Larry Costello, from the Syracuse suburb of Minoa, joins the Nats roster after two years of N. B. A. experience with the Philadelphia Warriors. A sharp-looking rookie, Costello was called to Army service after only 19 contests in 1954-55, but returned to the 1956-57 edition of the Warriors to rank as their fifth scorer in registering 547 points and 236 assists. Just topping 6' by 1/2", Larry is expected to bolster Coach Paul Seymour's backcourt strength with his speed and defensive ability. Regarded by many as the top set-shot in the game today, Costello should develop into one of the community-owned Nats' most popular as well as most valuable addition.

Bianchi came to Syracuse after a tryout with the Minneapolis Lakers and found that his flashy type play was much more suitable to the Nats. A natural fast break artist, Al improved greatly during his rookie season and appears to be headed for more service this year. He appeared in 68 games in 1956-57 and averaged 8.3 points per game for a total output of 563 markers. A favorite of the fans, Al adds color to his backcourt play while giving the opposition lots of trouble with good outside shooting and driving.

A high school teammate of Coach Paul Seymour, "Tiger" starred with the Minneapolis Lakers for several seasons before going to the Hawks. Especially effective as an outside shooter, he scored 579 points in 66 games for Syracuse last year, and served as field general during his time on the court. Also a good man on defense, Harrison gave the Nats a balance of experience and is counted on heavily this season

DICK GAINES

A first-year N. B. A. performer, Brooklynite Dick Gaines was a Nats draft selection after All-American designation at Seton Hall. He averaged 19.6 points per game for the Pirates, and in his senior year racked up 570 points, to give him a 21.0 point average in his last campaign in intercollegiate basketball.

Big Dolph is starting his 10th year as a pro with an impressive record. Last year he passed the 10,000 mark in lifetime scoring while leading the Nats in almost all departments. In league standings he was third in scoring with a 22.5 per game average, and second in free throw percentage with .9045. He dunked 625 free throws for an NBA season record in most charity tosses, and finished third in rebounding with 1008. Perennially a first team All-League selection, Dolph is a versatile scorer since he can shoot with either hand, two-handed, or drive with equal ease.

TEAM HISTORY

The 1956-57 season marks the 11th consecutive year that Syracuse has been represented by a professional basketball team, and the history of that team speaks well for the future of the game in Central New York.

The Nats had their start in the summer of 1946 when Daniel Biasone and several associates organized the Syracuse Professional Basketball Club, Inc. and obtained a franchise in the now-defunct National Basketball League.

Home games were played in the Jefferson Street Armory, but the crowds who watched Coach Benny Borgmann, formerly of the Original Celtics, and his crew were scant, and the hopeful promoters took a bad first year loss.

The 1947-48 campaign saw a strengthening of NBL with Minneapolis and Mikan in the loop, but Syracuse had a bad year, winning only 24 games out of 60 for their poorest record in history. The decline in turnstile counts continued.

To darken an already dismal picture, Rochester, Minneapolis, Fort Wayne, and Indianapolis jumped the NBL in favor of the rival Basketball Association of America after the 1947-48 race.

Club owner Biasone was hard pressed to withdraw from professional basketball at that point, but with encouragement from Ike W. Duffy, then owner of the Anderson club, Danny decided to continue.

His first step was to bring Leo F. Ferris, then executive vice-president of Tri-Cities, to Syracuse to reorganize the Nats. The enterprising Ferris approached a score or more of leading Syracusans and sold 25 shares of stock at \$1,000.00 each.

An extensive publicity and promotional campaign was instituted, home games were transferred to the State Fair Coliseum, and Ferris went after the best talent playing available.

Al Cervi moved from Rochester's BAA club as player-coach and headed a team which included Dolph Schayes, Johnny Macknowski, Billy Gabor, and Ed Peterson. The dismal record of the previous season was erased and the Nats won 40 of 63 contests.

Cervi was named to the NBL's All-League team and was voted coach-of-the year. Schayes won rookie-of-the-year honors. But most significant, attendance at the Coliseum reached an all-time high.

Before the 1949-50 season opened, Ferris engineered the deal which brought the University of Kentucky champions into the League, playing under the Indianapolis banner. With this move the BAA directors decided it was time to join the enemy, and the result was the 17-team National Basketball Association.

That year the Nats hit their zenith as an attraction, with as many as 10,613 jamming the Coliseum to see their favorites win 51 of 64 games for the Eastern Division championship. The World championship eluded them during the playoff with Minneapolis.

The 1950-51 season saw the NBA shaken down to a more sensible structure of 10 teams, but the Nats did not fare so well, winning 32 while losing 34.

The Onondaga County War Memorial opened for the 1951-52 season and the Nats, finishing first in the NBA's Eastern Division, played before a record 221,580, only to lose in the playoffs.

In 1952-53, Syracuse finished in a second place tie with Boston, a deadlock which the Nats won, only to lose the first round playoffs to the same Celtics.

Attendance fell during the campaign, but the Nats management determined to carry on, even in the face of a handsome purchase offer from the same Ike Duffy of Anderson, who hoped to move the Syracuse squad to Chicago.

The Nats finished second again in 1953-54 and swept the post-season round robin play in their Division, only to lose once again the final series with Minneapolis.

Playing the late stages and post-season competition with practically every member of the club in plaster casts or bandages, the spirited Nats drive won them the designation "The Bandaged Brigade."

Once again Syracusans nearly lost their franchise, this time to Detroit interests, but a rallying group of 150 enthusiasts raised \$200,000 in stock sales and purchased the Nationals. Danny Biasone was again active in the drive and was unanimously elected president of the newly-formed corporation.

Midway through the 1954-55 campaign, Ferris stepped down as general manager and Publicity Director Bob Sexton took over the additional duties of business manager.

A thrilling final bid was made by the Nats that season and they brought the first World Championship to Syracuse, defeating Fort Wayne in the final seconds of the seventh game of the championship series.

The World Champions made a valiant effort to retain their title in 1955-56. They finished the season tied with New York for third place, defeated the Knickerbockers in a deadlock-breaking single game, and eliminated the favored Boston Celtics in first round playoffs.

But Philadelphia was the team of destiny in 1955-56, and they took the Eastern Division crown and the World Championship as well.

At the close of league action, the Nats went abroad as good will messengers for the State Department. They traveled 30,000 miles, visiting Iceland, Germany, Iran, Lebanon, Italy, Spain, and Egypt, conducting clinics and playing exhibition games for the Europeans and Middle Easterners.

The 1956-57 season saw many changes in the Nats squad, including one in the coaching position. Al Cervi headed Syracuse in the right direction as the team captured its first three games, but inexperience of a high rookie percentage squad soon told and the Nats lost eight of their next nine contests.

In late November Coach Cervi resigned and was replaced by Co-Capt. Paul Seymour, a star with the team since 1947. Acting as player-coach, Seymour shuffled personnel radically and took a back seat as a player to give his first year men needed experience.

The maneuver paid off, for the Nats charged back from last place to finish second in the Eastern Division with a respectable .528 win-loss percentage, which was also second best in the NBA. After ousting Philadelphia in the Eastern semi-final playoffs, Syracuse yielded to the red-hot Celtics in the finals, but even as losers won the plaudits of the league for their fine comeback.

Coach Seymour's achievement was recognized with the "Coach-of-the-Year" award.
