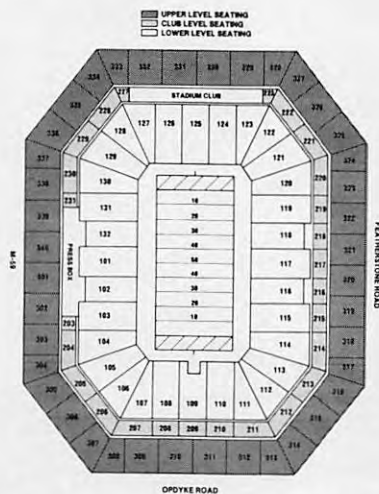

## WILLIAM CLAY FORD President



The Lions' number one fan is also their owner and president. And as much as he is involved in his daily duties with the organization, his foremost pleasure is watching his team in action on the playing fields of the National Football League.

And as the man who made the bold commitment to move to Pontiac and become chief tenant in the new stadium there, his team will have the best playing field in the NFL in 1975 and for many seasons to come.

Mr. Ford's goal in football—both as a fan and as an executive—is to win the championship of the National Football League. Moving to the new Pontiac Metropolitan Stadium is another step in the plan to bring the team closer to this goal.

Mr. Ford has been a club official since 1956 when he first joined the organization as a director. He became president in 1961 and three years later, in 1964, he purchased the franchise and became owner-president.

He has been a Lions' fan since his father, the late Edsel Ford, took him to old U-D Stadium for one of the team's first games after the local franchise had been transferred from Portsmouth, Ohio, to Detroit.

In addition to his football duties and his activities in national and local civic organizations, he also is deeply involved in the automotive industry as a director of the Ford Motor Company and vice-president Product Design.

As grandson of the late Henry Ford, who founded the Company, he is a native Detroitier and the youngest of four children.

After two years in the Naval Aviation Corps during World War II, Mr. Ford went to Yale University where he received a bachelor of science degree. He originally joined the Ford Motor Company's sales and advertising staff, and then started moving up through different departments until becoming a Company director with responsibility for Corporate Planning and Design.

Among his numerous positions as a community leader, he is chairman of the board of the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village, secretary-treasurer of Henry Ford Hospital, president of the Edsel B. Ford Institute for Medical Research, trustee of the Eisenhower Medical Center, and a director of the National Tennis Hall of Fame and the United Foundation of Detroit.

He was honored in 1973 as recipient of the Man and Boy Award presented by the Boys' Clubs of Metropolitan Detroit for his many unpublicized contributions to youngsters in the Detroit area. An avid sports enthusiast, he played varsity tennis and soccer at Yale, is a low handicap golfer, and possesses an unyielding determination to bring a professional football championship to Lions fans.

Mr. Ford is married to the former Martha Firestone of Akron, Ohio. They have three daughters and one son.

## **RUSS THOMAS**

### **Executive Vice President and General Manager**



In his years since first joining the Lions in 1946 as a player, Russ Thomas has handled many facets of the club's operation. Now in his fourth season as executive vice president and general manager, he is constantly striving toward his goal of returning the Lions to their glory days.

He was an assistant coach when the Lions ended a 17-year dry spell and won the NFL championship in 1952. In addition to his field coaching duties, he was in charge of scouting rival teams, evaluating college prospects and negotiating player

salaries.

All this experience has aided him greatly in current duties of the daily handling of the countless decisions and minute details involved in the running of a professional football organization.

As a player he was a defensive tackle with the Lions for four seasons, 1946-49. He had been an All-American lineman at Ohio State under Coach Paul Brown.

As an executive, he was the Lions' director of player personnel from 1964 until 1967 when he was named vice president and general manager. In 1972, he was elevated to the new post of executive vice president and general manager.

As such he has complete control of the day-to-day operation of the Lions. Since the team's commitment to move to Pontiac, Thomas has been active in the many decisions involved in this relocation.

Russ and his wife, Dorothy, live in Walled Lake, and have a cottage in Chelsea. They have two married sons, John and Jim.

## **ROGERS LEHEW**

### **Assistant General Manager**



The man with the often mispronounced name is now in his second year as assistant general manager. Rogers Lehew (pronounced Lee-hugh) came to the Lions last season from the Canadian Football League where he was an executive with the Calgary Stampeders for 15 years.

But he is not a Canadian. He is a Texan who went to college in Oklahoma, at the University of Tulsa. He went into coaching in Tulsa after graduation in 1951.

In 1959, he headed north to join the Calgary team in the CFL as assistant G.M. under Jim Finks, now with the Bears. When Finks moved to the Vikings in 1964, Rogers became General Manager.

During his years with the Stampeders, his teams were in the Conference playoffs 11 times, won three Conference titles and won the CFL championship in 1971, taking the Grey Cup.

With the Lions, Rogers shares contract negotiations with General Manager Russ Thomas and supervises the player personnel department. He works closely with the Lions' scouting combine, BLESTO-VIII, and with Lions' coordinator of personnel and scouting, Tommy Hudspeth, and college scouts Jerry Neri and Joe Bushofsky.

Lehew and his wife, Joan, live in Birmingham, with their twin sons, Larry and Garry, who attend the University of Windsor. A married daughter, Lora, resides in Calgary.



## **EDWIN J. ANDERSON**

### **Senior Vice President**



The driving force behind the Lions' involvement in the new Pontiac Metropolitan Stadium is E. J. Anderson, the team's senior vice president.

Associated with the Lions since 1948, when he put together a syndicate of local businessmen to buy the franchise, Anderson was president of the club for 11 years and also general manager for three, 1961-63.

When William Clay Ford purchased the team in 1964, Anderson was made vice president as well as general manager. In 1967, he was named executive vice president and three years ago he was elevated to senior vice president.

Thus, he has served the Lions in important executive positions for more than a quarter century for an impressive record shared by few in the National Football League.

As far back as the early 1960's, he saw the need for a new sports stadium in Detroit. Through the years, under his constant pushing and promotion, the project took form and finally materialized when the city of Pontiac took over and Mr. Ford made his commitment.

It's a dream come true for this dedicated and faithful fan of the Lions. With his own fan, wife Sunny, he lives in suburban Bloomfield Hills. They have a married daughter, Merny (Mrs. Richard Williams).

## **RICK FORZANO**

### **Head Coach**



He's the Lions' 13th head coach, but Rick Forzano, a positive-thinking, optimistic leader is not about to let any silly old superstition bother him on his way to making the Lions a contender in the National Football League.

His confidence was severely tested last season when the team started the schedule with four straight losses. Under his solid direction, the players fought back to win seven of the final ten games to post a 7-7 record.

In his own words, 1974 was a trying but rewarding year. He was promoted to head coach upon the sudden and tragic death of his long-time coaching associate and friend, Don McCafferty, in training camp.

Not a miracle worker, Forzano did accomplish something with the '74 Lions. He made the players believe and have faith in themselves, by use of encouragement and praise — and hard work, on his part and theirs.

Forzano had come to Detroit in 1973 as an assistant coach, in charge of the offensive backfield. He is now in his 23rd year of coaching, having started in 1953 in his native Ohio.

He went into coaching because as a 14-year-old high school sophomore, he suffered a severe eye injury while playing football that ended his dreams of playing the game he loves.

Forzano's coaching career has seen him in pro jobs with St. Louis and Cincinnati. He has been head coach three other times, at Hower High School in Akron, Ohio, at Connecticut and at the U.S. Naval Academy.

He holds a bachelors and a masters degree in education from Kent State. He lives in Bloomfield Hills, with his wife, Betty, and their three children.

## HISTORY OF THE DETROIT LIONS

Professional football was first attempted in Detroit in 1920 and again in 1925. Both attempts failed. In 1928, a third effort failed. In 1930, the then ten-year-old National Football League took in a franchise from Portsmouth, Ohio, called the Spartans. After four seasons, the team was purchased for less than \$8,000 by Detroit radio executive George A. Richards and was moved to the Motor City.

Playing in the University of Detroit Stadium before average crowds of 16,000 people, the Detroit Lions won the NFL championship in their second year, 1935. Under the leadership of Coach "Potsy" Clark and stars such as Hall of Famer "Dutch" Clark, Ernie Caddel, George Christensen, "Ace" Gutowsky, Glenn Presnell and "Ox" Emerson, the early Lions established pro football in Detroit and for over 40 years it has been an integral part of the Michigan sports scene.

In 1940 Chicagoan Fred Mandel bought the club. Lion stars of that era were Bill Dudley, Alex Wojciechowicz, John Green, "Whizzer" White, Frank Sinkwich and "Camp" Wilson. Eight years later the club was sold to a group of local businessmen who controlled the team until 1964 when William Clay Ford became sole owner for six million dollars.

In the 1950's the Lions dominated the NFL with four division titles and three league championships. Stars of those glittering teams were such as Bobby Layne, Jack Christiansen, Doak Walker, Les Bingaman, Cloyce Box and Bob Hoernschemeyer. The Lions' battles with the Cleveland Browns in those days were classic confrontations between two giants of the blossoming NFL.

Since their last title year of 1957, the Lions have been looking in vain for the top spot. Such stars as Hall of Famers Joe Schmidt and "Night Train" Lane, and Wayne Walker, Nick Pietrosante, Gail Cogdill and Terry Barr have taken their places in the annals of pro football in Detroit.

Now in the middle 1970's under the direction of Head Coach Rick Forzano and with current stars such as Charlie Sanders, Lem Barney, Steve Owens, Bill Munson, Greg Landry and Herb Orvis, the Lions are a young, but experienced team on its way back up to the heights of the league.

- Dec. 9, 1935—Lions defeat New York Giants, 26-7, for first Championship.
- Sept. 9, 1938—Lions play first game in new home, Briggs Stadium.
- Feb. 10, 1940—Fred Mandel, Jr., purchases Detroit franchise for \$225,000.
- Jan. 9, 1943—Gus Dorais named head coach of Lions, after long and successful career at the U of D.
- Jan. 15, 1948—Syndicate headed by D. Lyle Fife purchases Detroit franchise for \$165,000, and names "Bo" McMillin general manager and head coach.
- Dec. 2, 1949—Edwin J. Anderson elected president of the Lions.
- Dec. 20, 1950—"Buddy" Parker succeeds McMillan as head coach.
- Dec. 21, 1952—Lions defeat Los Angeles, 31-21, for NFL's National Conference title.
- Dec. 28, 1952—Lions win first Championship since 1935 on 17-7 victory over the Browns in Cleveland before 50,934.
- Dec. 27, 1953—Detroit wins second straight Championship on 17-16 decision over Cleveland in Detroit before 54,577.
- Aug. 12, 1957—Parker resigns suddenly as head coach and assistant coach George Wilson succeeds him the next day.
- Dec. 21, 1957—Detroit downs San Francisco, 31-27, in play-off after trailing 27-7 in third quarter.
- Dec. 28, 1957—Detroit claims fourth Championship on 59-14 victory over Cleveland before 55,263 in Detroit.
- Jan. 23, 1961—William Clay Ford elected president of the Lions.
- Jan. 10, 1964—Ford takes over as Lions' sole owner after purchasing franchise for six million dollars.
- Jan. 7, 1965—Harry Gilmer appointed head coach, replacing George Wilson.
- March 10, 1966—After 13 seasons, Joe Schmidt retires to become Lions' line-backer coach.
- Jan. 11, 1967—Schmidt named Lions' head coach, succeeding Gilmer.
- Dec. 26, 1970—Lions edged by Dallas, 5-0, in first playoff game since 1957.
- Jan. 12, 1973—Schmidt resigns as head coach.
- Jan. 26, 1973—Don McCafferty named Lions' head coach.
- July 28, 1974—McCafferty dies of heart attack
- Aug. 3, 1974—Rick Forzano named head coach
