1964 PROSPECTUS

By SID GILLMAN — General Manager-Head Coach — April, 1964

Ask Sid Gillman what his (The World Champion San Diego Chargers') chances are for 1964 and he'll answer with, "put it this way: just say that if we're fortunate enough to keep ourselves reasonably injury free, I'm not going to search out anybody to change places with."

Gillman has good reason to be content (he can't afford to be satisfied) with his champions, for, if anything, they figure to be a better football team, health permitting, in '64 than they were in '63.

With another year's experience behind them as a unit, the Chargers will more than likely remain intact — unless there are an uncommon number of surprises — for the coming campaign.

Gillman believes he has the best one-two quarterback in pro football in Tobin Rote and John Hadl. Rote was the AFL's passing champion in '63, and as such was labeled "the finest all around quarterback ever to take the snap from center," by Gillman. "Tobin can do more things and do them well than any quarterback I've ever had the pleasure to coach. He's a master in all phases of his position."

Hadl has shown the promise to be ready to take over the Charger controls anytime the 36-year old Rote decides to retire (this might not occur for several years due to the fact that his ailing arm was encased for six weeks during the offseason to rest strained ligaments and it's reported to be as good as new). Hadl, who will be in his third year, has the poise and ability to rank with any young field general in the business.

Gillman's running backs, halfback Paul Lowe and fullback Keith Lincoln, also rate with any. Lowe is one of football's biggest break-away threats and Lincoln, who Gillman calls "the finest all around and most versatile football player in the game," is the perfect blend of power and speed.

The end position is well fortified with the sensational Lance Alworth, at flanker, steady and dangerous Don Nor-

ton at spread end and Dave Kocourek and Jacque MacKinnon, two 250-pounders, at tight end. Alworth, in his first full season with the Chargers last year, tied the all-time one-game pass reception record with 13 catches against Boston.

The offensive line is anchored by tackles Ron Mix, who is generally considered equal to any, and Ernie Wright, also a solid four-year veteran. Sam Gruneisen, Pat Shea, and Walt Sweeney will fight it out at the guard positions, while Don Rogers and Wayne Frazier, with his knee mended, will work center. USC rookie Gary Kirner is a contender at either tackle or center.

Defensively, the Chargers' line is shored up by three veterans, All-League end Earl Faison and tackles Ernie (Giant Cat) Ladd, the biggest man in football at 6-9, 295 pounds, and Hank Schmidt, who is pushing the 270-pound mark and gets better every year. Sophomores Bob Petrich and George Gross, who both sparkled during '63, should continue to improve with seasoning.

At linebacker the Chargers have veterans Chuck Allen (middle guard), Emil Karas, Bob Mitinger, Frank Buncom and Bobby Lane. Mississippi All-American Kenny Dill and rookie Ron Carpenter are promising linebacker candidates.

The Chargers' defensive backfield is a definite plus—in their estimation—with five well established and proven veterans in Dick Harris, Bud Whitehead, Dick Westmoreland, who had an outstanding rookie year, George Blair and Charlie McNeil. Harris and Whitehead are interchangeable at corner and safety.

Over all, Gillman believes that balance between the running and passing game is the key to the Charger's offensive success and that the same holds true, conversely, as far as the defense goes.

With a team that averages slightly over 25 years of age and four years of pro experience, Gillman's and the Chargers' prospects appear pleasant.

CHAMPIONSHIP GAME STORY

Before 30,127 in Balboa Stadium and 30 million more on national television, Keith Lincoln ran, caught and passed like no other athlete ever has in a professional title match as the Californians crumbled the Boston Patriots, 51 - 10.

The Chargers made 610 yards. Lincoln accounted for 349 of them in virtuoso performance which included a touchdown sprint of 67 yards, a touchdown reception of 25, 206 yards gained rushing, 123 gained pass receiving and 20 gained passing.

Lincoln's heroics were mightily abetted by the others on a San Diego team which played with brilliance any professional team must respect, including the Bears.

It was a powerhouse show by a team which had failed in two previous tries to the AFL title. Houston outscored the Chargers, 24 - 16, in 1960 and beat 'em 10 - 3 in 1961.

But the Patriots, with the league's proudest defensive outfit, were no match for the San Diegans. Splendidly prepared by Sid Gillman to combat Boston's almost constantly rushing linebackers, the Chargers scored on their fourth scrimmage play, on their sixth and on their 10th.

The Patriots' ground attack suffered after fullback Larry Garron incurred a head injury midway through the second period. Garron later returned to the game but remained in it only briefly.

The Patriots scored on a 7-yard run by Garron and a 15-yard field goal by Gino Cappelletti.
