**SEASON PRESS PASSES:** We will honor all reasonable requests for press passes from recognized newspapers, magazine, radio and television outlets.

**DAILY PRESS PASSES:** Representatives of weekly newspapers and radio stations are asked to request in advance a pass for a specific game. Seats will be provided in the Press Suite or in the Television Suite on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please make all requests at least 48 hours in advance to the Kings public relations office.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Season press passes will be issued to accredited photographers of the major daily newspaper and wire services in the area. Photographers from weekly newspapers and magazines wishing to work a specific game should have their photo editor request a single game pass from the Kings' public relations office.

**COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS:** Complimentary tickets for members of the media are available on a very limited basis. Requests should be made no later than 48 hours in advance of the game. With only a limited number of tickets available, requests should be made as early as possible.

**GAMES SERVICES:** All statistical services, including play-by-play, quarter statistics, flash stats, halftimes and final boxes will be provided to media on press row. Reporters may file their stories from the Kings' press room, located just steps away from press row, and the two teams' locker rooms. There are no telephones available, and media wishing a phone for the season or for a single game should contact the Kings' public relations office.

**FOOD SERVICE:** The Kings are happy to have members of the media as their guests for a pre-game dinner. To be admitted to the press row, the media members must have an NBA pass or a Kings' media pass.

## A BRIEF FRANCHISE HISTORY

The Kansas City Kings are directly descended from one of the charter teams in the National Basketball Association.

1949 - 1957 (9 years) Rochester Royals (NBA Champions in 1951)

1958 - 1972 (15 years) Cincinnati Royals

1973 - 1978 (6 years) Kansas City Kings

1978-79 will be the 31st year of consecutive franchise operation, and the seventh in Kansas City.

The team was moved from Cincinnati to Kansas City in April, 1972. The majority owners were the Jacobs brothers, a prominent Buffalo, New York concession family.

Because of a severe shortage of acceptable playing dates in the Municipal Auditorium, it was necessary to play part of the home schedule in Omaha. This continued through last season.

After the first year in Kansas City, H. Paul Rosenberg, a Kansas City lithographer, put together a group of nine other Kansas Citians and purchased the club for an amount in excess of \$5 million dollars. The other owners included Frank Armanees, Clay Blair, Ray Evans, Herb Jacobson, Leon Karosen, Robert Margolin, Tom Muir, Truman Sloan and Leonard Strauss. This 10-man ownership remains intact today.

The incumbent management team, headed by President and General Manager Joe Axelson, was retained. Rosenberg is Managing Partner and Margolin is General Counsel. Rosenberg, Muir, Evans, Margolin and Axelson comprise the team's executive committee. The 1978-79 season will be Axelson's tenth in the franchise, as it will be for Assistant General Manager Larry Staverman and Comptroller Elise Childers.

During its Kansas City tenure, the best season record has been 44-38 in 1974-75, under Coach Phil Johnson. That team placed second in the Midwest Division, reached the playoffs, and lost four games to two in the first round to division champion Chicago.

Cotton Fitzsimmons, a veteran of seven NBA seasons as head coach at Phoenix (2), Atlanta (4) and Buffalo (1), was named head coach of the Kings, effective July 1, 1978. Fitzsimmons, a native of Hannibal, Missouri, won two National Junior College championships while coaching at Moberly (Mo.) Junior College and one Big Eight title at Kansas State University. During one three-season NBA stretch (1971-72-73), his teams posted a 143-103 mark, .720. His 264 NBA career coaching wins rank him seventh among active coaches, behind Dick Motta (448), Gene Shue (448), Dr. Jack Ramsay (439), Larry Costello (410), Al Attles (387) and Bill Fitch (274).

In 1978-79, 38 of the 41 games will take place in Kansas City. The others will be played in St. Louis' huge Checkerdome.

## LOWELL "COTTON" FITZSIMMONS

On May 10, 1978 the Kansas City Kings announced Cotton Fitzsimmons as the team's new coach. Cotton is a dynamic and tireless individual who knows he has a job to do with the Kings. His enthusiasm and objectivity in analyzing the Kings' problems were the key reasons Joe Axelson and the Board of Directors of the Kings selected him from a field of over 25 candidates who were considered for the job. Seven of those candidates were interviewed for the position and in the final analysis Cotton was selected because of his experience and common sense approach to the Kings' problems.



Cotton's return to the Midwest is a homecoming for him. He was raised in Bowling Green, Mo. and went to junior college at Hannibal-LaGrange (Mo.) where he was an All-American guard and coached at Moberly Junior College where his team had a record of 224-58 over nine years.

Cotton went on to coach one year as an assistant and two years as head coach at Kansas State University and was named Big 8 Coach of the Year when his team, which was picked to finish sixth in the league, won the conference.

In 1970 Cotton joined the NBA and immediately gave the Phoenix Suns their first winning season in the history of the franchise. After two successful seasons he went on to join the Atlanta Hawks and turned them around, posting a 46-36 record after the team had consecutive 36-46 years. In his first three years he won 142 games and had a winning percentage of .581.

The bottom fell out in Cotton's last three seasons in Atlanta. The club underwent drastic changes in the front office and in the ownership group. Cotton coached under four different general managers in three years and to say the least, the talent on the court was not playoff material.

In 1975-76, for the first time in 19 years Cotton was not roaming the sidelines. That's the year he joined the Golden State Warrior staff as head scout and director of player personnel.

He says the lay-off did him good. "That year helped give me an entirely new perspective about the NBA because I had an opportunity to see so many games. I feel I am a better coach because of it."

Happy to be back in coaching, Cotton was hired as head coach of the Buffalo Braves just weeks before the opening of camp. He inherited a team that had only two returning players from the previous year. Injuries and roster changes were an every day occurrence in Buffalo (18 players saw action during the regular season) and after playing .500 ball early in the season, the lack of talent and depth caught up with the team.

Cotton's 264 NBA career coaching wins ranks him seventh among active NBA coaches, behind Dick Motta (448), Gene Shue (448), Dr. Jack Ramsay (439), Larry Costello (410), Al Attles (387) and Bill Fitch (274).

So Cotton is back in the Midwest where he feels he belongs. As Cotton said in his news conference, he hopes his stay with the Kings will be so successful he'll never have to coach another team.

Everyone associated with the Kings; fans, owners, staff and players are hoping for the same thing.

## COTTON'S RECORD

- Moberly (Mo.) Junior College nine seasons: 224 wins and 58 losses, the best record by any coach in the history of the school. Teams won the national junior college championship in 1966 and 67.
- Named National Junior College Coach of the Year in 1966 and 67.
- After one year as assistant to Tex Winter at Kansas State was named head coach. Had 34-20 record at K-State. Prior to the start of the 1969 season the Wildcats were picked to finish sixth in the Big 8 Conference. Won the league with a 20-8 season record. Defeated in the first round of the NCAA playoffs by New Mexico as Sam Lacey hit a 22-footer at the buzzer.
- Was named Big 8 Coach of the Year.
- Named as head coach of the Phoenix Suns.

Led them to 48-34 record and into the playoffs.

- In Cotton's first three seasons he posted 143 victories against 103 defeats. A winning percentage of .581.
- Cotton has an overall coaching record of 522 and 376 losses, a .581 winning percent over 18 years (nine at Moberly, two years at K-State and seven years in the NBA).

## KINGS NAME NEW ASSISTANT COACH FRANK HAMBLÉN

On January 8, 1978 The Kansas City Kings announced the hiring of Frank Hamblen as assistant coach to Kings Head Coach Larry Staverman. Both Staverman and Hamblen were to serve their current capacities until the end of this season.

On June 9, 1978 Kings new Head Coach, Cotton Fitzsimmons named Frank as his permanent assistant coach.

Hamblen brings to the Kings an extensive background in professional basketball as he has coaching and scouting experience in both the ABA and the NBA. Previous to his selection by the Kings Hamblen was scouting on a free lance basis for several NBA teams.

In 1976-77 Hamblen was assistant coach and director of player personnel for the Denver Nuggets. He also served as scout for the Denver Nuggets in 1974-75. He served as assistant coach to Alex Hannum and director of player personnel for the Denver Rockets in 1972-73. He spent three seasons (1969-72) with the San Diego/Houston Rockets as assistant coach and scout.

Hamblen played three years at Syracuse University and was team captain his senior year in 1969.

Frank's enthusiastic manner, strong fundamentals and teaching ability make him a great complement to Cotton and a popular individual with the players.

Lucius Allen, the nine year guard from Wyandotte High School and UCLA will be playing in his second year as a Kansas City King. Lucius has always been a winner dating all the way back to Wyandotte where his teams won two state championships. At UCLA he teamed with Lew Alcindor for two NCAA championships and in 1971 and again in 1974 he played for the World Champion Milwaukee Bucks. In all, Lu has played in 42 playoff games. Perhaps Lu's best game last season was the Kings home opener which was Welcome Back Lucius Night. He scored 30 points, a season high, and was brilliant at both ends of the court. Lu's job last year was not to be the scoring guard but the player who ran the team. Coach Fitzsimmons hopes to see Lucius taking more of a leadership role at the guard position, stressing the team concept, hustle and good defense. Lucius and wife Melanie have two sons, Kahlil, 5½ and Bakir, 3½, and reside in Lee's Summit, Mo. Cotton Fitzsimmons: "Lucius is a player with savvy who can draw on his experience to help lead this team. He should give our young back-court stability and maturity."

Otis Birdsong will be counted on to be among the Kings leading scorers this year. As a matter of fact, Kings General Manager and President Joe Axelson thinks it's possible 'Bird' will be among the top scorers in the league. Last year's scoring average of 15.8 was third on the team, his shooting percent of .492 was second on the team and was one of the highest among guards in the NBA . . . The Bird didn't really get uncoiled until the last 11 games of the season when he became a regular starter. During that period he averaged 24 ppg, and shot .547 from the field. In that string he had a career high 37 points against Los Angeles. The Bird finished fourth in scoring among rookies but was ninth in playing time. The Bird's 1,156 points ranked him fifth among Kings rookies in scoring in the team's 31 year history. Otis was everyone's All-American in college . . . scored 30.3 points per game his senior year, fourth best in the country . . . shot an amazing 56.9% his senior year . . . his 2,132 career points established new Southwestern Conference record . . . career total just 52 points shy of Houston record set by Elvin Hayes . . . in four varsity seasons shot 50.4% . . . was high school All-American and Florida High School Player of the Year . . . has seven sisters and four brothers. Cotton Fitzsimmons says of the Bird: "Otis is a very promising youngster with tremendous offensive potential. He's already established himself as a player who can score a great number of points in very little time. We're looking for big things from Mr. Birdsong."

At times last year, Tall Tommy was brilliant and looked like he was developing into the kind of player everyone feels he is capable of being. For example during one three game stretch against Bob Lanier, Artis Gilmore and Moses Malone, Tommy averaged 17 points and 15 rebounds and looked simply awesome . . . . When Tommy moved into the starting role near the end of the season, his performance seemed to improve with every game. The Kings will be relying much more on Tommy this year, hoping to get more points from him and increased rebounding.
