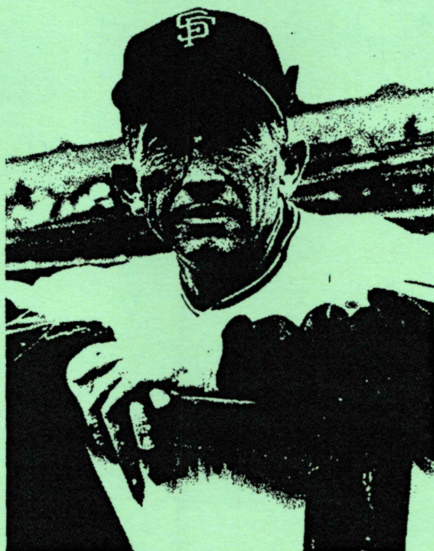

The Giants Introduce . . .

PITCHERS

DON CHOATE . . . A 21-year-old righthander from East St. Louis, Choate is coming up to his fifth season in professional baseball. The Giants obtained him a year ago as part of the Sam Jones-Bill White trade with the St. Louis Cardinals. Giant scouts had tabbed him as a pitching prospect while he was with Omaha in 1958, the high point of his Cardinal organization career, begun at Peoria in 1956. Assigned to the Phoenix Club by the Giants last year, Choate's activities were limited by a series of injuries. Overall he won four and lost seven, but his most effective games were pitched in the late season, when he was again at his physical best.

CHARLES DAVIS . . . A right-handed farm system product who was spectacularly successful for the pennant-winning Springfield Club of the Eastern League in 1959. He won fifteen games and lost six, while allowing only 150 hits in 191 innings and striking out 154. This is his first appearance at the Giants' training camp. A native of Bladensboro, N. C., and now 24 years old, he launched his professional career with the Shelby, Ky., club in 1954. He advanced steadily through the farm system via Sandersville, Ga., Danville, Va., and Springfield. The 1959 season was his most successful campaign thus far.

JULIO NAVARRO . . . A stocky Puerto Rican youngster, now 23 years old, Navarro won promotion to the Giants with a flashing performance through the late 1959 season at Springfield. Earlier he had pitched at Phoenix. For Springfield he started seven times, won six times without defeat in complete game efforts that included three shutouts. He struck out 56 hitters in sixty innings, while

allowing only 40 hits to compile a 1.50 Earned Run average. A fast ball pitcher he has been in the Giant organization since 1955, when he pitched at Hannibal, Mo. A 24-game winning season at Cocoa, Fla., in 1956 moved him into the higher minors, and he has been tabbed right along as one of the Giants' organization's better pitching prospects.

GEORGES MARANDA . . . A French-Canadian righthander, acquired by the Giants through the major league draft from the Milwaukee organization last winter. He was taken on the recommendation of several Giants' scouts who saw him pitch at Louisville, where he won 18 games and lost six. Twenty-eight years old, he has been pitching professionally since 1952, when he launched his career in his native Canada, at Quebec in the Provincial League. In more recent years he moved steadily through the Milwaukee organization via Wichita, Atlanta, Austin and Louisville. He has been a consistent winner in all recent years, with the 1959 mark at Louisville his best.

MARSHALL RENFROE . . . A fireball throwing lefthander, who has been pitching in the Giants' organization since 1954, and was briefly in 1958 and again last year on the Giants' roster. Assigned to Phoenix for the major part of the 1959 season, he divided sixteen decisions, eight and eight, with an Earned Run average of 3.54. A 23-year-old native of Century, Fla., he compiled imposing strikeout records through most of his minor league career, which began at Pulaski, Va., in 1954. His 203 strikeouts in 204 innings at Danville in 1958, as compared to 160 hits brought him to the attention of the "big" club.

VERLE TIEFENTHALER . . . A 23-year-old Iowan, this rangy righthander has moved steadily through the Giants' farm organization since his return from the service in 1957. He won sixteen games at Muskogee that year, and since then has pitched at Springfield, Danville and Corpus Christi. For Corpus Christi last year he won ten games and lost thirteen. He is credited with an exceptional pitching equipment and the Giant scouts are confident he has a major league future. This is his first appearance at the Giants' training camp.

CATCHERS

AL STIEGLITZ . . . Back for an encore appearance at the Giants' training camp, after a season at Phoenix, the tall, bat swinging Stieglitz is tabbed as one of the likeliest members of the 1960 freshman class. A series of crippling injuries limited his activities at Phoenix, but all his minor league record picks him out as an authentic hitter (left handed). He has been in the farm system since 1953, but missed two seasons because of Navy service. Since his return in 1958 he has caught at Corpus Christi in the Texas League, and last year at Phoenix. His .279 batting average included seven homers, with 33 runs batted in, in 68 games.

INFIELDERS

JOE AMALFITANO . . . Drafted in December from the Toronto Club, Amalfitano is beginning a second tour of duty with the Giants. Signed as a bonus player in Southern California under the then existing bonus rule, he remained with the Giants for two seasons, the pennant-winning year of 1954, and 1955. Since then he has played in the higher minors at Minneapolis, Dallas, Phoenix and Toronto. Always a sturdy hitter, he enjoyed his best season at Toronto last year, batting .308 in 115 games. A third baseman originally, he has played at all the infield positions in recent years, with a heavy concentration upon second base.

BEN VALENZUELA . . . Back for another trial with the Giants, after a highly successful season at Phoenix in 1959. His .274 batting average included 20 home runs and 30 doubles. A native Mexican, now 26 years old, Valenzuela has been playing professionally since 1951, most of that time in the St. Louis Cardinal organization. In recent years he has done outstanding work, as a fielding third baseman, and as a hitter in the higher minors at Houston, Omaha, and Phoenix.

The Giants Introduce . . .

OUTFIELDERS

BOB PERRY . . . Northern California fans will readily identify this 25-year-old outfield prospect. He commanded attention with his outstanding play as a member of Sacramento Club of the Pacific Coast League last year. He walloped 23 homers and was tabbed as one of the league's flashiest outfielders. His professional career began in 1953 at Oshkosh, but he missed two seasons because of Army service. He has played at Muskogee, Danville, Springfield and Sacramento since 1956. He is a righthanded hitter and thrower.

JOHN WEEKLY . . . The first of the rookie crop to arrive at the Giants' training camp since the Giants began to devote intensive attention to Northern California prospects. He is a native of Pittsburg, and was signed into the Giant organization by Eddie Montague. His minor league record describes him as an especially gifted outfielder and a power hitter. At Corpus Christi in the Texas League last year he slammed 23 homers, 6 triples and 25 doubles while compiling a .277 batting average. He is 22 years old.
