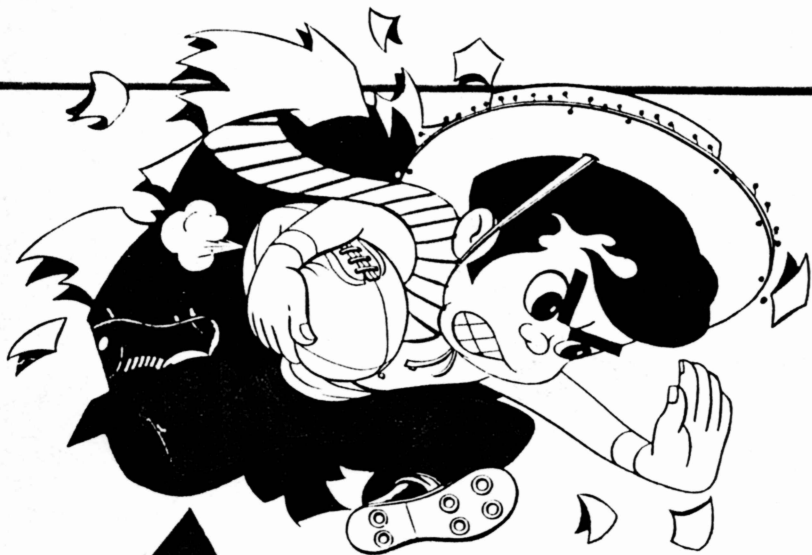

Meet Jimmy Phelan

James Michael Phelan, one of football's most colorful and astute coaches, is entering major league football this fall as the new head coach of the Los Angeles Dons.

Phelan resigned as head coach at St. Mary's College and president of the American Football Coaches Association to sign with the Dons on March 12, 1948, leaving behind him a record of 29 seasons as a head college coach and a record of 140 wins, 88 losses, and 16 ties.

Jimmy's collegiate offenses were among the most colorful in football, and he has plans to make the Dons' attack even gaudier. His teams line up in the T-formation, run enough T plays to keep the defense honest, but usually

A CHRONOLOGICAL RECORD OF PHELAN'S FOOTBALL CAREER:

- 1911-13:** High School football at Columbia University in Portland, Oregon.
- 1915-17:** Varsity football at Notre Dame. Captain in '17 and later called "the smartest quarterback I ever coached" by Knute Rockne.
- 1919-21:** Head coach at the University of Missouri. (18-4-2)
- 1922-29:** Head coach at Purdue University. In 1929 Purdue won its first Big Ten title in history with eight wins and no losses. Phelan developed three All-Americans. (35-22-5).
- 1930-41:** Head coach at the University of Washington. Won P.C.C. in 1936. Seven All-American linemen. (64-37-8).
- 1942-47:** Head coach at St. Mary's College. Three Bowl invitations. Developed All-American Wedemeyer. (23-25-1).

shift into the single-wing. Phelan's offense is built around the fullback spinner series but eventually embraces men in motion, spread plays, and other varied matters of gridiron hocus-pocus.

Four football innovations credited to Phelan are calling defensive signals with the fingers, development of the weak side spinner attack from the Notre Dame box, first end-around play from the Notre Dame box, and the first use of silk football pants.

Jimmy is married and has two grown daughters and a son, Michael James, in high school.

Extremely popular with members of the coaching profession and press and radio, Jimmy is a fine public speaker and a charming yarn-spinner. His signing with the Los Angeles Dons was hailed by the press and radio as a great boost for the sport of major league football in general and the All-America Football Conference in particular.

The Dons' new slogan: "There's No Failin' with Phelan!"

Dons' Assistant Coaches

MEL HEIN CENTER-TACKLE COACH

Mel Hein is generally recognized as the All-Time All-Pro center. In 15 seasons with the New York Giants, Mel earned All-Pro honors from 1933 through 1940, a period of eight straight seasons, and made the second All-Pro team four times. Captain of the Giants, Mel was the most respected player in the National Football League and an idol of America's youngsters because of his high code of living and gridiron sportsmanship.

Mel joined the Don coaching staff in 1947 after four seasons as head coach at Union College in Schenectady, New York, during the first three of which he coached his team during the week and joined the Giants on Sunday.

Mel was born in Redding, California, in 1908. He played his collegiate football at Washington State College where he was an All-American in 1930. He is married, has two children, and now lives in Pasadena, California.

MARTY KORDICK GUARD COACH

Marty Kordick comes to the Dons after serving as Jimmy Phelan's line coach at St. Mary's. Kordick joined the Gael coaching staff in 1940 under Red Strader and remained when Phelan came to St. Mary's in 1942.

Marty played his high school football at Belmont High School in Los Angeles and was an All-Southern California center in 1931. In 1932 he enrolled at St. Mary's and played center on the frosh team. As a sophomore he was shifted to guard by Slip Madigan and was a Gael regular for three seasons. His senior year Kordick earned All-Pacific Coast Honors and made many All-American second teams. In the 1937 Shrine Game in San Francisco, Marty played 50 minutes for the West squad.

Marty coached at Cathedral High School in Los Angeles before returning to St. Mary's as a coach. The Dons' 35-year old guard coach is married and has a nine-year-old son, Marty, Jr. The Kordicks now live in Arcadia, California.

EARL MARTINEAU BACKFIELD COACH

Earl Martineau has one of football's finest records as a backfield coach. Martineau served for 14 years under Fritz Crisler as his number one aide at Princeton and Michigan, coaching the famous "Harmon-Evashevski" backfield and such other All-Americans as Bob Westfall and Bill Daley.

Martineau was Bill Spaulding's first All-American at the University of Minnesota. Earl played for the Golden Gophers from 1921 through 1923. From 1924 through 1928 he was head football coach at Western Michigan State College and then went to Purdue as Jimmy Phelan's backfield aide in 1929, joining Crisler at Princeton three years later.

A Marine veteran of both World Wars, Martineau picked up a chest-full of medals in World War I. During World War II he was stationed at the University of Michigan as a captain. Earl is married and has an 18-year old daughter.

TED SHIPKEY END COACH

Ted Shipkey is the "veteran" of the Don coaching staff, joining the club for its first season in 1946. He coached the backfield the past two seasons but will concentrate on the wingmen this fall.

Shipkey was a gridiron great in his undergraduate days at Stanford University and recently was selected by newspapermen as an all-time Pacific Coast Conference end. He was an All-American for the Indians in 1926.

Ted coached at Sacramento Junior College, Arizona State Teachers, and Los Angeles City College before going to New Mexico University as head football coach in 1937. He served as a captain in the Army Air Corps from 1942 until 1945, coaching the Flying Kellys, and then returned to New Mexico where he took the Lobos through a championship season into the Sun Bowl for a 34-24 victory over Denver.

Ted is married and has three sons. The Shipkeys live in Monrovia, California.
