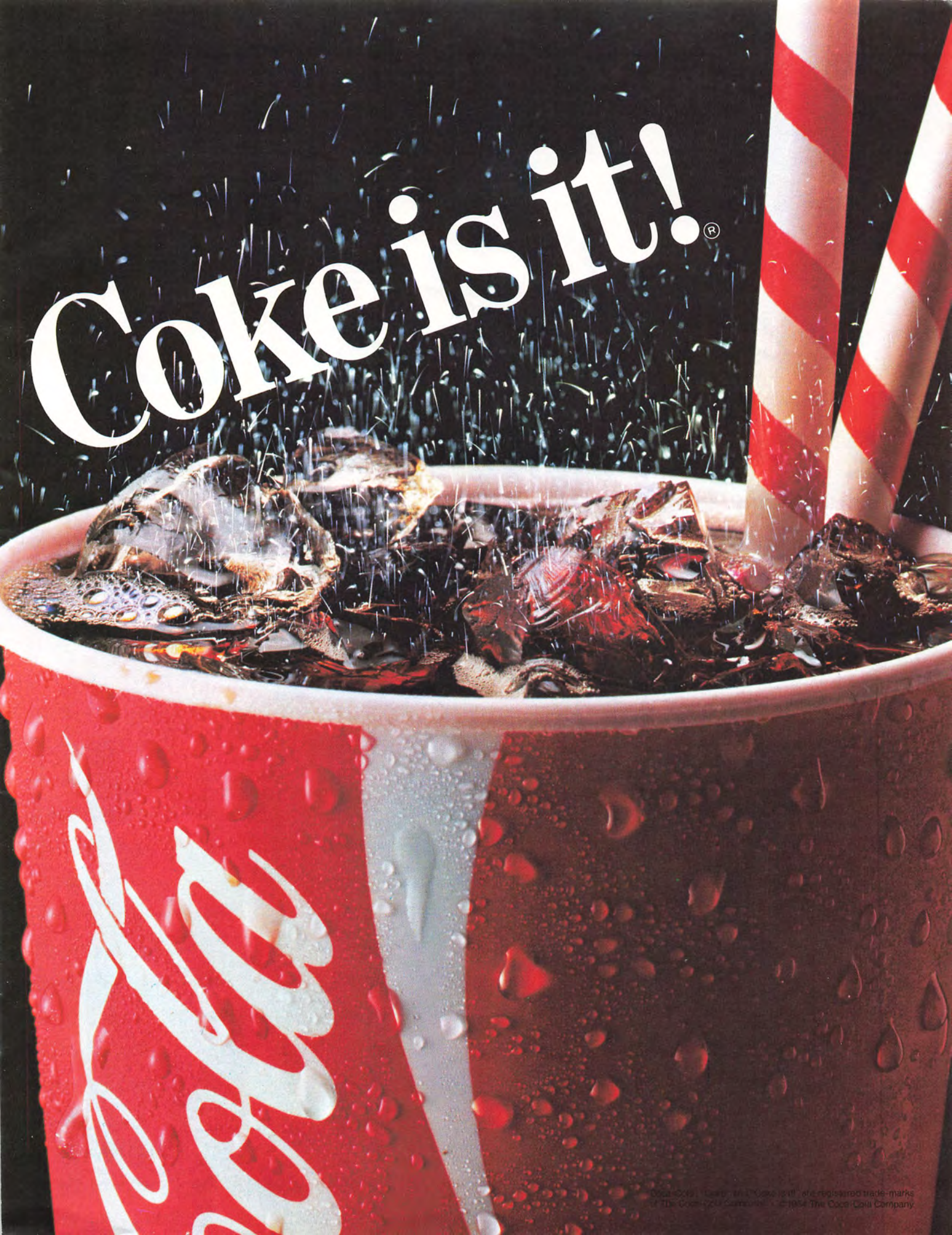
the Pittsburgh clubhouse when Smith's homer put them ahead. But then the Yankees scored twice in the top of the ninth to tie it again and poor Bob came rushing back upstairs in order to take over if the game went into extra innings. The spectre of Prince running up and down the stairs those last frantic innings probably stands out most in my mind.

Finally, there was Mazeroski's homer that decided it all. Being that it was a tie game in the bottom of the ninth, I was prepared for anything, so, the suddenness of the finish didn't phase me too much. Once the ball went out, I just let the crowd tell the story. Then I had to stretch out the closing details in order to give Prince time to get down to the Pirate clubhouse again.

After the game, I took a cab out to the airport alone. I didn't want to go on the team bus. As I sat in the cab, I remember being overcome with a certain sadness. There had been talk that Casey wasn't going to be coming back and I sensed the end of an era. I liked Casey and I hated to see the Yankees let that Series get away when they seemingly had it in their hip pocket. Ralph Terry, who gave up the homer to Mazeroski, apologized to Casey later. And I couldn't help but remember that two years later when he was the winning pitcher in the seventh game against the Giants. That was the game in which Willie McCovey lined out to Richardson to end it. If McCovey had gotten just a hair under the ball, he'd have put it out into San Francisco Bay. But on that day, the Good Lord was with Ralph Terry.

**P**irates' baseball can be heard throughout the Tri-State area on 39 Pirate Network stations, with KDKA Radio, 1020 AM, in Pittsburgh heading up the network as its flagship station.

Teaming up on radio for the fifth straight year are broadcasters Lanny Frattare and Jim Rooker, who bring all the excitement of the 162-game season into the homes of Pirate fans.

Lanny is the senior member of the broadcast team, having entered the booth in 1976. A native of Rochester, NY, Frattare received his Bachelor of Science degree in Communications from Ithaca College in 1970.

From 1968 through 1974, Lanny served as sports director of WBBF Radio in Rochester and worked for two winters (1974-75) as a play-by-play announcer for a Rochester TV station.

Lanny's baseball broadcasting career began in 1968 when he did play-by-play for the Geneva (NY) Senators in the Class A New York-Penn League and in 1970, he handled some of the Rochester Red Wings' (International League) telecasts.

Frattare's association with the Pirates began in 1974 when he served as a broadcaster for the Charleston Charlies, the Bucs' AAA International League affiliate. Lanny worked the Charlies' games for two years before joining the Pirates' broadcast crew in 1976.

Along with working the Pirates' radio and TV games for KDKA, Lanny also

serves as sports editor of KDKA Radio, handling the station's daily "Ninety-to-Six" sports reports. He also has handled numerous syndicated sporting events over the past several winters.

Jim put together an outstanding major league pitching career prior to stepping into the broadcast booth in 1981. While pitching for the Detroit Tigers, Kansas City Royals and Pirates, Jim accumulated 103 victories, including 82 with the Bucs. His biggest win came with the Pirates in Game 5 of the 1979 World Series when he allowed only one run in five innings and defeated the Baltimore Orioles and ace lefthander Mike Flanagan.

A native of Longview, Oregon, Rook averaged 13 wins in his last five seasons with the Pirates, but was forced to retire due to persistent arm problems which forced him to miss the final five months of the 1980 season.

**All Star Ballots**—Fans will again have the opportunity of voting for the National and American League starting lineups in the All-Star Game. 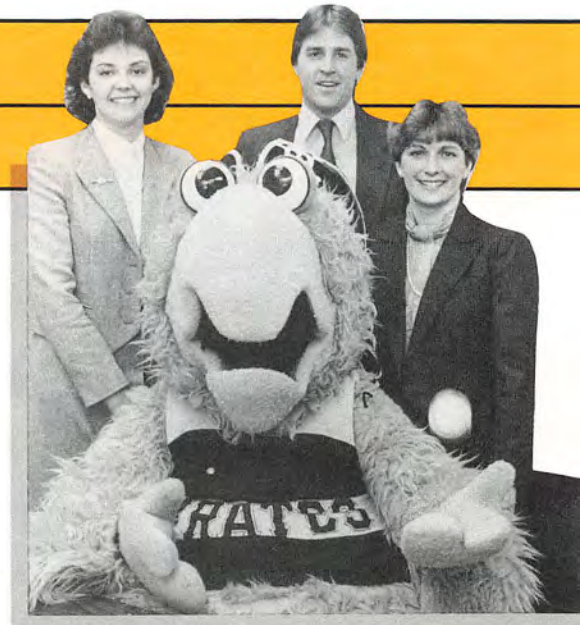

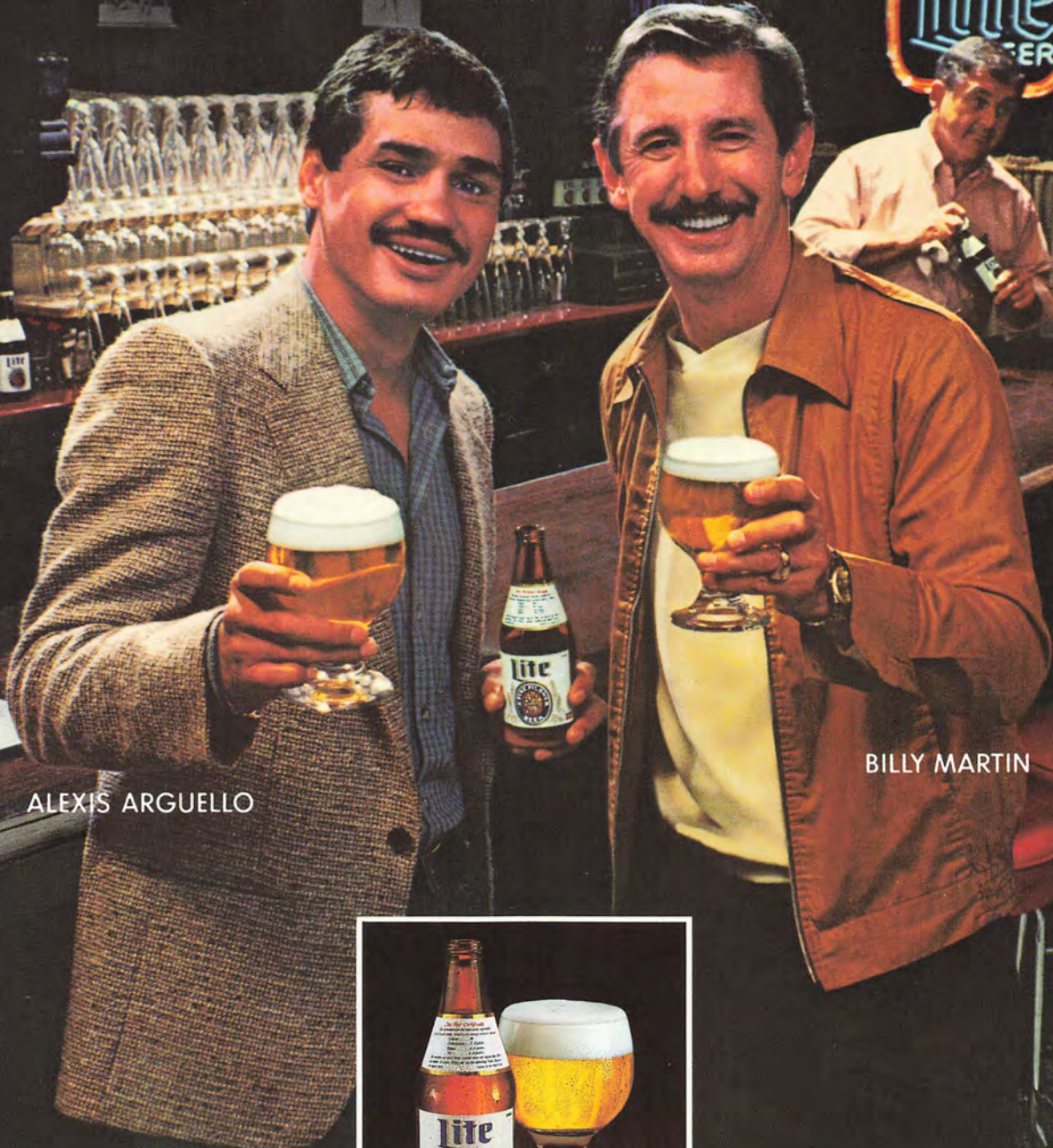
