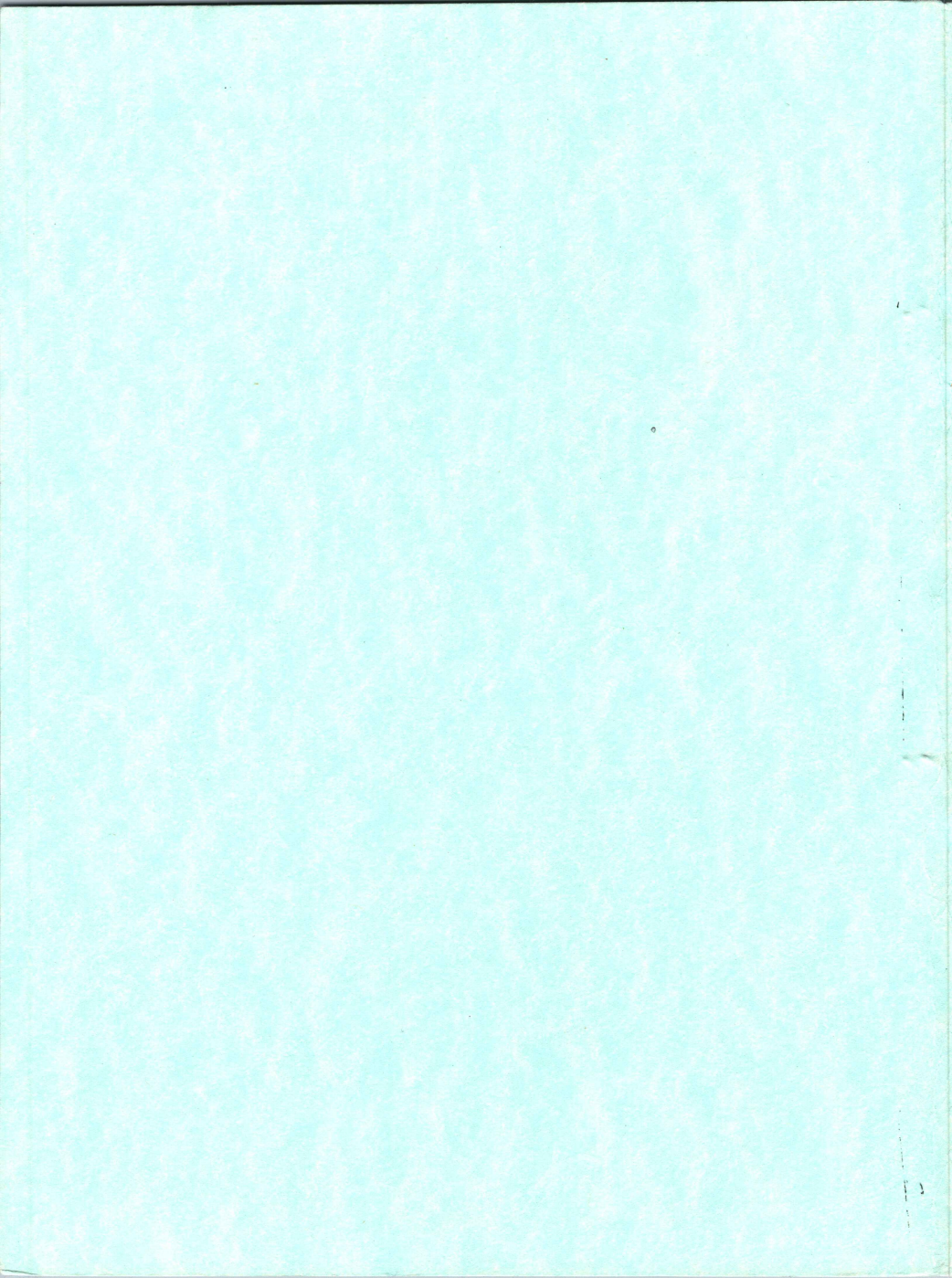

## "1964-65 OUTLOOK"

---

Only one player remains from last year's opening day lineup. The Pistons will definitely sport the "new" look. The "new" look is designed for speed, aggressiveness, versatility and a playoff berth.

The speed centers around our new men. Joe Caldwell, our top draft choice, and the three men acquired in our trade with Baltimore, Dischinger, Kojis and Thorn, all can run and are good fast-break men.

Donnis Butcher leads the way in aggressiveness. He will be aided in this area by a determined, ever-improving Ray Scott, an inspiring Dave DeBusschere, hustling Jackie Moreland and newcomer Hub Reed.

Our versatility lies in DeBusschere, Dischinger, Kojis and Caldwell who can play either Forward or Guard and in Scott and Reed who can play Center or Forward.

All of this adds up to a playoff spot if we can: 1. Get the ball off the board and, 2. Tighten up the defense. Reggie Harding's development can really give us a lift in both areas. At times last year he showed it could be done. If done consistently we could become a contender.

Dischinger could become the finest all-around star in the League. Thorn should be the "take charge" leader of the fast-break that we have sought. Scott should be the steady, dependable, clutch performer of last season and Harding could be one of the top rebounders and shot-blockers in the National Basketball Association.

There are a few "if's" but if some come through, we'll make the playoff and if most come through, we could battle it out for the top spot.

Any team can win in the Western Division because of the balance and it might well be the team that jumps off to a good start.

Boston, with Russell, is the team to beat in the East, but Cincinnati might easily overtake them. New York has some fine young talent and just might finish ahead of Philadelphia, particularly if the 76'ers continue to be plagued with injuries.

It should be an interesting National Basketball Association season with exciting basketball every game.

FRED ZOLLNER

BASKETBALL PIONEER

Detroit Pistons' President Fred Zollner is one of the pioneers of major league basketball, organizing his first professional team in 1941 as an entry in the National Basketball League.

Success on the basketball floor was not long in coming to the president of the Fort Wayne piston-manufacturing corporation that bears his name. Bolstered by such stars as Bobby McDermott, Paul Birch and Buddy Jeanette (formerly of the Detroit Eagles and new coach of the Baltimore Bullets), the Pistons won the National Basketball League championship four straight years (1943 through 1946) and captured three world tournaments (1944-45-46) in Chicago Stadium, then recognized as the pinnacle of pro cage fame.

Zollner and his Pistons led three other N.B.L. teams into the Basketball Association of America in 1948 and the following year joined the National Basketball Association, an amalgamation of the old N.B.L. and the rival B.A.A.

In 1954-55, the Pistons won their first Western Division championship even though forced to play all playoff games on neutral or opponents' courts due to the presence of the American Bowling Congress tournament at Fort Wayne Coliseum, then the Pistons' home base. After hurdling Minneapolis in the semi-finals for the divisional flag, the Pistons extended Eastern Champion Syracuse to the full seven games before bowing in the title game, 92-91.

The Pistons repeated as Western Division Champions in 1955-56 and were beaten in the world championship playoffs by Philadelphia.

Despite two consecutive divisional pennants, attendance at Fort Wayne failed to improve and Zollner decided to move his club to a city with major league standards. He decided to wait, however, until after the 1956-57 season, which saw the Pistons share first place in the regular season race with St. Louis and Minneapolis, then bow in the first round of the playoffs.

Through his long affiliation with automotive leaders in Detroit, and because of his firm belief that the Motor City is the world's finest sports town, Zollner negotiated to bring the Pistons to Detroit in the spring of 1957.

In the seven years the Pistons have played in Detroit, they have reached the playoffs six times. Zollner has strived, through rebuilding, to bring the Motor City its first championship in the National Basketball Association.

COACH CHARLEY WOLF

Just how the wheel of life will turn and where it will stop, nobody knows. Take the case of Charley Wolf, coach of the Detroit Pistons Basketball Club. Back in 1947, when Wolf was a student at the University of Notre Dame, he would have told me that his aspirations in professional sports rested with baseball.

The fact is, Wolf dropped out of Notre Dame to sign with the Cincinnati Reds. For seven years he roved around the Reds' farm chain. He literally saw the country with stops at Ogden, Utah; Columbia, S.C.; Charleston, W. Va.; Saginaw, Mich.; Richmond, Va., and Scranton, Pa. He played first base most of the time.

By 1954, Wolf could see the handwriting on the wall. His chances of making it with the Reds were virtually nil. So he dropped out of baseball, re-entered college at Xavier University in Cincinnati.

Wolf then accepted the dual positions of head basketball and baseball coach at Villa Madonna College in his hometown of Covington, Kentucky. The following year the chores of athletic director were added to his work load. Wolf spent six years at Villa Madonna, with his basketball teams winning 81 and losing 56.

In 1960, the Cincinnati Royals of the National Basketball Association hired Wolf as their coach. The Royals missed the playoffs in Wolf's first year by one game. The following year, the Royals jumped to second place with a 43-37 record. In 1962-63 the Royals won 42, lost 38, then ousted Syracuse to gain the Eastern Division finals against the Boston Celtics. A seven-game battle ensued before the Celtics conquered the Royals,

With the Pistons last season, Wolf had his problems. A siege of injuries which hit all but one regular, resulted in the Pistons failing to make the playoffs.

In the off-season, however, Wolf has rebuilt the Pistons and is confident the Club will rebound in 1964-65.

His wife, Loraine, was a former television actress in Cincinnati and they have three sons.

DONNIS BUTCHER

Donnis hails from Pikeville College (Kentucky). He stands 6'3, weighs 200. Age 28. He is starting his third year in the NBA. Donnis is described by Coach Wolf as the "hard-nosed" type. Very solid on defense and a fine playmaker. He has the knack of coming off the bench and sparking a rally. He was an original draft choice of the New York Knickerbockers for whom he played two seasons before coming to the Pistons last December. Donnis shared the Pistons' assist lead last season with Ray Scott. Married with two children.

DAVE DE BUSSCHERE

Dave hails from the University of Detroit. Stands 6'6, weighs 220 - age 24. Dave is starting his third season in the National Basketball Association. He had a brilliant rookie season in 1962-63 with the Pistons averaging 12.7 points and snaring 69.4 rebounds. A fractured ankle kept him sidelined in all but fifteen of the Pistons games last season. Coach Charley Wolf is expecting DeBusschere to figure prominently in rebuilding of the Pistons for 1964-65. DeBusschere gained All-American honors at University of Detroit, twice leading Titans to NIT playoffs, once to the NCAA. He received upwards of \$75,000 for signing as pitcher with the Chicago White Sox. Dave has spent this season with the Chisox' top farm team at Indianapolis, Indiana in the Pacific Coast League. He was great at Detroit's Austin High School in basketball and baseball before entering U of D., where he also pitched the Titans into the NCAA playoffs three years running. Single. TERRY DISCHINGER

Terry hails from Purdue University. He stands 6'7, weighs 205 - Age 24. He is starting his third season in the NBA. Dischinger came to Pistons in off-season deal with Rod Thorn and Don Kojis from Baltimore in exchange for Bailey Howell, Don Ohl, Bob Ferry, Leslie Hunter and Wally Jones. He was three-time All-American at Purdue and played on 1960 U. S. Olympic team. In first NBA year he was voted as "Rookie-of-the-Year" (1962-63) and averaged 25.5. first season; 20.8 in second year as pro after smashing most of the Big Ten's and Purdue's scoring records. Terry is a fine rebounder and also a good play-maker. Among NBA's top field-goal percentage shooters, hitting at 50 percent clip. He specializes in fast break which is bound to help the Pistons in their fight back to a playoff spot in the Western Division. Regularly shoots in 80's on golf links. Married, two children.

Bob hails from Colgate University. He stands 6'3, weighs 185 - Age 25. He is starting his third season in the N.B.A. Has seen only sparing action as a pro. He originally broke in with the St. Louis Hawks who shipped him to New York at start of last season. The Pistons obtained him last December from New York. Bob is rated as a player with "fine pro potential." Fast dribbler and playmaker. Scored 1,591 points in 70 games at Colgate. Hit for 26.6 average as senior. Bob now makes his home in Detroit where he is in insurance business with Jackie Moreland. Married and expecting first child in January.

Reggie hails from Detroit. He stands 7'0, weighs 245 pounds - age 24. He is the only present player in the N.B.A. with no collegiate background. Reggie joined the Pistons in mid-season during 1963-64 and came on strong averaging eleven points per game and just over ten rebounds. He is rated as a fine pro prospect and a good man on the fast break. Figures highly in the Pistons' future. Harding starred at Detroit's Eastern High, gaining all-city and allstate and all-american prep honors. Married - two children.

Willie is one of the all-time greats at Northwestern University where he played forward, center and guard. He lives in Chicago where he teaches school in the off-season. Married, one son.

Don is starting his second year in the N.B.A. He played with the Philips Oilers in the AAU for two years before joining the Baltimore Bullets last season. He came to Detroit during summer in the big "three-for-five" deal. Don was used as a reserve by the Bullets last season, averaging 6.3 points and just under five rebounds. Strong-type player who should fortify the Pistons' front-line. Don was the highest scoring player in Marquette University history. He is a native of Milwaukee. Single.

He is starting his second year in the N.B.A. He has been used only in reserve role by the Pistons last season, averaging 5.4 points. Eddie was bothered by foot trouble as a rookie but has since undergone surgery and figures to be of greater service to the Pistons in 1964-65. Jackie hails from Louisiana Tech. He stands 6'7, weighs 215 - Age 26. Jack is starting his fifth season in the N.B.A., all with the Pistons. He is highly rated by Coach Charley Wolf. Jack is a fine fast-break operator, who is adept at coming off the bench and giving a strong performance for eight to ten minutes. His average has swelled with each season in the NBA. Made Small-College All-American while at Louisiana Tech. Moreland scored 5030 points in 3-1/2 seasons as high school player in Minden, Louisiana and is primarily a left-handed shooter. He now makes his home in Detroit where he operates a very successful insurance business. Married, one daughter.

HUB REED

Hub hails from Oklahoma City University. He stands 6'0, weighs 220 - Age 27. He is starting his seventh season with the NBA and his fourth team. He broke in originally with the St. Louis Hawks - then went to Cincinnati and Los Angeles before coming to Detroit last April to complete earlier trade in which Detroit gave up Johnny Egan and Larry Staverman for Donnis Butcher, Bob Duffy and a third player to be named later. Reed performed under Pistons' Coach Charley Wolf at Cincinnati and proved a valuable back-up man at Center with the Royals. He is destined for the same role with the Pistons. Hub has averaged 5.9 points and almost as many rebounds as a pro. Defense is his strong suit. Married.

RAY SCOTT

Ray hails from Portland University. He stands 6'9, weighs 215 - Age 26. Ray is starting his fourth season in the N.B.A., all with the Pistons. He was the most valuable performer on the team last season, pacing the Club in rebounding. Ray also shared assists lead with Donnis Butcher. Scott attended Portland University for a year and a half, then starred for three seasons with the Allentown (Pa.) Jets in the Eastern League before being drafted by the Pistons. He is a durable performer, only Piston to appear in all 80 of the team's games last season. Ray was second in scoring with 17.6 point average to bring his N.B.A. average to 15.7. He enjoys working with youngsters in the off-season. Spent five weeks this summer at Pistons' camp in Caro, Michigan. Hometown is in Philadelphia where he works with juvenile authorities to care for boys from broken homes.
