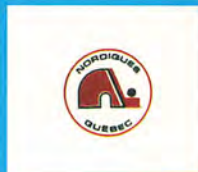

## ARTHUR M. WIRTZ

*Chairman*



Arthur M. Wirtz, Chairman of the Board of the Chicago Blackhawks, has been associated with hockey since 1932 when he and his associates bought the Detroit Red Wings. It was always the ambition of Mr. Wirtz and his associates to own a hockey club in their native city, and this opportunity occurred in 1954 when they acquired the Blackhawks and sold their interests in Detroit.

Mr. Wirtz has been active in the management and development of the National Hockey League and the growth of hockey in the United States. In 1971 he was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in recognition of his contributions to the sport.

Closely allied with the Blackhawks is the operation of Chicago Stadium. Mr. Wirtz has been instrumental in seeing that its facilities have been up-dated through the years with the addition of air conditioning, new seating and washrooms and expanded parking.

In 1935 Arthur M. Wirtz started the first major professional ice show in this country in the Chicago Stadium. The show was accepted with moderate success and in 1936 he brought Sonja Henie to America. She had just won the 1936 Olympics, thereby giving her three Olympic championships and ten consecutive World Championships and became the star in his Hollywood Ice Revue.

This show was an immediate success and set box office records for over 15 years.

As a native Chicagoan, Mr. Wirtz is interested in Chicago "The City that Works" and is a Founder Member of the Board of McCormick Place and of Chicago Urban Transportation District.

A devoted family man, he and his wife, Virginia, have four children, ten grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

## **WILLIAM W. WIRTZ**

*President*



Since taking over as president of the Black Hawks in 1967, William W. Wirtz has found himself more and more involved in the operations of hockey.

While he makes himself available for day to day decisions about his own team, he also has spent many long hours dealing with hockey problems on the league level. Bill was unanimously re-elected Chairman of the NHL Board of Governors at the summer meetings and has begun serving his fifth term of two years.

In that capacity he must deal daily with such matters as player negotiations, expansion, and the myriad of problems that develop on the international hockey front.

Bill has taken an active part in hockey and the Black Hawks since his graduation from Brown University in 1950.

For his many contributions to hockey and the NHL, he was elected to Hockey's Hall of Fame in 1976, joining his father who was elected to the Hall in 1971. They are the only living father-son combination in the Hall of Fame.

Along with his father, Arthur, and brother, Michael, Bill is very active in harness racing both as breeders and in the racing end of the sport. One of their greatest breeding accomplishments was the development of Governor Skipper which was named pacer of the year in 1977 after establishing 12 world records. Fortune Teller, son of Governor Skipper, won the world's richest harness race, the \$1,957,500 Woodrow Wilson pace at Meadowlands this past summer.

Bill and his wife, Joan have five children and two grandchildren.

## MICHAEL WIRTZ

*Vice President*



**H**aving been vice president of the Black Hawks since 1958, Mike Wirtz finds himself completely involved in the team. No one suffers more when the team is having a bad streak and no one enjoys himself more when things begin to go the right way.

His enthusiasm for the Black Hawks and the game of hockey makes Mike invaluable. If he thinks there is something that can help a player or a group of players or any one else connected with the Black Hawks, you will find Mike spending his lunch hour or a long evening working on the details to get things going.

He works closely with his brother Bill and Vice President Tommy Ivan on the many hockey problems that develop at all levels. He is never too busy to lend a helping hand.

His own boys were very active in amateur hockey and Mike even pitched in to help with the coaching, at the Glenview rink.

He is a graduate of the Wharton School of Commerce at the University of Pennsylvania. He and wife, Sunny have three children.

## THOMAS N. IVAN

*Vice President*



**S**erving in almost every capacity during his more than 50 years in hockey, Tommy Ivan is one of the most knowledgeable people in the game.

After winning six straight league championships and three Stanley cups as coach of the Detroit Red Wings, Tommy came to the Black Hawks as general manager in 1954. He served more than 25 years with the Chicago team and brought them from virtual obscurity to one of the most respected franchises in the NHL. He managed the team to a Stanley Cup in 1961 and has seen his Hawks go to the Finals of the Playoffs in 1962, 65, 71 and 73.

One of Tommy's proudest accomplishments is the growth of college hockey in the U.S. He was one of the first NHL executives to see the potential of colleges and has long been one of the biggest boosters of that phase of the sport.

He was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1974 and two years ago was named a director of the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame. In 1975 he was awarded the Lester Patrick trophy for his contributions to hockey in the United States. He is also on a selection Committee of the Hall of Fame in Toronto.

As chairman of the organizing committee for the 1978-79 Olympic hockey festival Tommy and his committee were instrumental in bringing more than 90 U.S. players together for Coach Herb Brooks and his staff to select the team that went on to thrill the entire hockey world with their 1980 GOLD Medal in Lake Placid.

After a quarter century as Black Hawk general manager, Tommy has served as vice president, assistant to the president and alternate governor for the team for the past five years.

He and his wife, Dorothy live in the northern suburbs.

## **ROBERT J. PULFORD**

### **General Manager**



**B**ob Pulford once again proved that he doesn't have to take a back seat to any one when it comes to coaching or running a hockey team behind the bench.

Taking over as coach for the last 27 games of the season, Pulford turned the Hawk fortunes around to the point that they went to the Stanley Cup semi-finals.

He had served as coach in Los Angeles for five years and spent the first two years in Chicago as both coach and general manager and had hoped that his coaching days were behind him. But when necessity put him back behind the bench, the team responded.

As general manager, Pulley is finally seeing some of his long hours behind the desk paying off, too. The Hawks' Moncton team won the AHL title and playoffs last year and some of the kids are developing right on schedule.

Pulford was named coach of the year in Los Angeles in 1974-75 and again in 1977-78 the Hockey News bestowed the same honor on him as Hawk coach.

Usually a quiet, low key operator, Pulley "dies" with the fans when the team goes into a slump; but hopefully the toughest days are now behind him as his rebuilding efforts are beginning to pay off.

Bob and his wife Rosalyn live in a north side suburb with their three children.

## **JACK DAVISON**

***Asst. General Manager***



**W**ith more than 20 years in the Black Hawk organization, including many of those as the Hawks' chief scout, Jack Davison joins with Bob Pulford to give the team one of the best 1-2 combinations in sports management.

Jack, because of his years of scouting experience, naturally oversees the team's scouting operation and supervises the NHL draft each summer.

He makes his headquarters in his home in Toronto, but spends many weekends in Chicago and is always only a phone call away when G.M. Pulford needs his help on a problem.

A good athlete in his own right, Jack had a tryout with the Braves' organization as a first baseman. He also is one of Canada's top golfers. His duties with the Black Hawks made it necessary for him to devote almost all of his time to hockey, so he doesn't get to play golf as much as he once did.

He has coached or played at every level of amateur and professional hockey over the years.

He and wife, Isobel have three children.

## ORVAL TESSIER

*Coach*



**“W**here ever he has been, his teams were winners.”

This is the word on Orval Tessier, who takes over the coaching chores for the Black Hawks.

His first season as a professional coach found Orval taking the New Brunswick Hawks to the American League championship and then to the Calder Cup title in the Playoffs.

Before that he had won the Memorial Cup with Cornwall and took Kitchener and Chicoutimi to the Memorial Cup Finals. In seven years at Cornwall Orval amassed a record of 255-114-45 for better than .600.

A native of Cornwall, right on the border between Ontario and Quebec, Orval speaks both English and French fluently. Two present Black Hawks, Rick Paterson and Bob Murray played for him at Cornwall.

While he wants his players going both ways, you can't call him a "defensive coach". When his Moncton team scored 70 more goals than the closest rival last year, the Tessier defense was by far the best in the American league.

He and his wife, Charlotte have four children; Adele McCloud, who is a nurse; Andre, who just graduated from college; Michael, and Julie, who just finished high school and will start her college work this fall. They also have two grandchildren, Christopher and Melissa.

Orval played two years for the Boston Bruins and had four NHL games with Montreal back in the late 50's and early 60's. He was a high scoring junior, scoring 59 goals for Kingston one year.

## CLIFF KOROLL

*Assistant Coach*



Only eight Black Hawks have scored more than the 208 goals that Cliff Koroll had in his 11 years as a right wing on the Hawks.

He joined the team in 1969-70, the year Kenny Wharram was forced to retire because of a heart problem. And Cliff was given the job of filling those huge skates worn by Wharram, one of the all time great right wingers.

Cliff did such a good job that the Hawks went on to win the Prince of Wales trophy as the top team in the NHL, after finishing in last place the year before.

He retired two years ago to become an assistant coach and has served in that job ever since. He will be assisting Orval Tessier this season, which means Cliff will be seen working with the wings at practices, making trips to other NHL cities to scout upcoming teams coming into the Stadium, and filling in wherever needed.

A quiet gentleman, Cliff has the dedication needed to help the Black Hawks in any manner either Tessier or G.M. Bob Pulford ask. A graduate of Denver University, Cliff is one of the many players developed from U.S. college ranks.

He and wife Lynnae have three children, Jason, C.J. and Amanda. They live in the western suburbs.

# MURRAY BANNERMAN

## GOALTENDER

Shoots left 5'11" 184 lbs.

Born: St. Francis, Ont.

Last season's Playoffs proved to be Murray's finest hour. After spending most of the season and all of the year before as the backup to Tony Esposito, Bannerman finally got his chance in the opening rounds of the Stanley Cup and for 120 minutes on foreign ice played the kind of Goal that Black Hawk fans had come to expect from the likes of Glenn Hall or Tony O himself.

Murray held Minnesota's high powered scoring machine at bay in the first two games, much of the time while the Hawks were short handed to allow the Hawks to return home with a 2-0 lead in the five game series. He continued to play well the rest of the way, but those first two games really turned the tide.

Obtained for Pit Martin from Vancouver, Murray played two years in the AHL for New Brunswick before coming to the Hawks.

He and his wife, Liz, have a young son, Dana, born last winter. He helps out on the summer softball circuit.

In his third year with the Black Hawks, Keith was on his way to one of his better years when he was hit with a knee injury that meant surgery just before Christmas. So he missed more than half the season. He got back to play in four Cup games and showed that his knee is fully recovered.

A graduate of the Portland junior team, Keith came to the Hawks as their No. 1 draft choice in 1979 and made it big with the Hawks although he was only 19. A good puck handler as well as solid checker, Brown was sorely missed while he was out last year. His return makes the Hawks a better team if they did nothing else during the summer.

Keith is still single and owns his home in the western suburbs. Plays softball and golf in the off season.

Won the NHL Arm Wrestling Championship in Las Vegas during the summer.

## Kurtenbach Coach of AHL Springfield Team



Orland Kurtenbach, veteran of 11 years in the NHL as a center for Rangers, Boston, Toronto and Vancouver, was named the coach of the Black Hawks' American League farm team in Springfield, Mass.

The Springfield Indians are replacing the New Brunswick franchise which finished first in the regular season and won the Calder Cup in the Playoffs under Orval Tessier.

Kurtenbach was named coach of

the year in the Central League after winning the Adams Cup with Tulsa in 1975-76. The next year he was called up to take over the coaching duties for Vancouver and spent two years there.

A rugged hard nosed player, Kurtenbach was considered one of the best fighters in the league when he was playing. He also scored 119 goals and 332 points in his 11 NHL years.

While playing for the Buffalo Bisons of the AHL in 1959, he played 40 minutes in goal after the regular goalie was injured.

Springfield will have the Black Hawks as their sole affiliate in the coming year. The Hawks and Toronto split the sponsorship of the New Brunswick franchise.

# TONY ESPOSITO

When you mention the name of Tony Esposito it is the same as saying Rolls Royce when you are shopping for a new car.

The Esposito name ranks in Chicago sports with that of Bronko Nagurski, Red Grange, Gabby Hartnett, Ernie Banks and George Mikan, among the sports greats.

He has played nearly 50,000 minutes in Black Hawk nets and has 74 shutouts, most of any active goalie. Add to that 6 playoff shutouts, most of any Black Hawk goalie. His 15 shutouts in his rookie year is a feat that may never be topped by any goalie, much less a rookie. He did it in 1969-70 when he began playing for the Hawks. It helped the team move from last place the year before to the NHL title and the Prince of Wales trophy.

While he is 39 years old, he still feels he can give the Chicago fans a couple more good years.

He and wife Marilyn own their home in Elmhurst. They have two sons, Mark and Jason. Tony became a U.S. citizen last year in time to help the U.S. team in the Canada Cup.

Tony has undergone a weight lifting program to develop his body and strengthen his arms and legs for the gruelling hockey campaign. It has brought his weight up to more than 190 lbs., although he is only 5'9".

Besides his hockey ability, Tony is one of the better soccer players in Canada.

# DOUG WILSON

## DEFENSE

Shoots Left 6'1" 187 lbs.

In his fifth year as a Black Hawk, Doug Wilson blossomed into the premier defenseman that everyone had in mind when he was the Hawks' No. 1 draft choice in 1977.

After four very good years, Doug was named the Norris Trophy winner and member of the first All-Star team after last season. He became the first Hawk blue liner to win the Norris trophy since Pierre Pilote did it in 1965. Pilote has won the trophy three straight years.

That's Wilson with Pilote presenting him the trophy on the cover of this Press Guide. The ceremonies were held in Montreal on June 8.

Doug had 39 goals, most by any defenseman except in 1974-75, when Bobby Orr scored 46. But even those glamorous figures would probably have been bigger, if Doug had not suffered a broken jaw in November, missing four games and then playing with his jaw wired for almost a month. He lost nearly 20 pounds, because he was unable to eat solid foods.

He enjoys golf and softball in the off season. Doug suffers from Hyperglycemia, which means he must watch his diet very closely, and this puts a special burden on his wife, Kathy. Doug credits Kathy with keeping him fit by taking the time and patience to make the special dishes he needs.

Doug's dad was a Canadian Air Force officer and thus his family lived in many places while he was growing up, including several years in England. Doug was the last player signed by Tommy Ivan before he moved up to V.P.

Ten minutes into the New Year of 1964, Kenneth William Yaremchuk made his debut as the fifth child born to Olga and John of Edmonton.

Rumors have it that Jack Davison, then chief scout for the Black Hawks was at center ice with pen in hand. Now, 18 years later, Kenny brings a record of 157 points (58-99) to his first Black Hawk training camp.

In his two years in Portland, Yaremchuk had 107 points and 157, so it was no wonder, he was rated among the top eligibles in the 1982 draft. His brother, Gary, was a top pick for Toronto two years ago. Ken had requested that he not be drafted by the same team as Gary because, "it would seem we were competing against each other for a job."

Ken played fullback on the high school football team and was very good, but passed up an opportunity to continue in that sport because hockey was his first love.

Ken was nicknamed "Weasel" in his first year in Portland, because of his quick, sleek moves in the corners. It quickly caught on with the fans.

## UNBALANCED SCHEDULE:

Each of the 21 teams will play an 80-game schedule with those teams in the Smythe, Norris and Adams Divisions having eight games (four home, four away) against each of their Divisional opponents, plus three games against each of the remaining 16 teams in the League. In the case of the three games against the remaining clubs, teams will play two home, one away or vice-versa, alternating the extra home game each year.

The six clubs in the Patrick Division—New Jersey, New York Islanders, New York Rangers, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Washington—will play each other seven times with three games against each of the remaining 15 teams. The home-ice differential will be alternated each season.

## STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS:

At the conclusion of the regular schedule, the top four finishers in each of the Divisions will qualify for the Stanley Cup playoffs.

The opening round features divisional playoffs that will have the first place club oppose the fourth-place team and second versus third in the best-of-five series. The winners of each series will advance to a best-of-seven Divisional Final series with the team gaining higher standing during the regular-season holding home-ice advantage.

The four divisional winners will meet in a best-of-seven Conference Championship. The Smythe Division victor will face the Norris Division champion in the Campbell Conference championship, while the Patrick Division victor will oppose the Adams Division winner for the Prince of Wales Conference title. The Conference winners will meet in a best-of-seven final series for the Stanley Cup.

Home-ice advantage for the semi-final and final rounds will be alternated each season according to Division and Conference. For the 1982-83 season, the Adams and Smythe Division winners will gain home-ice advantage in the Conference Championships, while the champion of the Campbell Conference will hold home-ice advantage in the Stanley Cup Final.
