Coach

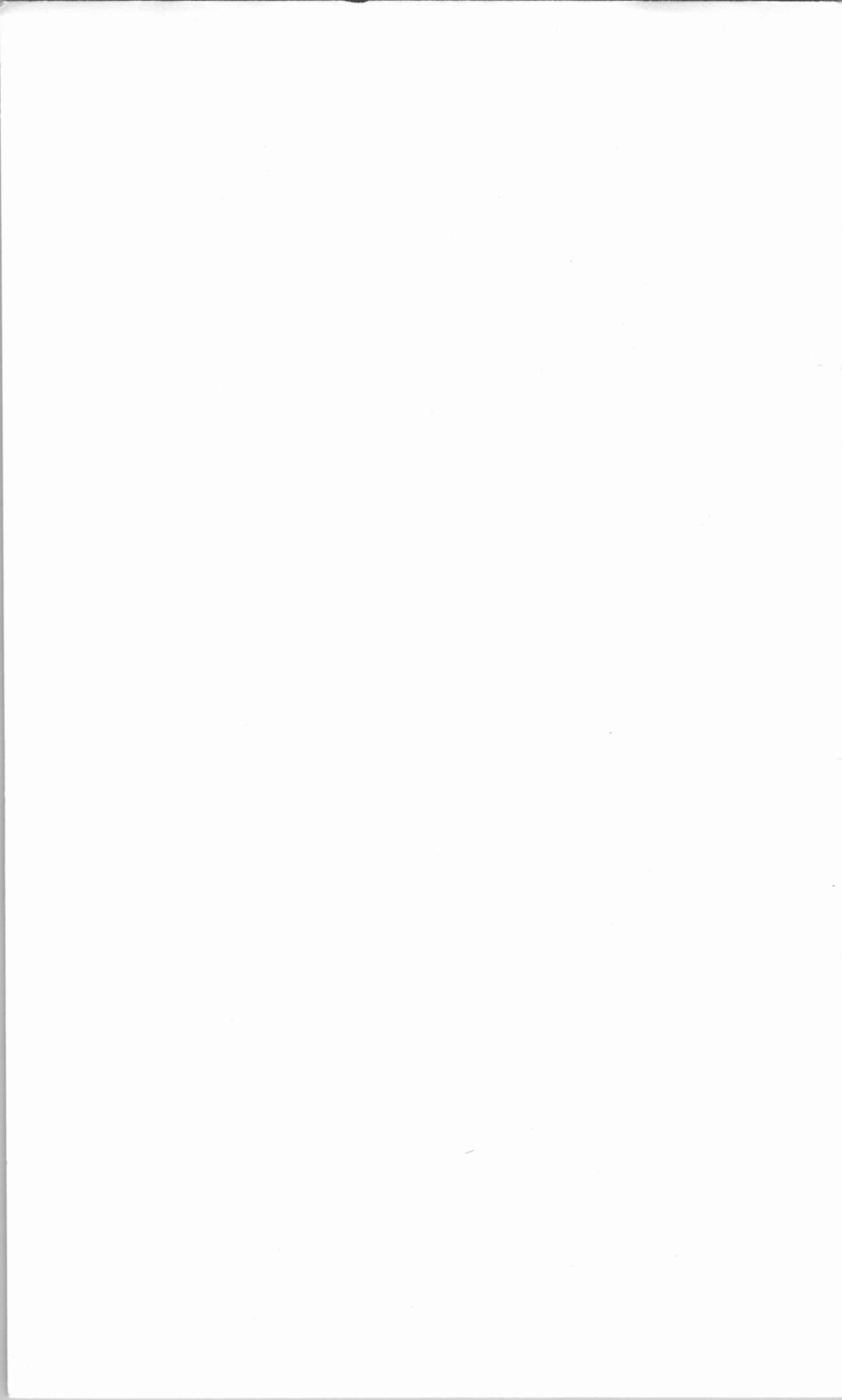

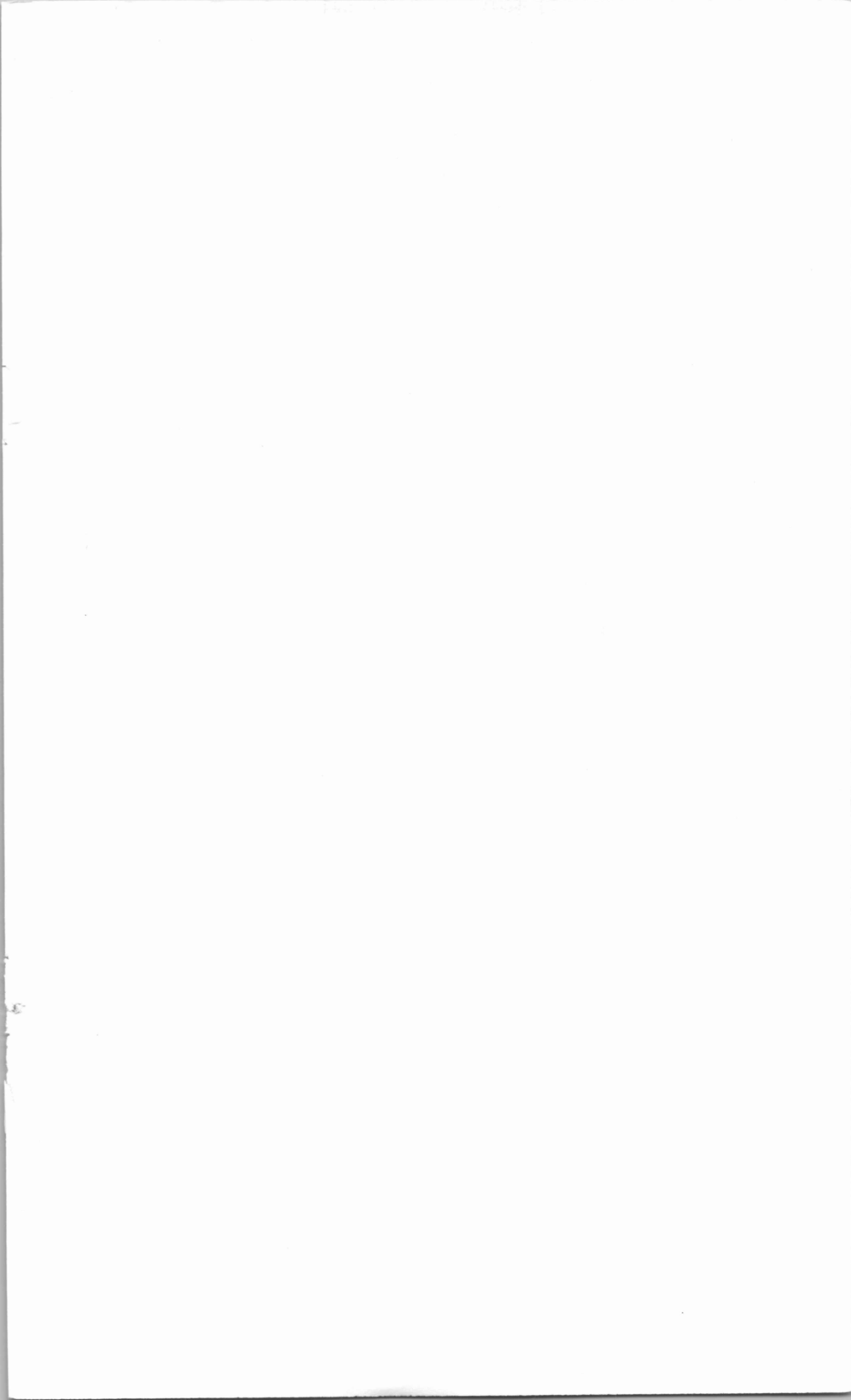
