FRED ZOLLNER -- BASKETBALL PIONEER

Detroit Pistons President Fred Zollner is one of the pioneers of major league basketball, organizing his first professional team in 1941 as an entry in the National Basketball League.

Success on the basketball floor was not long in coming to the president of the Fort Wayne piston-manufacturing corporation that bears his name. Bolstered by such stars as Bobby McDermott, Paul Birch and Buddy Jeanette (formerly of the Detroit Eagles), the Pistons won the National Basketball League championship four straight years (1943 through '46) and captured three world tournaments (1944-45-46) in Chicago Stadium, then recognized as the pinnacle of pro cage fame.

Zollner and his Pistons led three other NBL teams into the Basketball Association of America in 1948 and the following year joined the National Basketball Association, an amalgamation of the old NBL and the rival BAA.

In 1954-55, the Pistons won their first Western Division championship even though forced to play all playoff games on neutral or opponents' courts due to the presence of the American Bowling Congress tournament at Fort Wayne Coliseum, then the Pistons' home base. After hurdling Minneapolis in the semi-finals for the divisional flag, the Pistons extended Eastern champion Syracuse to the full seven games before bowing in the title game, 92-91.

The Pistons repeated as Western Division champions in 1955-56 and were beaten in the world championship playoffs by Philadelphia.

Despite two consecutive divisional pennants, attendance at Fort Wayne failed to improve and Zollner decided to move his club to a city with major league standards. He decided to wait, however, until after the 1956-57 season, which saw the Pistons share first place in the regular season race with St. Louis and Minneapolis, then bow in the first round of the playoffs.

Through his long affiliation with automotive leaders in Detroit, and because of his firm belief that the Motor City is the world's finest sports town, Zollner negotiated to bring the Pistons to Detroit in the spring of 1957.

In the six years the Pistons have played in Detroit, they reached the playoffs each season. Zollner has strived, through rebuilding, to bring the Motor City its first championship in the NBA.

MEET THE COACH

CHARLEY WOLF

There's a saying in sports: "You never know."

How true in the case of Charles Anthony (Charley) Wolf, the new coach of the Detroit Pistons Basketball Club.

It wasn't too many years ago that Wolf's athletic interests leaned in favor of baseball, instead of basketball. The fact is that he dropped out of Notre Dame University in 1947 after one year of varsity competition in basketball and baseball, to sign a professional diamond contract with the Cincinnati Reds.

For the next seven years Wolf roved around the Reds' minor-league system with stops at Ogden, Utah; Columbia, S. C.; Charleston, W. Va.; Saginaw, Mich.; Richmond, Va.; and Scranton, Pa.. He performed at first base most of the time.

By 1954, Wolf could see the handwriting on the wall. His chances of making it to the Reds were virtually nil.

So he dropped out of professional baseball, re-entered college at Xavier University in Cincinnati and then accepted the dual positions of head basketball and baseball coach at Villa Madonna College in his hometown of Covington, Ky. The following year, the chores of athletic director were added to his work load.

Wolf spent six years at Villa Madonna. His basketball teams won 81 and lost 56.

Despite his lack of experience in professional basketball, the Cincinnati Royals picked Wolf as their coach in 1960. He established himself quickly in the rugged National Basketball Association.

His 1960-61 team missed the playoffs by a single game. The following year the Royals jumped into second place in the Western Division with a 43-37 record, a 10-game improvement in the victory column. Last winter the Royals took third in the Eastern Division with a 42-38 record, then ousted Syracuse in the semifinals and battled the world champion Boston Celtics through seven games before falling in the Eastern Division finals.

Wolf is acknowledged as one of the finest fast-break coaches in the game today. Under Wolf the Royals set a league record for field goal proficiency in 1961-62 with a .452 average and then broke it last year with a .459 mark.

He's a graduate of Xavier University and helps operate an insurance business in the off season. Wolf's wife, Lorraine, was a former television actress in Cincinnati. They have three boys: Martin 6, Stephen 3 and Gregory, six-months.

RETURNING VETERANS

DAVE DE BUSSCHERE: Forward-Guard, 6'6", 220. Born 10-14-40. Lives in Detroit, Mich. Graduated from University of Detroit where he re-wrote the Titans' scoring and rebounding records. Totalled 1,985 points and 1,552 rebounds at U. of D. Had great rookie season with Pistons last season, averaging 12.7 points and grabbing 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ points (third high on team). Started with Pistons at Forward, but after he moved to guard in late November, Pistons played at better than .500 clip. He's slated to be back at forward slot this season. Called by then coach Dick McGuire as "Pistons best player" during the final third of the 1962-63 season. Pitcher for the Chicago White Sox during the 1963 season after receiving bonus of upwards of \$60,000 from the Chisox in spring of 1962. Product of Detroit Austin High where he scored 1800 points in three seasons and won All-City, All-State and All America honors. Brilliant golfer. Single.

HIGH GAME IN NBA: 31 - San Francisco at New York, 3-5-63

JOHN EGAN: Guard, 6', 170. Born 1-31-39. Lives in Hartford, Conn. Graduate of Providence College. Smashed all of the school's scoring records with three-season total of 1,434 points on averages of 20.9, 12.2 and 18.8 points. Second draft pick of the Pistons in 1961 and became "darling" of Pistons fans with his razzle-dazzle play. Averaged only 5.5 points as rookie, but sparked team in the playoffs. Got chance as starter last season, but failed to make the grade. Spent virtually all of final two-thirds of the season on the bench. Single.

BOB FERRY: Center, 6'8", 230. Born 5-5-37. Lives in St. Louis, Missouri. Graduated from St. Louis University, winning All America honors as junior and senior. Originally drafted by St. Louis Hawks in NBA. Came to Pistons in trade for Ed Conlin in 1960. Deadly shooter from the outside. Became regular at the one-quarter mark last season and helped tremendously in the Pistons comeback in which they played at better than .500 clip from Dec. 1 on. Has scored in double figures in three seasons with Pistons. Being counted upon for starting role again this season. Married: Has daughter and son. Known as the "Big Flipper."

BAILEY HOWELL: Forward, 6'7", 215. Born 1-20-37. Lives in State College, Miss. Graduated from Mississippi State, 1959. First draft choice of Pistons in 1959. Starting his fifth season with Pistons. Compiled best rookie record in Pistons' history with 1,332 points for a 17.8 average and 790 rebounds. Has led the Pistons in scoring and rebounding in each of his last three seasons. Set team record for rebounds with 1,111 in 1960-61. Annually one of the best shooters in the NBA. Broke Southeastern Conference records, set earlier by Bob Pettit, with three year totals of 647-695-688 for 2,939 total. Unanimous All America in 1958 and 1959. On NBA All Stars for last three seasons. Sells insurance during off season. Married and has two daughters.

Was fifth-round draft choice of Pistons in 1960. Injury idled him most of rookie year. Flashy play makes him very popular with fans. Known as a "take-charge" player. Frequently has turned the tide of a game by floor length drives. Scoring average has improved with each season on Pistons. Married. Nicknamed "The Bird."

RAY SCOTT: Forward, 6'9", 215. Born 7-12-38. Lives in Philadelphia, Pa., where he works during off seasons for welfare department to help rehabilitate youngsters from broken homes. Attended Portland University for one year and a half. Then played three seasons with Allentown Jets in Eastern League until drafted by Pistons in 1961. Averaged 21.2, 23.8 and 33.8 points for Allentown. Ranked third in scoring and second in rebounding on Pistons last season. Helps to give Pistons one of strongest front lines in NBA. EDDIE MILES: Guard, 6'4", 196. Born 7-5-40. Known as "The Man with the Golden Arm," Miles figures prominently in the Pistons' plans for 1963-64. Showed he's not only a brilliant shooter during the Pistons' summer camp, but also excited Coach Wolf with his playmaking and passing ability. Hails originally from North Little Rock High; gained All America ranks in his junior and senior seasons when he averaged 30 and 33 points, respectively. Set Seattle U. freshman scoring record with 27.6-point average. Tallied at 21.3, 22.3 and 25.8 clips during three seasons on Seattle varsity. He was seventh high in nation last season. Exceptional on shots from 20-30 feet out. Popped in 10 out of 14 jumpers against Oregon State in NCAA tourney in 1962. Married, father of two children with third due this fall.

GARY SILC: Forward, 6'7", 225. Born 9-20-40. First Canadian ever drafted by the Detroit Pistons and could be the first from across the border to win a job on an NBA team. Played high school basketball in Sudbury, Ont., where his team won the Provincial (our state) title for two years. Went from there to San Fernando State (Calif.) College, before enrolling at Northern Michigan where he became eligible for final eight games in 1961-62. Averaged 18.8 points that season and 16.6 last winter along with almost 10 rebounds. Voted Most Valuable Player at Northern at senior, also on first Michigan NAIA team and was mentioned on NAIA Little All American selections.

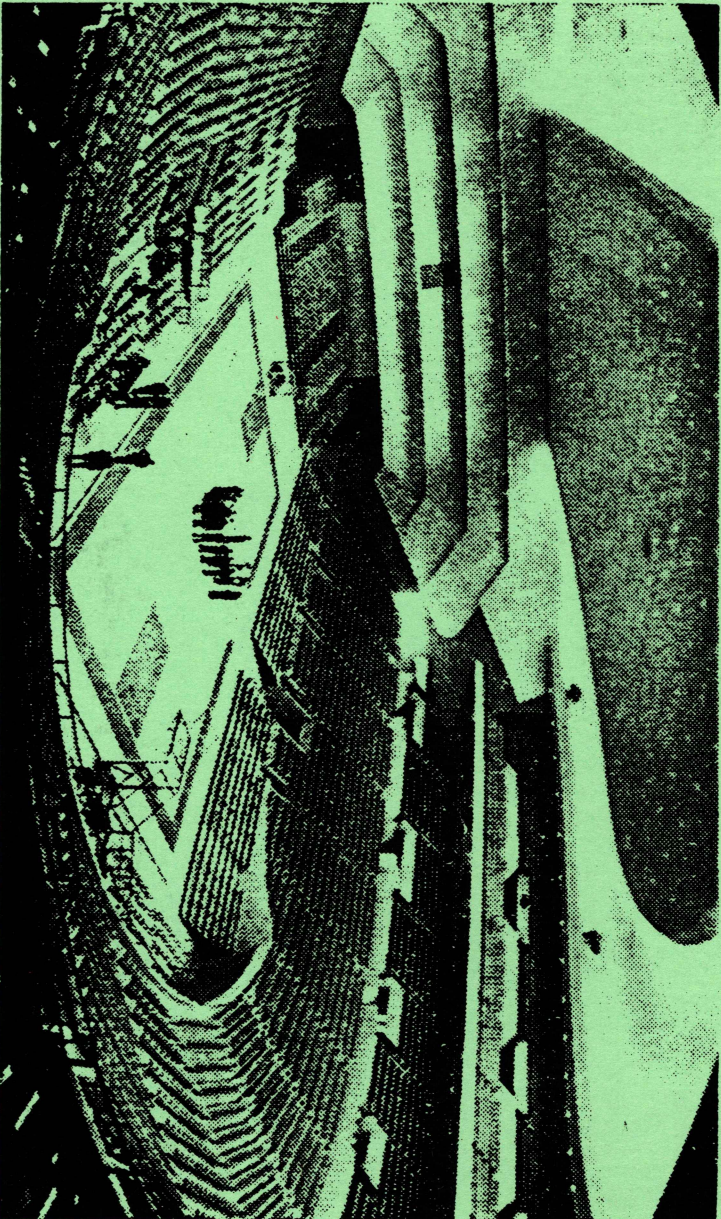
