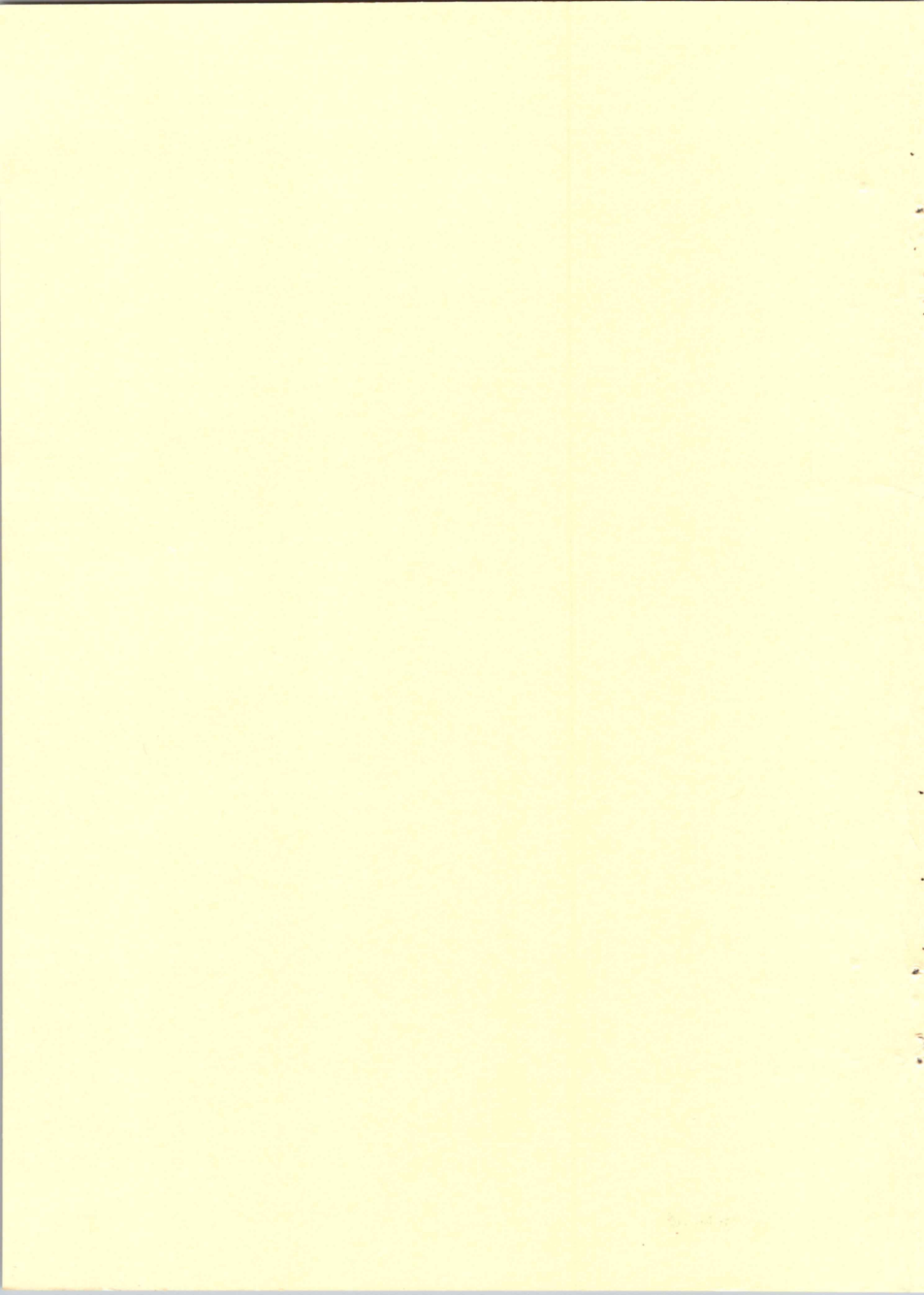

## EARL L. (Curly) LAMBEAU — Head Coach

Curly Lambeau, the dean of major league coaches, is in his 31st consecutive year as head coach of the Green Bay Packers, a team he organized as a sandlot aggregation and developed into a six-time world champion.

A native of Green Bay, Lambeau was born on April 9, 1898, and first came into football prominence as a halfback on the East High School team. He later attended Notre Dame, where in his freshman year he became varsity fullback on Knute Rockne's first team in 1918, playing with George Gipp.

Returning to Green Bay after one year in college, he organized the Packers and persuaded the now defunct Acme Packing Company to donate \$500 for jerseys. In return for the aid of the company, which was employing him as a shipping clerk, Lambeau agreed to emblazon "Packers" on the team's uniforms. The name remained after the packing company quit.

Lambeau played with and coached the club through 1928, scoring 109 points. He was a forward pass specialist and in later years was to become known as the foremost authority on forward pass offense and defense in football.

As head coach, vice-president and general manager, he has been the key figure in Green Bay's successful drives to six world titles (1929, 1930, 1931, 1936, 1939, and 1944). His Packers are the only team to win three consecutive championships. In 30 years they have finished out of the first division in the National League only once (1948).

Under Lambeau the Packers have won 234 games, while losing only 101 and tying 23, not counting exhibitions, giving them a 30-year average of .698. They have scored 6,326 points while holding the opposition to 3,321.

Lambeau is married and now spends the off-season on his ranch in California.

## TOM STIDHAM — Line Coach

Tom Stidham comes to the Packers this year after a long and singularly successful collegiate coaching career. He began active participation in football at Checotah, Okla., where he was born on March 27, 1904, by starring on the Checotah High School team. In 1924, 1925 and 1926 he played at Haskell Institute under Dick Hanley. When Hanley moved to Northwestern in 1927 as head coach, Stidham went along as his assistant. He coached the Northwestern line through the 1934 season, then transferred to Oklahoma in a similar capacity under

Biff Jones. In 1937 he was named head coach and athletic director at Oklahoma. His 1938 team won ten straight games, opening with a stunning 23 to 0 upset triumph over Northwestern, at that time considered an odds on favorite to win the Western Conference championship. Stidham's triple threat star in that game was a sophomore named Jack Jacobs. Stidham brought Oklahoma its first Big Six championship in 1938 and repeated in 1940. His 1938 team went to the Orange Bowl. His 1939 team won eight in a row and under Stidham, Oklahoma went on through a string of 17 games without defeat. In 1940 Stidham became head coach at Marquette, where he remained until 1946. Among Marquette's accomplishments under Stidham were two victories over Wisconsin. Stidham is married and has one son five years old. Like Jacobs, he is of Creek Indian ancestry. At present he makes his home in Milwaukee, where he formerly owned a chain of drug stores and now operates a cold storage and locker plant.

## BOB SNYDER — Backfield Coach

At 36 years of age Bob Snyder already is a veteran in virtually every branch of major league operation. He was a star and record breaker as a player with the Cleveland Rams and the Chicago Bears. Later he had a successful tenure as head coach of the Los Angeles Rams.

Born in Freemont, O., on February 6, 1913, Snyder attended Libby High School in Toledo, where he won 13 letters in football, basketball, baseball and track. He set an amazing iron-man record at Ohio University where, in three seasons, he missed only nine minutes of play at left halfback. He was named All-Ohio halfback in 1934 and 1935 and participated in victories over Indiana, Illinois and Navy.

Snyder began his professional career in 1936 with Pittsburgh of the American league and in 1937 went to the Cleveland Rams of the National league. The Chicago Bears purchased his contract in 1939 after he had led the Rams to two victories over the Bears in 1938. He remained with the Bears four seasons: 1939, 1940, 1941, and 1943, during which time he set four major league records.

He kicked three field goals against the New York Giants in the 1941 championship playoff; kicked eight extra points in a game against the Giants in 1943; added five extra points against the Washington Redskins in the 1943 championship play-off; and had 39 extra points for the season of 1943. The first three marks still remain unbroken.

In 1942 he was given a leave of absence from the Chicago Bears as a player to install the "T" formation for Frank Leahy at Notre Dame. He took a job with the Libby Aircraft plant in Toledo in 1944 and helped coach the Libby preps to a state championship. He returned

to the National league as assistant coach of the Cleveland Rams in 1945 and after the 1946 season, he was named head coach of the Rams, who had moved to Los Angeles.

Snyder is married and has two daughters and a son. He makes his home in Green Bay.

### **CHARLES BROCK — Defense Coach**

Charles Brock, All-American center at the University of Nebraska in 1938, played nine years for the Packers before retiring at the end of the 1947 season to enter coaching. His first assignment was line coach at the University of Omaha in 1948. Curly Lambeau recalled him to the Packers last spring to take over the Packer defense, a department in which Brock excelled while a player. He set a major league scoring record for centers, scoring four touchdowns in his career. He captained the Nebraska eleven in 1938, the West team in the 1939 Shrine game, the 1939 Chicago All-Star squad, and for four years was the Packer field captain. He is a member of the Phi Gamma Delta fraternity and is a family man with three children. Brock was born in Columbus, Neb., on March 15, 1916.
