ELEVEN TIMES WORLD CHAMPIONS

The Green Bay Packers lead the NFL in most Championships won with eleven. Green Bay won three by League standing (1929, 1930 and 1931) and eight times (1936, 1939, 1944, 1961, 1962, 1965, 1966 and 1967) since the play-off system was established in 1933.

In addition, the Packers hold two AFL-NFL Professional Football Titles by virtue of their 35-10 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs in 1967 and their 33-14 victory over the Oakland Raiders in 1968.

The Chicago Bears are next with eight NFL Championships, having won twice prior to the play-off system (1921 and 1932) and six times since (1937, 1940, 1941, 1943, 1946 and 1963).

The Giants, Lions and Browns have won 4 titles, the Eagles and Colts 3, the Redskins twice, and Cleveland Rams, Chicago Cards, and Los Angeles Rams once apiece.

The Giants have appeared in 13 playoffs and have lost 10. The Bears and Redskins have lost 4 times and the Browns 5 times.

Green Bay's only two losses were in 1938 (Giants 23, Packers 17) in New York; and in 1960 in Philadelphia (17-13 margin to the Eagles).



BIRTH OF A TEAM AND A LEGEND

On the evening of August 11, 1919, a score or more of husky young characters, called together by Curly Lambeau and George Calhoun, gathered in the dingy editorial room of the old Press-Gazette building on Cherry Street and organized a football team. They didn't know it, but that was the beginning of the incredible saga of the Green Bay Packers.

There had been some preliminary talk and planning and that night's decision wasn't announced until two days later, but the big step had been taken. So August 11 is as good a birthday as any.

Actually, the initial spark had been struck a few weeks before during a casual street corner conversation between Curley Lambeau and George Calhoun. It was apparently one of those "why not get up a football team?" remarks, but once they got interested they wasted no time.

First they talked Curley's employers at the Indian Packing Company into putting up some money for equipment.

Because the team's jerseys had been provided by the packing company, which also permitted the use of its athletic field for practice, the club was identified in its early publicity as a project of the company. With this tie-in the name "Packers" was a natural, and Packers they have been ever since, although the corporation had practically faded out of the picture before that first season was half over.

EARLY DAYS — That first season the team won 10 games and lost only

one against other teams from Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, Games were played in an open field with no fence or bleachers, and interested fans "passed the hat." But the team was so successful by 1921 that Lambeau was backed by two officials of the packing plant in obtaining a franchise in the new national pro-football league that had been formed in 1920. Cash customers didn't quite pay the freight, and at the end of the season it had to be forfeited. This was the first in a long series of troubles that the now famous team overcame, for in 1922 Lambeau gained other backers and bought the franchise back for \$250. Troubles continued during that season. One game was rained out and the insurance company wouldn't pay off because the official amount of rain was one one-hundredth of an inch short of that required in the policy. Another storm late in the season when the Packers were scheduled to play the Duluth Eskimos, however, proved the founding of the modern community corporation. A. B. Turnbull, general manager of the Green Bay Press-Gazette, told the Packers to play anyway. He then went out and helped organize the businessmen of Green Bay in the support of the team, and the Green Bay Football Corporation was formed.

THE IRON MAN ERA — With good financial backing, Lambeau began to pick up college stars from all over the country, plus some unknowns who were going to turn out to be "greats." And in 1929 Green Bay won the national professional football championship. They repeated in

1930 and 1931 wih a team featuring such all-time pro greats as Red Dunn, Verne Lewellen, Cal Hubbard, Bo Molenda, Jug Earp, Mike Michalske, Johnny Blood, Bill Kern, Arnie Herber, Clarke Hinkle, Lavvie Dilweg, Tom Nash, Milt Gantenbein and Hank Bruder. Many games 12 to 13 players would go for almost the full 60 minutes. These teams were hailed all over the country as some of the greatest ever.

THE HUTSON PERIOD - Trouble flared again soon afterward. A fan fell from the stands, sued and won a \$5,000 verdict, and the insurance company went out of business. The Packers went into receivership, were just about to fold when Green Bay businessmen came to the rescue again, raised \$15,000 in new capital and reorganized the club. About this time a rather slight, lanky end by the name of Don Hutson came to the club. From his first game on, Hutson became the terror of the league and the secret of Green Bay's next three championships. On his first play in professional ball against the Chicago Bears, he took a pass from Arnie Herber and went 94 yards for the only score of the game. With Herber and Cecil Isbell pitching and Hutson catching anything they threw at him despite any kind of a stop-Hutson defense, Green Bay won championships in 1936, 1939 and 1944, and all during the Hutson era they always finished in the first division.

RONZANI REGIME — After Hutson's retirement, Packer fortunes again went into a decline. The disastrous pro football war brought on another financial crisis after the 1949 sea-

son. In the midst of it Lambeau resigned to take a position as head coach of the Chicago Cardinals. Then began another major reorganization and rebuilding effort with Gene Ronzani of the Bears hired as head coach. Over \$125,000 was raised in a giant stock sale all over the state. Ronzani's 'teams improved each of the first three seasons until 1952. The Packers were in the thick of the title chase until the last weeks of the season. In 1953 the team played erratic ball and Ronzani resigned with two games remaining on the schedule.

BLACKBOURN TAKES OVER — The Packers overhauled their front office and coaching staff in 1954, hiring Verne C. Lewellen, all-time Packer great, attorney and business man, as general manager. Reaching into college ranks for a head coach was the next step in the re-building plans and Lisle W. Blackbourn, a native Wisconsinite, and Coach of Marquette University, was signed to a contract. During the four year Blackbourn regime the Packers won 17 while losing 31.

McLEAN MOVES UP — Likeable Ray "Scooter" McLean moves up from an outstanding assistant coach to guide the destiny of the Packers for 1958. McLean resigned in December after a 1-10-1 record, worst in Packer history in his first season as head coach.

FROM SANDLOT TO STADIUM—Procedures at Packers games have come a long way since the sandlot years of 1919-20 when the Pack was subsisting on the contents of George Calhoun's hat. Then there were no ushers, no majorettes, no band and no public address system—the lat-

ter hadn't been invented yet. There weren't even any seats at first, and it didn't cost anything to get in.

When the Packers began their career in 1919 they played on approximately the same site as now abandoned City Stadium, but with a mighty difference. Hagemeister Park, as it was called, was just a big vacant lot with a football gridiron marked on it.

There were no gates because there wasn't any fence. Spectators just dropped off the Walnut street street-car and walked over to the sideline, or drove their own cars and parked about ten yards behind the ropes stretched around the playing field.

stretched around the playing field. If they felt like it they either sat in their automobiles or on top of them, but most preferred to get out and follow the play up and down the field. By moving as the play progressed you always had a "50-yard line" location and were handy to any donnybrook that might require a little help. In fact, when things got exciting the crowd sometimes spilled right onto the field, surrounded the scrimmage in a big circle and virtually took part in every play. Teams didn't huddle in those days, or the fans would have been in that too.

When the half ended teams grabbed blankets and adjourned to opposite end zones where they relaxed and talked over the tactics for the next half. Nothing private about those huddles. The crowd formed a ring around the players, a practice encouraged since it made a handy wind break. Fans weren't bashful about joining the discussions either, sometimes with surprising results. At least one early game was pulled out of the fire by a spectators' halftime suggestion.

In 1920 a section of stands was built — just a small bleacher with a ca-

pacity of a couple hundred — on one side of the field, and a fee charged to sit there. The next year a portable canvas fence was erected around the whole field and a regular admission charge inaugurated.

When Hagemeister Park was dug up in 1923 to make way for East High School, the Packers shifted to the new baseball grounds out on the end of Main Street. This was called Bellevue Park becaues it was just east of the old Hagemeister Brewery, which was renamed the Bellevue Products Co. during Prohibition. Things were Big Time out there, with crowds of 4,000 to 5,000 storming the fences to boo the hated Chicago Bears.

The Packers used Bellevue in 1923-24, but it was obviously inadequate and too far out, lacking about every facility needed for football. Agitation to build a new stadium somewhere near the original site culminated in the erection of old City Stadium just back of the new high school.

The new plant was barely completed in time for the 1925 opening, but was an immediate success, the Bear game that year drawing a record crowd of nearly 6,000. It was a typical small town park of its day, with wooden fences and stands on both sides between the 30-yard lines. A wooden railing surrounded the rest of the gridiron, along which the Knothole Gang stood or sat on the ground.

Seating capacity was gradually increased until it seated 15,000 by 1934, with the end zones still uncovered. With the filling in of the area around the end lines the ultimate capacity of 25,000 was reached.

One of the first tasks of the stadium builders was the creation of a good playing field, a job admirably done. Whatever antiquated City Stadium may have lacked, one of the best turfs in the country wasn't one of them.

After World War II City Stadium gradually faded from its once proud position as one of the favored fields in the National Football League to an inadequate and obsolete installation. As pro crowds increased it was impossible to expand the stadium any further. With limited capacity, the Packers found it increasingly difficult to schedule top opponents at home. September 29, 1957 was a proud day for Green Bay and its Packers. A million dollar modern stadium with a seating capacity of 32,150 was dedicated. In 1961 the Stadium was expanded to 38,669, to 42,327 in 1963, to 50,861 in 1965 when the name was changed to Lambeau Field, and to the present 56.161 in 1970.

There has never been an empty seat for a League game in Green Bay since 1959 when Vince Lombardi revived Packer football.

THE LOMBARDI ERA

In 1959, the Packers announced the signing of New York Giant assistant Vince Lombardi as Head Coach and General Manager of a team that finished dead last in 1958 with a 1-10-1 mark.

In his first season, Lombardi lifted the Packers to a 7-5 record and was unanimously voted Coach of the Year. Then in 1960, the Packers captured the Western Division Title and went on to win World Championships in 1961, 1962, 1965, 1966 and 1967. Never finishing lower than second since 1960, his teams have become the standard of football excellence and the Packer franchise has become one of the most successful in the National Football League.

In 1967, Green Bay played to 22 consecutive sellouts in 23 games and became the first team in the history of the League to win three straight World Titles.

Over a nine year span as Head Coach, Lombardi's teams racked up 141 victories against 39 losses and 4 ties for a remarkable .783 winning percentage. Even more noteworthy, however, is the record of Lombardi coached teams in post-season play. In 10 Division playoffs and World Championship Games, the Packers emerged victorious nine times.

Following the third consecutive Title in 1967, Lombardi turned over the Head Coaching duties to Phil Bengtson and one year later announced that he was leaving Green Bay to coach and manage the Washington Redskins. Bengtson coached the Packers from 1968-1970 compiling a 20-21-1 record and in December of 1970 resigned.

THE PRESENT — Dan Devine was named Head Coach & General Manager Jan. 14, 1971.

Make no mistake about it, the Green Bay Packers are in strong hands.

Dan Devine, a strict disciplinarian with 23 years of successful coaching experience, has been summoned to return the Green Bay Packers to the heights and with him comes a non-nonsense approach to the game — an approach that has made him the nation's third most winning collegiate football coach.

He left the security of the University of Missouri (tenure as full professor, Athletic Director and Head Coach; an institution at 46, after 13 great years at Missouri) in order to accept the responsibility and challenge of a pro team which has been described as a yardstick against whom all others are measured.

His style is sincere, straight forward and direct. His football teams will be a reflection of the man.

Born December 23, 1924 in Augusta, Wisconsin (near Chippewa Falls in West Central Wisconsin) to a family of 6 boys and 3 girls, Devine grew up in Proctor, Minnesota, a suburb of Duluth. Devine graduated from Proctor High in 1942 and attended the University of Minnesota at Duluth where he captained the basketball and football teams, played baseball and was Senior Class President and President

of the Student Body. In addition to his leadership awards and honors, Devine also received the Alumni Award as Outstanding Senior Athlete.

After a 2½ year interruption by service in the Army Air Corps, Devine graduated with a B.A. in Social Studies in 1948 and entered high school coaching at East Jordan, Michigan. Then, after two highly successful years, he was hired as Freshman Coach and later Backfield Coach at Michigan State University under "Biggie" Munn and Duffy Daugherty. While coaching at MSU, Devine also earned his Masters Degree in Guidance and Counseling in 1952.

Devine's first head coaching opportunity occurred in 1955 when he was named to coach the Arizona State Sun Devils. His three year record there was a highly impressive 27-3-1 (1955-57) and his 1957 team was the first unbeaten and nationally ranked team in ASU history.

In 1958 opportunity again knocked, this time at the University of Missouri. Frank Broyles had left Missouri, feeling that the Tigers could not be competitive under such rigorous scholastic standards, but Devine accepted the challenge and one year later had the Tigers in the Orange Bowl.

In his 13 years at Missouri, Devine became a legend, establishing a 93-37-7 regular season record and a 4-2-0 bowl record. Until Devine's 1961 Orange Bowl victory, the University of Missouri had never won a post-season bowl game, but under him they captured one Orange Bowl (1961) one Bluebonnet (1963), one Sugar (1966) and one Gator Bowl (1969) trophy. Other post-season coaching assignments were; an Assistant Rose Bowl Coach (1953), East-West Shrine Game Coach (Assistant 1961 and Head Coach 1962), Hula Bowl (1969), Coaches All-American Bowl (1970) and the Salad (1955) and Copper Bowl (1957).

Dan Devine married the former Joanne Brookhart in 1947 and they have seven children: Jennifer and Mary Jo (Mrs. Andrew Carver), Diana, Danny, Sarah, Melissa and Jill.

JOHN "RED" COCHRAN ASSISTANT COACH — OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Born August 2, 1922 in Fairfield, Alabama, John "Red" Cochran became a two sport star at Wake Forest before signing with the Chicago Cardinals in 1946. Following four years as a pro running back and defensive back, Red returned to his Alma Mater to become the Backfield Coach in 1951 where he served until 1955. Entering the pro ranks in 1956, Cochran was the Detroit Lions Offensive Backfield Coach from 1956-1958 and then was summoned to Green Bay by Vince Lombardi in 1959. Red's backfield of Starr, Hornung and Taylor was largely responsible for returning the running game to popularity during the 60's. Following a year out of football in 1967, Red spent two years with the St. Louis Football Cardinals (1968-69) before going to San Diego in 1970. In February of 1971, Dan Devine named Cochran to the post of Offensive Backfield Coach of the Packers. Cochran is married and the father of 1 boy and 2 girls.

DON DOLL ASSISTANT COACH — DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

The Packers secondary is in the able hands of Don Doll, a veteran NFL defensive back (Lions, Redskins and Rams) and assistant coach.

Don was born on August 29, 1926 in Los Angeles, California and attended the University of Southern California, graduating in 1948. After 4 years with the Detroit Lions and one year each with Washington and Los Angeles, Doll entered the collegiate coaching ranks in 1955 at the University of Washington. In 1956 he became the Head Coach at Contra Costa Junior College and in 1957 returned to USC for 2 years as their Offensive Backfield Coach. In 1959 Don became the Backfield Coach at Notre Dame for one season and worked with the College All-Stars backs until 1963 when he became the Secondary Coach for the Detroit Lions from 1963-1964. In 1965 Don joined the Rams as Defensive Secondary Coach and in 1966 went to Washington where he coached under Otto Graham, Vince Lombardi and Bill Austin until 1970.

Dan Devine named Doll his Defensive Secondary Coach in February of 1971. Don is married and the father of 3 boys and 2 girls.



ROLLIE DOTSCH ASSISTANT COACH -OFFENSIVE LINE

Born February 14, 1933, in Escanaba, Michigan, Rollie Dotsch won 16 high school letters at Lansing, Michigan before enrolling at Michigan State, where he played guard under Dan Devine for 4 years. Following graduation in 1954, Rollie coached high school football at Escanaba from 1956-1957 before becoming an Assistant Coach at Northern Michigan in 1958. Following 3 years at Northern, Dotsch went to the University of Colorado in 1961 and joined Dan Devine as Offensive Line Coach at the University of Missouri from 1962-1965.

Rollie was named Head Coach and Athletic Director at Northern Michigan University in 1966 and in five years his varsity won 33 while losing 15

and tving 1.

In February of 1971 Dan Devine appointed Dotsch his Offensive Line Coach. Dotsch is married to the former Carol Thomas and they have 1 boy and 1 girl.

BURT GUSTAFSON ASSISTANT COACH -LINEBACKERS

Born November 30, 1925 in Marquette, Michigan, Burt Gustafson went on to become a 12 letterman at Northern Michigan University (football basketball and track).

From 1953-1955 Burt coached the Battle Creek High School team before accepting the position of End Coach at Northern Michigan in 1956, where he served until 1961.

In '62 Burt joined coach Lloyd Eaton at the University of Wyoming where he worked with the defensive secon-

dary for eight years.

During the summer months Gustafson visited the Packers early training camp and during these visits became familiar with Green Bay's personnel and pass defense.

In February of 1970, Coach Devine appointed Burt Gustafson Linebacker Coach. Gustafson is married and the father of 2 boys and 3 girls.



DAVE HANNER ASSISTANT COACH — DEFENSIVE LINE

After playing for the Green Bay Packers for 13 seasons, Dave Hanner switched to the coaching ranks in 1965 working with the Packers' Front Four.

As a player, Dave was named All-Pro five times and was twice selected to play on the West Pro Bowl Team.

A native of Parkin, Arkansas, Hanner played his collegiate football at the University of Arkansas where he was twice named to the All-Southwest Conference Team.

The Green Bay Packers drafted Hanner in the fifth round in 1952 and he played on the Western Divisional Title Team of 1960 as well as the World Champion Teams of 1961 and 1962. Between seasons as an active player, Dave worked as a soil conservationist in West Memphis, Arkansas, before moving to Green Bay in 1964.

BOB SCHNELKER ASSISTANT COACH — PASSING GAME

The Green Bay Packers' air attack is coached by Bob Schnelker, a nine year veteran as a player in the National Football League.

Bob played his collegiate football at Bowling Green University and was a 17th round draft choice of the Cleveland Browns in 1953.

He played with the New York Giants at tight end from 1954 to 1960 and finished his career in 1961 with Pittsburgh and Minnesota.

In 1963 he coached the Ram receivers and in February of 1964 joined Vince Lombardi under whom he had played at New York from 1954 to 1958.

As a player, Bob was a two time performer in the Pro Bowl, enjoying his finest season in 1959 when New York won the first of two consecutive Eastern Conference Crowns and five in a period of six years.

PAT PEPPLER ASST. TO THE GEN. MGR. (PLAYER PERSONNEL)

A large portion of credit for the discovery and development of Packer youth goes to Personnel Director Pat Peppler, who is in charge of all scout-ing and player selection in the college draft.

Every year. Peppler sifts through the prospective pro prospects from the collegiate and minor football leagues and evaluates candidates for try-outs with the Packers.

A three sport star at Shorewood (Wisc) high school, Peppler attended Michigan State University where he lettered in baseball and basketball.

After graduating in 1948, Peppler played pro baseball briefly before beginning a successful career coaching in the East Lansing area. He coached state championship teams in football before taking a position as assistant coach at North Carolina for 8 years, working with centers and linebackers. In 1962 he switched to Wake Forest and in 1963 came to Green Bay, replacing Dick Voris as Director of Player Personnel.


