

# PREPARED TO MAKE HISTORY

Before the start of the 2021 season, no one expected the Giants to finish better than third place, behind the powerhouse Dodgers and Padres. But as in life, baseball is full of surprises — and the Giants were no exception.

Instead of the middling team they were expected to be, the Giants went on to win a franchise-record and Major League-best 107 games en route to a National League West title.

"To say that I expected them to have that level of success (last year), I'd be lying to you," said Giants broadcaster Mike Krukow. "They had never done that in 139 years, and there wasn't any reason for me to believe that they would have a 107-win season. It was truly remarkable. What they did was amazing."

Criticized for not making any blockbuster signings during the 2021 offseason, the Giants relied on a core of veterans — Buster Posey, Brandon Belt and Brandon Crawford — to lead the way. While all three had banner years, the team's success was attributed

to the efforts of every single Giant who set foot on the field. "Late Night" LaMonte Wade Jr.'s game-winning clutch hits, flame-throwing Camilo Doval's scoreless ball in September and October, baby-faced Logan Webb's dominance on the mound — and many more — helped weave a narrative that Giants fans will remember for years to come.

"There was a different hero in every win. It wasn't just a Buster Posey — it was everybody on the roster and the ones that came from the minor leagues who contributed to those 107 wins," said Giants broadcaster Erwin Higueros.

"There were so many heroes that season, so many incredible moments from everyone making contributions — specific wins, defensive plays, at-bats, pinch hit home runs," echoed Krukow. "It was the essence of a team effort."

What's even more impressive is that the team hammered out ESPN-worthy highlights day after day, night after night. There were no ups and downs in 2021 — just smooth, steady play. The Giants played .600 or above ball every month of the season. During a long and grueling 162-game season, how were the Giants able to maintain that momentum all the way to the final day of the regular season, which they needed to win — and did — to edge out the rival Dodgers and capture the division title?

"The secret sauce was in the preparation, in the processes, in the small steps taken every single day," explained Giants manager Gabe Kapler. "The players were constantly tweaking the way they prepared for a game. They practiced hard and cared a lot. Day in, day out, the consistency was the secret sauce."



Kapler, his coaches and players drilled down to a microscopic level on how to prepare for the game. They honed in on not just the physical aspects, but also the mental, emotional and intellectual sides. Data and analytics helped inform pitching-hitting match-ups and defensive alignment. Just as importantly, getting in tune with their mental and emotional well-being helped players maintain a level head.

"Not everyone can be playing their best game every day. Not everybody's going to be an All Star," said outfielder Mike Yastrzemski. "But as long as we can manage our emotions and keep our focus on what's important – and that's making sure that we win – then it's going to make those tough times a lot easier and we're going to be able to get through them a lot quicker."

That self-reflection and honesty that Kapler fostered in the clubhouse became a hallmark of the team's culture. His open communication with his players helped create an atmosphere of trust and transparency. Armed with data and analytics, Kapler and his coaching staff entered each contest with a well-thought out offensive and defensive game plan. The plan was shared freely with the team, so every player knew where, when and how he'd be used during the game and understood his role in executing that plan.

"Everybody felt comfortable about the roles they were in and appreciated the communication about those roles," said pitcher Alex Wood. "Whether it was (Austin) Slater pinch hitting against a lefty in the seventh, or starting that day, or Buster Posey catching and being prepared for the lineup that day, I just thought we did a really good job at (looking at) the micro and being in the moment and handling what our job was right then and there."

"We have a great group of unselfish guys, and whatever their role or job was that day, they took it very seriously and tried to do it to the best of their ability. I think that's really a big part of our culture," Wood said.

Such buy-in from the team allowed Kapler to use his puzzle-master wizardry to deftly mix and match his lineups based on specific game situations. His acumen and success earned him the 2021 National League Manager of the Year Award. The Giants' pitching and bullpen staff were lights out, finishing the season with the Majors' second-best ERA (3.24) and best relief ERA (2.99), respectively. Giants hitters produced a league-leading 241 home runs – the most in franchise history.

"We saw how he manipulated players off the bench to get at-bats at key times – sometimes as early as the third inning. He didn't wait until the eighth or ninth," said

Krukow. "He used it when the situation presented itself to be advantageous and then he'd pull the trigger — and the players were ready."

The formula worked as the Giants spent 151 days in first place last season, edging out the Dodgers and ultimately setting the stage for an epic battle between the two as they met in the postseason for the first time in history. Despite a hard-fought division series, the Giants ultimately fell to the Dodgers in Game 5.

"The fact that the Giants won 107 games — which they'd never done before — and beat the Dodgers, who won 106 — something they had never done — I thought the significance of that was so genuine and

so committed to 100 percent by everybody in each organization," Krukow said. "I just thought the beauty of that had massive weight and we all felt it as fans watching. It was a privilege for all of us in the booth to tell that story because it was a golden age of this rivalry and we were proud to be a part of it."

It's a tall order to ask the Giants to top those 107 wins this season, so instead of focusing on the end result, the team will take the same measured approach this year as they did last season, said Kapler. They will concentrate on "finding value at the margins," he said, which means examining every pitch, at-bat, defensive play — and asking themselves, "What can I do to improve upon this?"



The Major League Baseball lockout pushed the start of the 2022 season to April 8, allowing the Giants to open at home for the first time since 2009. This year's Opening Day was extra special, as it was the first time in three years that the team welcomed back a full-house of real, live fans, who are much preferred over their pandemic-era cardboard cutout substitutes in 2020 and limited crowds for part of 2021. Amidst the fanfare, which included the raising of the 2021 NL West flag, the team also unveiled a bronze plaque commemorating its 107th win on Oct. 3, 2021 on the Portwalk outside of Oracle Park. In fitting, nail-biting fashion, the men in orange and black came from behind to beat the Miami

Marlins, 6-5, off of Austin Slater's walk-off double in the 10th inning.

The clubhouse will surely look and feel different without team leader Buster Posey, who announced his retirement on Nov. 3, 2021, but as the team showed last season, it will find ways to forge ahead.

"We have guys who want to win. They put winning above themselves. It's not always like that everywhere," Wood said. "It was a really special group last year and we have a lot of those guys back this year. It will be exciting to see us do it all over again this year and maybe even go a little further."

## GIRNTS BASEBALL GAME UP® CON GANAS®

The grit and tenacity that epitomizes the Giants' team spirit and play inspired this year's "Giants Baseball, Game Up" and "Gigantes, Con Ganas" advertising campaigns.

Giants manager Gabe Kapler originally used the term "Game Up" loosely to mean "doing whatever it takes to get the job done." His philosophy of hard work and preparation has been instilled into the Giants' attitude, work ethic and approach to the game. "Game Up" is a unified goal, to get better every day and persevere through all obstacles.

"Game up means that in the face of adversity, in the face of a challenge, to be gritty. It's similar to 'step up,' to take the challenge on head-on — it's time to compete," Kapler explained. "We're going to have challenges, we're going to have adversity, we're going to have hurdles. We're going to have to do things that we don't necessarily want to do, but we are going to do them, and when you do that, you're digging deep and asking more of yourself — you're going to game up."

Rather than merely translating "Game Up" into Spanish, the Giants have launched a separate "Con Ganas" marketing campaign aimed at its Spanish-language fans. "Con Ganas" is a phrase commonly used among the Latino community meaning to give something your all or, more succinctly, "Let's Go!" The phrase spans generations from grandparents to youth, and no matter the age or setting, the sentiment is understood by the Latino community. It's a saying adopted by both native Spanish speakers and bilingual speakers. While it's not a direct translation of "Game Up," it conveys a similar emotion while remaining authentic to the Latino community.

"Con ganas means going all-out. We give our maximum effort. We never give up. We wake up every morning with this attitude that we're going to get the job done," explained Giants broadcaster Erwin Higueros. "Con Ganas embodies what we saw last year. Con Ganas means that the Giants won 107 games because they never gave up. Every time they hit the field, they went all-out."

The indelible memory of Marco Scutaro leaning back and tilting his face to the sky, laughing at the absurdity of the rain pelting his face, knowing that in moments he would be bound for the World Series, stands among the most iconic images from the Giants' second championship season.

When the Giants defeated the St. Louis Cardinals to win the National League pennant, and the players and fans celebrated in a storm that gave then-AT&T Park a good soaking, team president Larry Baer called the atmospheric river a fitting backdrop. "October is our most beautiful month in San Francisco and it's pouring outside," he said. "It's crazy, just like everything this team has done."

They weren't finished. The Giants had one more shock for the baseball world: a four-game sweep of the favored Detroit Tigers to win their second World Series title in just three seasons.

The 10 years since the Giants' 2012 championship have afforded us a good opportunity to place the feat and that team in proper perspective within a nearly incomprehensible five-year run that brought three trophies to San Francisco.

One can safely argue the 2012 Giants were the most talented of the three teams. They were one of baseball's top-hitting squads and had a seasoned pitching staff that had issues during the regular season, but shined when it counted – even when shine turned to rain – in October.

The Giants also turned many parts of the 2010 championship story on its head, true to Baer's assessment that so many things seemed backwards.

Dynamic and diminutive fan favorite Tim Lincecum, a hero of the 2010 title team, struggled so badly in 2012 he largely was shunted to the bullpen for the postseason. Conversely, long-scuffling Barry Zito became a 2012 hero after he pitched so poorly down the stretch in 2010 the Giants left him off the roster in all three postseason series.

In 2010, 21-year-old Madison Bumgarner pitched eight shutout innings to win Game 4 of the World Series at Texas. Two Octobers later, manager Bruce Bochy actually skipped one of Bumgarner's turns in the National League Championship Series against the Cardinals after the laconic left-hander surrendered 10 earned runs over eight innings in his first two playoff starts against Cincinnati and St. Louis. That notion would have seemed farcical two years later during Bumgarner's record-setting 2014 postseason run.

You want more "backwards" from 2012?

The Giants played their best regular-season baseball after one of their two best hitters, NL batting leader Melky Cabrera, was suspended 50 games in mid-August for using performance-enhancing drugs. Led by eventual batting champ and Most Valuable Player Buster Posey, and midseason acquisitions Hunter Pence and Marco Scutaro, the Giants posted a .682 winning

percentage over their final 44 games to coast to a division title after playing .542 ball before Cabrera's suspension.

In October, the Giants lost the first two games of their Division Series against the Reds – at home – then won the next three in Cincinnati to advance while dealing the Reds their only three-game losing streak at Great American Ball Park that year. The Giants went the same route in the NLCS, falling behind the Cardinals three games to one then winning the final three games by a combined score of 20-1. The Giants became the first and are still the only team to win six elimination games in a postseason.

Even the final pitch of 2012 was a misdirection. Sergio Romo, thrust into the closer role because Brian Wilson was lost to Tommy John surgery in early April, stunned American League Triple Crown winner Miguel Cabrera by throwing a fastball for the World Series-clinching third strike.

Since Romo lived and died with the slider; that fastball to Cabrera was like Pavarotti taking the stage at Davies Symphony Hall and playing a ukulele.

Every season is different. So is every title. If you view the Giants' three championships as if they were Bochy's three children, it's easy to see why the future Hall of Fame manager does not want to choose any one over the other two as his favorite. But he acknowledged an element of the 2012 squad that stood out.

"They all had similar qualities, but I think you have to look at the resilience of the 2012 team, the never-say-die group that had their backs against the wall," Bochy said in an interview earlier this year. "Six different times they faced elimination in the playoffs to win those games to keep going. That would be the overarching theme of the 2012 club: heart, determination and the resilience that team had to play with."

So many can take a bow for the Giants' 2012 success, starting with the front office. General manager Brian Sabean's first impact moves occurred five months before opening day when he re-signed lefty reliever Javier Lopez to a two-year deal and exercised the team's option on another lefty, Jeremy Affeldt. That pair provided crucial outs for a team that lost its closer to Tommy John surgery in April.

Sabean also made what proved to be two critical midyear acquisitions, trading for Pence and Scutaro. Scutaro hit .362 in the regular season during his two months in San Francisco before becoming a postseason hero, winning the NLCS MVP and driving in the run that clinched the World Series in the 10th inning of Game 4 at Detroit.

Another stalwart was Posey, who rebounded from a horrific injury in May 2011 that mangled his left leg to win the 2012 batting title and NL MVP award.

Nobody really knew how well Posey's body would respond to that injury, not least Posey himself.

"I definitely had some nerves surrounding that," the just-retired catcher said. "The one-day-at-a-time approach never held more true. For me the victory was just being on the field. In a way that let me put less pressure on myself, and the results ended up really good."

Pablo Sandoval had an All-Star season and set a potent tone for the 2012 World Series when he hit three homers in Game 1 at AT&T Park, two off Justin Verlander, one of the majors' most dominating pitchers that year.


Sandoval's big night was one of many big moments that every title team ultimately enjoys. But if the theme of the 2012 Giants was resilience, that can be measured by how the Giants responded to four critical moments and challenges. In chronological order:

This is where the season could have gone south in a hurry. The All-Star left fielder was hitting .346 with 11 home runs and had become a fan favorite and a potent fixture in the second spot in the lineup, behind Angel Pagan. The suspension meant Cabrera was done for the regular season. Many thought the Giants were doomed. The veteran leaders made sure the clubhouse did not think that way, particularly Posey.

"Buster had such a great attitude about it," Bochy recalled. "He says, 'So what? We've got to move on.' Buster had a way of pulling the guys together and dealing with adversity when it hit you. He said we were not about Melky. He was having a great year, but he's not the one guy we depended on. We depended on 25 guys and still had a core group that could do it."

The day they lost Cabrera, the Giants were tied with the Dodgers for the division lead. They eventually won the West by eight games.

## OCTOBER 9: THE HUNTER PENCE SPEECH

The Giants were facing elimination if they couldn't beat a loaded Cincinnati team three straight days on the road in the Division Series. Before Game 3, Pence gave one of the most famous pregame speeches in club history, begging all of his teammates for "one more day" because he did not want to go home. Pence said he was dying to see what clothes-horse Ryan Theriot would wear the next day. He wanted to see this player and that, and implored his teammates to do everything they could just to win that night.

In a recent interview, Pence recalled that he was just the spokesman for a wide group of veterans who realized someone had to say something because the team seemed dead during the travel day. In particular, Lopez and Scutaro agreed the club might lose Game 3 without a pep talk. The way Pence rose and spoke so passionately

surprised Bochy and many Giants because he was new to the club and had not been very vocal.

But he had great motivation. The year before, his Phillies lost in the first round of the playoffs to the eventual World Series-champion Cardinals, and that pain from Pence's first postseason experience was still raw.

"That definitely created an intense fire within me and you kind of saw that play out," Pence said. "I don't think I would have been the same person if I had not lost the year before with the team we had in Philly."

The Giants won Game 3, then Games 4 and 5 to advance. Naturally, every postseason game the rest of October could not begin without the club gathering in the dugout for another motivational speech from Pence.


## OCTOBER 19: THE BARRY ZITO GAME

There was no sugar-coating it: Barry Zito was not a good pitcher for the Giants after signing a seven-year, \$126 million contract before the 2008 season. In five seasons for San Francisco he had a 47-56 record and 4.46 ERA. After Zito's mostly dismal 2010 effort, the club did not let him get near the mound in that postseason.

Just two Octobers later, the Giants would ask Zito to save their season, and he did. With the team down three-games-to-one in the best-of-seven NLCS, the lefty took the mound for Game 5 in St. Louis and pitched the game of his life, holding the Cardinals scoreless over 7 2/3 innings in a 5-0 victory. With that, "Rally Zito" was born and five disappointing seasons were forgotten.

"That's up there for me as one of my favorite games I caught," Posey said. "To share that experience with him and see how happy he was being able to contribute that way ... I can still remember walking through the (handshake) line after that game high-fiving guys and just seeing Zito's face. Nothing is ever guaranteed in sports, but I'll say we felt really confident going home after that win."

Indeed, the Giants won the next two games 6-1 and 9-0 to capture the pennant.

## OCTOBER 24: BUSTING VERLANDER

As often happened, the Giants were underdogs for the World Series. Once again, they turned expectations on their ear by pounding the American League Cy Young runner-up in Verlander for five runs in four innings in an 8-3 Game 1 victory at China Basin. Sandoval hit two of his three homers that night against Verlander.

The Giants were supposed to be dominated by Detroit's "superior" pitching, but behind Zito, Bumgarner, Matt Cain (who threw a perfect game in June) and Ryan Vogelsong, they held the Tigers to six runs over 37 innings to capture the Series.

"We had a very underrated starting staff," Bochy said. "We were so deep we ended up putting Timmy in the bullpen, and he ended up playing a huge role. The Tigers pitched very well. We happened to pitch better."

## WITH WILL CLARK



The hits never stopped, totaling 2,176 by the time the six-time All-Star hung up his cleats 15 years later. Will and Joan have done many interviews over the years. **JOAN:** When did you find out the Giants were going to retire your number?

**WILL:** Two years ago. Before Covid. It was during the off-season of 2019-2020. (Longtime Giants executive) Mario (Alioto) called me and gave me the good news.

**JOAN:** Were you surprised? Or were you expecting it?

**WILL:** I was hoping for it. The rule had been that you couldn't have a jersey retired unless you were in the Hall of Fame. When the Giants retired Barry Bonds' jersey, that opened the door.

I started putting notes together for my speech literally that day. I got it written within a day or two. It wasn't difficult because the memories are so good they just jump into your head and you jot it down.

**JOAN:** Then COVID-19 came along. Your ceremony was canceled in 2020 and again in 2021. You've been sitting on this speech for two years.

**WILL:** Yeah, and thoughts about it are still coming to me when I'm laying in bed and can't go to sleep. I just keep jotting 'em down and adding 'em to the speech.

**JOAN:** What does this honor mean to you?

**WILL:** When I started thinking about it, the first thing that popped into my mind was: Oh my god, my jersey number is going to be on the board right next to Willie Mays. I'm next to the greatest that's ever been! I'll be right between Monte Irvin's 20 and Willie Mays' 24. Also I look back at the nine years I played in San Francisco, and when they tell you you're number's going up on the board, you know you've had a major impact on this organization and this city. That means a lot. Everything. This is my Hall of Fame.




**JOAN:** I imagine you'll have a sizeable cheering section.

**JOAN:** You've had such an amazing career and always seemed so confident. Was there ever a period when you really struggled or doubted yourself?

**WILL:** Rookie year when I broke my elbow. We were in Montreal on getaway day. I was 22. Just two months into my big-league career. The team flew back to San Francisco while I spent the night in the Montreal hospital by myself. Then I took a plane by myself back to San Francisco the next day with my broken elbow. I had never been without my team. It crept into my mind that I might never get back to where I was. I literally could not throw the ball from first to second. I couldn't swing a bat without my top hand hurting so much that I had to finish my swings with just the bottom hand. I rehabbed for two months and returned to the team for the last two months of the season. Then I had surgery on the elbow right away.


That off-season I worked out like a mad man. I couldn't even guess at how many hours I put in and how many swings I took. I came into spring training in '87 damn near in mid-season form. Then the day before the season starts, Dan Gladden hurts his thumb and Roger (Craig) says, "You're gonna be our leadoff hitter." He had me practicing bunting and stealing bases! I hit leadoff for a month – for the first and last time in my life. But I did have four suicide squeezes!

**JOAN:** You spent time at the Giants' brand-new minor league facility in Arizona this spring. What did you think?

**WILL:** It's amazing. Everything's first class – the fields, the training table, the clubhouse, the technology. It's like being in the major leagues.

**JOAN:** Quite a bit different from the minor leagues in your day.

**WILL:** (Laughs). A bit? I remember what (former general manager) Al Rosen told me when I made the team: "I'm paying you for two things."

"What is that sir?"

"Drive in more runs than the other guy, and touch home plate more times than the other guy."

They weren't big on analytics back then. You just focused on RBI's and runs. I prided myself on hitting with runners in scoring position. I don't know the exact stats, but it's something like 350-360 for my career. Listen, if there were one or two guys on base, exactly how I like it. And I'm trying to set up the guys behind me so they can drive me in.

**JOAN:** What was your routine on game day?

**WILL:** My routine evolved over time, and the reason it evolved was the introduction of video tape. Eighty-seven, '88 is when we started to really use video. I'd get to the park early and go through tape to study the pitcher and the team I'm facing. I looked for any tendencies they fell into. I'd take what I saw on video and carry it into the game.



**JOAN:** How did you prepare for opponents before video?


**WILL:** I kept a notebook where I wrote down everything about every pitcher I ever faced. Every day I'd sit with a bunch of the guys after games and we'd go over the whole game -- what we did and didn't do. Cutoff position, things like that. I'd make notes to myself. Did it my whole career.

**JOAN:** What kind of notes?

**WILL:** All kinds of things. When I was young and more volatile, I'd beat myself up: "What the hell were you thinking, you idiot?" On good days, I'd write little notes like, "Nice job. Good swings today."

**JOAN:** Where are those notebooks now?

**WILL:** They're hidden. Nobody sees those notebooks. That was between me and me.

**JOAN:** You spend a lot of time with young Giants players. What advice do you give them?

**WILL:** I see guys be so hard on themselves. They're always searching for answers. And sometimes the answers are right there in front of them. They just need to trust themselves. "There's a reason you're in this organization," I tell them. "First, trust what you're being told. Second, don't beat yourself up -- enjoy this ride you're on. Third, always remember this is a game. Have fun." Of course, I say that now. When I was younger, there were times I'd leave the ballpark madder than a hornet.

One more bit of advice I give them: Put the work in. Fifteen or 20 swings in the cage is not going to cut it.

**JOAN:** You played 15 years in the majors. What do you miss most?

**WILL:** The competition. I loved walking up to home plate with the game on the line and figuring out a way to drive in that run. To this day, I still swing a baseball bat -- a lot. I swing twice a week in my garage. I can still hit a baseball -- it's the running part I cannot do. All those years of physical abuse kind of wear you out. I got a titanium hip a few years ago.

**JOAN:** What fills that competitive need now?

**WILL:** I shoot a lot. I've always done that, even when I was playing. I found it helped me with my concentration at the plate.

**JOAN:** What do you know about the game now that you didn't know as a 22-year-old rookie?

**WILL:** How long the season is. This is a 162-game marathon -- I should chill out a little bit. That's what I would tell that younger version of myself. "Don't get so frickin' amped up and wired." I took the 0-for-4s really personal. Krukow and other guys, they were always trying to mellow me out. My emotions would go so high and so low, and my game mirrored that.

In a big situation, sure, get fired up! But over the course of that long haul, don't beat yourself up so bad. Quit the second-guessing and doubting.

**JOAN:** So what do you think you'll be feeling when you take the microphone and you can finally deliver your much-delayed speech?

**WILL:** I do a lot of public speaking, so being out there on the field is going to be awesome! I know the challenge will be to contain my emotions. But the biggest thing is I want to thank everybody. Thank the New Orleans gang, the Mississippi State gang, the Giants, the fans, my San Francisco friends. Believe it not, I'm even going to thank Candlestick! It's going to be pretty special.



## YOUNG POSEY (2008-2009)

Buster Posey's journey to becoming a franchise icon and three-time World Series champion began after being drafted in 2008 when he played 10 games between the Rookie-level AZL Giants and three games for Short-Season Salem-Keizer. It began in earnest in 2009 when the buzzcut young phenom got his first full-season assignment in High-A San Jose. He spent 80 games with the San Jose Giants, hitting .326 with 13 homers before moving up to Triple-A Fresno in mid July. A few short months later, Posey was making his Major League debut on September 11 vs. the Dodgers.



## 2010

The year began with Posey back in Triple-A but after 47 games it was time for the franchise's catcher of the future to take over in the present. Posey was called up on May 29 and never looked back. He went on to hit .305 with 18 homers, 23 doubles, 67 RBI and an .862 OPS over 108 games after being called up en route to winning the National League Rookie of the Year award. Posey beat out Atlanta's Jason Heyward and the Cardinals Jaime Garcia. That, however, was just the beginning for Posey as he embarked on his first postseason with the Giants that eventually ended in the first World Series title in San Francisco Giants history. In the postseason that year, Posey hit .288 with three doubles, one homer and five RBI while piloting the Giants pitching staff to a 2.47 postseason ERA.



## 2012


After losing much of the 2011 season due to injury, Posey bounced back in 2012 to take his place as one of the best players in the game. Fresh off the injury, Posey returned to play in 148 games and be named the National League's MVP after hitting .336 with a career-best 39 doubles, 24 home runs, 103 RBI and a .957 OPS. His .336 average won him the National League's batting title and he was named the Comeback Player of the Year. He also made his first All-Star team, grabbed his first Silver Slugger and all of that was just in the regular season. After SF went down 2-0 in the NLDS vs. Cincinnati they roared back to even the series to force a game five in Cincy. Leading 2-0 in the 5th inning, Posey's grand slam made it 6-0 and helped give SF enough cushion to survive and advance. Posey and the Giants outlasted the Cardinals in the NLCS before sweeping the Tigers in the World Series for their second title in three years.

## 2014

The two-time All-Star embarked on his fifth full Major League season and continued to be one of the game's best players. He batted .311 with 28 doubles, 22 homers, 89 RBI and an .854 OPS in 147 games while winning his second career Silver Slugger award. Posey also finished sixth in the NL MVP voting. He and the Giants once again ran the table in the postseason, advancing to yet another World Series and claiming their third title in five years by defeating the Kansas City Royals in seven games. In Game 2 of the NLDS, it was Posey's hit in the 9th inning off Drew Storen that moved Joe Panik into scoring position, allowing him to score on the very next play when Pablo Sandoval sliced a double to tie the game. Posey caught all 18 innings in that marathon which the Giants won, 2-1. All told, Posey helped pilot the pitching staff to a 2.87 team ERA in those 17 postseason games that also included three more shutouts on Posey's ledger. By the time Posey hung them up after the 2021 season, he'd caught 14 of the Giants 27 postseason shutouts all-time. Posey's 14 career shutouts caught in the postseason are the most by any catcher all-time.

## 2015-2019

Posey maintained his All-Star level of play, earning trips back to the Midsummer Classic in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 to give him six All-Star nods in his career up to that point. He was named the NL's Silver Slugger Award winner at catcher in 2015 after hitting .318 with 28 doubles, 19 homers, 95 RBI and an .849 OPS in a career-best 150 games. He finished ninth in the MVP voting that year as well. In 2016, Posey garnered his only career Gold Glove Award win and was one of a trio of Giants to take home Gold Glove honors that year. Posey and the Giants also tried to re-kindle some even-year magic in the postseason, defeating the Mets in the Wild Card Game before falling to the eventual World Champion Cubs in the NLDS. He grabbed another Silver Slugger in 2017 after posting an .861 OPS in 140 games. Posey only played in 105 games in 2018 after undergoing right hip surgery in late August. He logged 114 games in 2019 in his first year back from the surgery.

## GOING OUT ON TOP

He opted out of the shortened 2020 campaign after he and his wife had adopted baby twin girls in July amid the Covid-19 pandemic. He returned in 2021 and once again was a force both in the lineup and behind the plate in what turned out to be his final season. Posey homered on Opening Day, setting the tone for his comeback tour that saw him hit .304 with 23 doubles, 18 homers (his highest total since 2015), 56 RBI and an .889 OPS in 113 games. He was named an All-Star for the seventh and final time in his career while also winning his fifth Silver Slugger award. In the postseason, Posey once again got the party started with an opposite field homer off the Dodgers Walker Buehler in Game 1 of the NLDS that might have reached McCovey Cove had it not hit one of the water cannon towers on its way down. In the five-game series, he went 6-for-20 with three extra-base hits and two RBI. Behind the dish, he caught two more postseason shutouts, bringing his career total to 14, the most by any catcher all-time.





During his 12-year career Posey's accolades at the plate and behind the dish earned him a plethora of awards and accolades: three World Series titles, an MVP award, a Rookie of the Year award, seven All-Star selections, a batting title, five Silver Slugger awards, a Gold Glove award and two Comeback Player of the Year awards. However, Posey also became synonymous for giving out an award of his own during his career: a Buster Hug. Loosely defined as "an embrace from Gerald Dempsey "Buster" Posey III after a monumental moment in baseball history" there were countless Buster Hugs over the course of his 12-year career. Matt Cain was the recipient of one after he threw the Giants first-ever Perfect Game in 2012. Tim Lincecum and Chris Heston each got one after their first career no-hitters in 2013 and 2015, respectively. Brian Wilson, Sergio Romo and Madison Bumgarner all got their fair share of them too. The last one ever handed out went to Dominic Leone, who recorded the final out on the final day of the 2021 regular season as the Giants clinched the NL West title.



Off the field, Kristen and Buster Posey committed their unwavering support to finding better treatments and cures for pediatric cancer. In 2016, the Poseys established BP28 with a commitment to stand with those families affected by pediatric cancer and focus on awareness, fundraising and patient/family support. BP28 raised more than \$5.5 million during an annual event at Oracle Park with all proceeds going directly to pediatric research and treatment. BP28 beneficiaries include The Posey Family Fellowship in Pediatric Oncology and the Posey Family Pediatric Oncology Research Grants at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospitals; Cannonball Kids cancer Foundation; Texas Children's Hospital; and The V Foundation. The Poseys also regularly hosted pediatric cancer patients and their families at Oracle Park and made regular visits to UCSF Benioff Children's Hospitals, Family House, and other Bay Area hospitals treating children with cancer. In addition to his work with BP28, Posey served as the Junior Giants Commissioner for most of his playing career and as a supporter of the Giants Community Fund, most notably hosting a Glove Giveaway each season and contributing to the Fund's mission of using baseball and softball to promote health, education and character development for youth in underserved communities.

## GREG JOHNSON



# EXECUTIVE BIOS



## LARRY BAER

### President and Chief Executive Officer

A fourth generation San Franciscan, Larry Baer has gained a national reputation as one of professional sports' leading visionaries. Baer joined the team in 1992 as the Executive Vice President after he and Peter Magowan led the effort to assemble a new ownership group that kept the Giants in San Francisco. A limited partner and

board member of the ownership group, Baer was named CEO on January 1, 2012. In his first year as president and CEO, the Giants won their second World Series Championship in three years. In 2014, the Giants won their third World Series title in five years. In 2021, the Giants won an all-time franchise record 107 games and the National League West title.

Baer is responsible for the overall day-to-day operations of the organization. Under his direction the Giants developed and constructed Oracle Park -- the first privately-financed Major League ballpark. Since opening in 2000, Oracle Park has been widely praised as one of the "best ballparks ever built." In 2008, Oracle Park was named *Sports Business Journal's* Sports Facility of the Year, and in 2011 the Giants received *Sports Business Journal's* Professional Sports Organization of the Year award. The Giants enjoyed a National League home record sellout streak of 530 games spanning six seasons from 2011 – 2016.

Baer also serves as a key strategist and negotiator of the club's major transactions. This includes the Barry Bonds signing in November 1992, the naming rights agreement with AT&T (then Pacific Bell) in 1996, the naming rights agreement with Oracle in 2019 and other strategic partnerships. He led the effort to host the 2007 All-Star Game in San Francisco and was the driving force behind the Giants partnership with Comcast to create the NBC Sports Bay Area regional sports network.

Baer also serves as Chairman and CEO of Giants Development Services, which currently has under construction Mission Rock – a new, mixed use urban neighborhood located on a 28-acre site across McCovey Cove from Oracle Park. Once completed, Mission Rock will include more than eight acres of parks and open space, 1,500 residential units, approximately 1.3 million square feet of office space (including the world headquarters of Visa, Inc.), a parking structure to serve ballpark and Mission Rock patrons, and 250,000 square feet of retail, restaurants, and public amenities.

In 2021, Baer helped launch and was named Co-Chair of "Advance SF"—a coalition of San Francisco CEO's and business leaders committed to addressing community needs made more acute during the pandemic. In January 2022, Baer joined the Advisory Board of the American Journalism Project, based in New York City.

Baer has served on numerous Major League Baseball Boards including Chairing the Strategic Planning Committee, the Business and Media Board and the International Committee. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Council, NBC Sports Bay Area and is a member of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America Pacific Region Board of Trustees. He is an immediate past governing board member of the United States Holocaust Memorial Council, appointed by President Barack Obama in 2016.

A graduate of UC Berkeley and Harvard Business School, Baer previously worked in the media industry for Westinghouse Broadcasting and CBS, Inc. At CBS, Baer was Special Assistant to Chairman Laurence Tisch. Baer has been the recipient of prestigious awards throughout his career with the Giants. In 2010, Baer was the named the "Person of the Year" by San Francisco Boys and Girls Clubs, and in 2012 he was honored as the Harvard Business School's "Alumnus of the Year." In 2014, Baer was honored by the University of California, Berkeley with its "Excellence in Achievement" award and received the Civic Leadership Award from the American Jewish Committee. Baer and his wife Pam Co-Chaired the Campaign To Rebuild San Francisco General Hospital which was successfully completed in 2016.

Baer and his wife, Pam, reside in San Francisco and have four children.



# EXECUTIVE BIOS



## FARHAN ZAIDI

### President of Baseball Operations

Farhan Zaidi enters his fourth season as the President of Baseball Operations for the Giants, joining the organization on November 6, 2018. In his third season at the helm, the team clinched the NL West and the top record in Major League Baseball, finishing the year with a 107-55 record, the best regular season in franchise

history - spanning 139 regular seasons of play - surpassing the 1904 New York Giants (106-47-5).

Among the moves that Zaidi and the front office made in 2021 were signing free agent starting pitchers Kevin Gausman (2021 All-Star), Anthony DeSclafani (13 wins) and Alex Wood (3.83 ERA); making key additions to the bullpen in Jake McGee (31 saves), Dominic Leone (1.51 ERA), Jose Alvarez (2.37 ERA) and Zack Littell (2.92 ERA); trading for four-time All-Star Kris Bryant at the trade deadline; and welcoming 2021 Willie Mac Award winner LaMonte Wade Jr. (18 homers, 56 RBI) to the organization in a trade with the Twins last February. Following the season, Zaidi was named MLB's 2021 Executive of the Year along with being named the MLB Executive of the Year by *Baseball America*. The organization also enjoyed success at the minor league level, with the Low-A San Jose Giants and the High-A Eugene Emeralds each winning their league championships.

In his second year with the Giants in 2020, the team finished one win away from their first playoff berth since 2016. The Giants posted the sixth-best winning percentage among all big-league teams from mid-August on and enjoyed strong campaigns from Zaidi acquisitions Alex Dickerson, Mauricio Dubón, Wilmer Flores, Darin Ruf, Donovan Solano, and Mike Yastrzemski on the offensive side and Jarlin García, Kevin Gausman, and Drew Smyly on the pitching staff.

In Zaidi's first season with the organization in 2019, the Giants won 77 games, a 4-game improvement over 2018, and the farm system had an overall win-loss record of 415-401 (.509), the 11th-best winning percentage of all organizations, a 15-place improvement from the 2018 ranking. Five of seven Giants' stateside affiliates reached the playoffs in 2019, with Sacramento winning the Triple-A National Championship.

Prior to joining the Giants, Zaidi spent four years as the Los Angeles Dodgers' General Manager, joining the club in November 2014. Working alongside President of Baseball Operations Andrew Friedman, Zaidi helped pilot the Dodgers to four consecutive division titles while advancing to the National League Championship Series from 2016-18, and the World Series from 2017-18. The Dodgers posted one of the best seasons in club history in 2017, when the team established a Los Angeles record with a MLB-best 104 wins

and won the National League pennant, earning recognition from *Baseball America* as its Organization of the Year. Los Angeles posted the second-best winning percentage in all of baseball (.584, 379-270) during Zaidi's four-year stint.

Zaidi began his career with the Oakland A's, where he spent 10 seasons from 2005-2014. He began as a baseball operations analyst before being promoted to Director of Baseball Operations in 2009 and Assistant General Manager/Director of Baseball Operations in 2014. During Zaidi's tenure with the A's, the team reached the postseason four times, including three straight seasons from 2012-14.

Before entering baseball, Zaidi served as business development associate for Small World Media, the fantasy sports division of The Sporting News, and worked as a management consultant for the Boston Consulting Group. Zaidi earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1998. While at MIT, he was named a Burchard Scholar and elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He completed his Ph.D in Economics from the University of California, Berkeley in 2011.



## SCOTT HARRIS

### General Manager

Scott Harris is in his third season as the General Manager for the Giants, joining the organization on November 10, 2019. In his first two seasons as the GM, the Giants have posted the third-best winning percentage in MLB at .613 (136-86). Only the Dodgers (149-73, .671) and Rays (140-82, .631) have a higher mark in that span.


Harris is the ninth person to hold the title of General Manager for the Giants since the team moved to San Francisco in 1958, joining Chub Feeney (1947-1969), Horace Stoneham (1970-1975), Spec Richardson (1976-1981), Tom Haller (1981-1985), Al Rosen (1986-1992), Bob Quinn (1993-1996), Brian Sabean (1996-2015) and Bobby Evans (2015-2018).

Prior to joining the Giants, Harris spent seven years working in the Chicago Cubs' Baseball Operations department, most recently serving as Assistant General Manager. Under Cubs President Theo Epstein and GM Jed Hoyer, he assisted in all potential player acquisitions, contract and trade negotiations, and player evaluations while overseeing several departments including research and development and high performance.

During his stint in Chicago, the Cubs reached the postseason in four consecutive seasons from 2015-2018 and ended a 108-year World Series drought by beating the Cleveland Indians in 2016.

Harris started with the Cubs in 2012 as Director of Baseball Operations after serving two years at Major League Baseball as the league's Coordinator of Major League Operations. With Major League Baseball, he provided transaction support and analysis to all 30 clubs and worked on the First-Year Player Draft, the Rule 5 Draft, the World Baseball Classic and various industry studies within the league office. Harris also worked for the Washington Nationals in 2008 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2010.

A native of Redwood City, California, Harris attended Columbia Business School while working at Major League Baseball and later transferred to Northwestern's Kellogg School of Management to complete his MBA in 2015. He also graduated from UCLA in 2009 with a Bachelor's Degree in Economics and studied at the London School of Economics in 2007.
